(1) Description of plan

The following description of the HCA Mission Health System 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document, copies of which were available from the Plan administrator, for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

(a) General

The Plan was a defined-contribution plan which covered all employees of MH Hospital Manager, LLC (the "Company") and any affiliate or non-affiliate of the Company who entered into a participation agreement with the Company for the purpose of adopting the Plan ("Participating Employer"). The Plan was established on February 1, 2019, and was subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

The Plan was administered by the Company. The Plan's assets were maintained by State Street Bank and Trust Company ("State Street") and records for the Plan were maintained by Transamerica Retirement Solutions, LLC ("Transamerica") as the record-keeper.

Effective June 8, 2022, the Plan Sponsor elected to merge the Plan into the HCA 401(k) Plan (the "HCA Plan"). All investments and notes receivable from participants were transferred from the Plan into the HCA Plan on that date. The net assets were recognized in the participants' accounts of the HCA Plan as previously carried in his or her accounts of the Plan. Effective December 31, 2021, participants in the Plan became eligible to contribute to the HCA Plan and contributions to the Plan were suspended.

(b) Eligibility and Contributions

Employees were eligible for salary deferrals immediately upon employment. Entry into the Plan occurred on the first day of the payroll period coinciding with, or the next period following, the satisfaction of the eligibility requirements. Participants could contribute eligible wages, as defined in the Plan document, to the Plan through a salary deduction arrangement. Contributions were subject to certain Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") limitations. Employees became eligible for the employer match contribution after one year of eligible service as defined by the Plan document. However, employees of Mission Hospital, Inc. and Mission Medical Associates who: (1) were eligible for the Mission Health System Employee Retirement Plan as of December 31, 2013; (2) were employed at Mission Hospital, Inc. or Mission Medical Associates on January 1, 2015; and (3) had not had a termination of employment with a Participating Employer on or after January 1, 2014 were matched according to the following schedule:

<u>Years of Service</u>	<u>Matching Contribution Formula</u>
1 but less than 5	100% of salary deferrals up to 4% of match eligible compensation
5 but less than 10	100% of salary deferrals up to 5% of match eligible compensation

Other employees, including those hired or rehired on or after January 1, 2015 and those employed by a Participating Employer other than Mission Hospital, Inc. or Mission Medical Associates on January 1, 2015, were matched at a rate of 50% of salary deferrals up to 6% of compensation that was contributed by the participant to the Plan, up to a maximum of 3% of match eligible compensation.

Participants were eligible to rollover their account balance from an eligible retirement plan, as defined in the Plan document, to the Plan. Participants in the Mission Health System Employee Retirement Plan ("ERP") were eligible to rollover their account balance to the Plan if all three of the following criteria were met: (1) participant was an active employee of HCA Mission Health as of February 1, 2019; (2) was an active participant in the ERP until January 31, 2019; and (3) had an account balance in the ERP.

(c) Participant accounts

Participants directed the investment of contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Each participant's account was credited with rollovers, their contributions, the Company's contributions, earnings or losses on investments in their account, and was charged with the allocated portion of the administrative expenses and certain transactions fees. Allocations were based on relative participant account balances. The benefit to which a participant was entitled was the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

(d) Vesting provision

Participants were immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary contributions were based on years of continuous service. Participants were fully vested after three years of vested service.

(e) Notes receivable from participants

Participants could borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The maximum term of repayment for loans, other than those utilized to purchase a primary residence, was five years. The maximum term of repayment for a loan utilized to purchase a primary residence was fifteen years. The maximum number of loans outstanding at any given time for a participant was two. The loans were secured by the balance in the participant's account and bore interest at the prime rate plus one percent. Principal and interest were paid ratably through bank drafts or checks directly to State Street. Interest income on notes receivable from participants was recorded on the accrual basis. Accrued interest was \$71,530 as of December 31, 2021.

