Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Bacon Enterprises, Inc. and Affiliated Sponsors Profit Sharing Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), which comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of June 30, 2022 (in liquidation) and December 31, 2021 (in liquidation), and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the six-months (in liquidation) and year then ended (in liquidation), and the related notes to the financial statements.

As discussed in Note 5 to the financial statements, the governing body of Bacon Enterprises and Affiliated Sponsors Profit Sharing Plan approved a plan of liquidation on December 1, 2021 and management determined liquidation is imminent. As a result, the Plan has changed its basis of accounting from the going concern basis used in presenting the 2020 financial statements to the liquidation basis used in presenting the 2022 and 2021 financial statements. Our opinion is not modified with respect to that matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 1. Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting:

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the liquidation basis of accounting in accordance with principles generally accepted in the United State of America as of June 30, 2022 and December 31, 2021.

Use of estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of income and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could vary from the estimates that were used.

Valuation of investments:

Quoted market prices are used to value investments.

Securities transactions:

Purchases and sales of securities are reflected on a trade-date basis. Gain or loss on disposition of investments is based on average cost for assets acquired during the year and average current value for assets on hand at the beginning of the year.

Investment income:

Interest income is recorded as earned on an accrual basis. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. Capital gain distributions are included in dividend income. Appreciation (depreciation) in the fair market value of investments includes currently realized gains and losses on the sale of assets as well as unrealized gains and losses resulting from yearly changes in market values of assets held in the portfolio.

Note 2. Plan Description

The following description of the Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General:

Prior to termination, the Plan was a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of the Company who have completed one year of service with 1,000 or more hours and are age twenty-one or older. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). Effective June 30, 2022 the Plan was terminated due to sale of business.

Note 2. Plan Description (Continued)

Participant accounts:

Prior to termination, each participant's account was credited with the participant's contributions and an allocation of (a) the Company's contribution, (b) Plan earnings, and (c) forfeitures of terminated participants' non-vested accounts. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant was entitled was the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting:

Prior to termination, vesting was based on years of continuous service. A participant was 100% vested after five years of credited service.

Payment of benefits:

Prior to termination, upon termination of service, due to retirement, death, or disability, a participant or beneficiary was paid in the form of a lump-sum payment or an annuity over his or her life expectancy and the life expectancy of his or her spouse.

Forfeited accounts:

During the six-months and year ended June 30, 2022 and December 31, 2021, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$0 and \$0, respectively.

Note 3. Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service determined and informed the Company by a letter dated March 31, 2014, that the Plan was qualified, and the Trust established under the Plan is tax-exempt, under the appropriate sections of the Code. The Plan Administrator did not anticipate that changes in the Plan after the date of the amendments covered by the Internal Revenue Service determination letter would affect the qualified and tax-exempt status of the Plan and the Trust.

Note 4. Funding Policy

Prior to termination, contributions were determined annually by the Company's Board of Directors.

The Employer could reimburse the Plan for any administrative expense incurred. Administrative expense reimbursements were not considered as Employer contributions.

Note 5. Plan Termination

On December 1, 2021, the Board of Directors of Bacon Enterprises, Inc. and Affiliated Sponsors, the Plan Sponsor, approved termination of the Plan. Subsequent to December 13, 2021, no contributions were allowed into the Plan. Participant balances were distributed to participant IRA accounts or the participant's current employer's plan. All balances were distributed as of June 30, 2022.

Note 6. Fair Value Measurements

Prior to termination, the Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statement of net assets available for benefits. The methods used to measure fair value may produce an amount that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets, and Level 3 inputs are unobservable and have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 3 inputs were used only when Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at June 30, 2022 and 2021.

Mutual funds were valued at the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year end using market prices on active markets (Level 1).

The methods described above may have produced a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believed its valuation methods were appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could have resulted in a different value measurement at the reporting date.