(f) Payment of benefits

A participant's account was distributed based upon the participant's election under the Plan document upon retirement, death, disability or termination of employment. Retirement was defined under the Plan document as age 65. In-service withdrawals were permitted upon the attainment of age 59½. Hardship distributions were permitted and should be made from the vested portion of a participant's account, as defined in the Plan document.

(g) Forfeited accounts

Forfeitures were created when participants terminated employment prior to becoming fully vested in the Company discretionary matching contribution portion of their accounts. Forfeitures were used first to restore Plan forfeitures to participants' accounts and then to pay administrative expenses. Remaining forfeitures were used to reduce future Company matching contributions. As of June 8, 2022, approximately \$219,000 of forfeited accounts were transferred to the HCA Plan as part of the merger (Note 1a). As of December 31, 2021, forfeited accounts in the Plan totaled approximately \$236,000. Forfeitures of approximately \$141,000 and \$410,000 were used for the period from January 1, 2022 to June 8, 2022 and the year ended December 31, 2021, respectively.

(h) Administrative expenses

Expenses incurred in the administration and operation of the Plan were charged to the Plan and allocated to participants' accounts based on each participant's account balance, unless the employer agreed to pay the fees. Certain transaction fees related to loans were charged directly to the specific participants' account.

(2) Summary of significant accounting policies

(a) Basis of accounting and use of estimates

The Plan's financial statements were prepared on the accrual basis of accounting. The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America required management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

(b) Investment valuation and income recognition

Investments were stated at fair value, except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which was reported at contract value (see Note 5). See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Purchases and sales of securities were recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income was recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends were recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments included the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

(c) Payment of benefits

Benefits were recorded when paid.

(d) Administrative expenses

Administrative expenses were recorded when they were incurred.

(e) Notes receivable from participants

Notes receivable from participants were measured at their unpaid balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent loans were reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

(f) Events occurring after reporting date

The Plan's management has evaluated events and transactions that occurred between June 8, 2022 and January 12, 2023, which is the date that the financial statements were available to be issued, for possible recognition or disclosure in the financial statements.

(3) Certified information

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants reported and disclosed in the accompanying financial statements, including the fair value or contract value of investments and notes receivable from participants as of June 8, 2022 and December 31, 2021, and net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value or contract value of investments, interest and dividends for the period from January 1, 2022 to June 8, 2022 and for the year ended December 31, 2021, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by State Street.

(4) Fair value measurements

The Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820, *Fair Value Measurements*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described below:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 and Level 3 are not applicable to the Plan.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at June 8, 2022 and December 31, 2021.

- (i) *Mutual funds*: Valued at the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year end in an active market.

The method described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan's management believes its valuation method was appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

(5) Investment contract with insurance company

As of December 31, 2021, the Plan maintained an investment contract with Transamerica Life Insurance Company ("TLIC"), the Transamerica Guaranteed Investment Option ("TGIO"). The contract is considered to be fully benefit-responsive. As of December 31, 2021, the contract value of the investment was \$55,937,836. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Interest rates are reset every 6 months. The guaranteed minimum interest rate is 0.0%. The investment contract of \$49,099,849 is included in transfers to the HCA Plan in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period from January 1, 2022 to June 8, 2022.

The terms of the contract required all permitted participant initiated transactions to occur at contract value. The contract was the obligation of the TLIC, and the plan administrator believed the occurrence of an event that limited the ability of the investment to transact at contract value is not probable. The contract allowed participants reasonable access to their assets. There were no valuation reserves recorded to adjust contract amounts.

(6) Exempt party-in-interest transactions

Plan investments were shares of mutual funds, mutual funds and an investment contract, that were issued and/or managed by State Street or Transamerica. The Plan's assets also included notes receivable from participants. Transamerica was paid administrative fees from the Plan. These transactions qualified as exempt party-in-interest transactions.

(7) Income tax status

On June 30, 2020, the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") stated that the pre-approved profit sharing plan adopted by the Plan, as then designed, qualified under Section 401 (a) of the IRC. The Plan has not received a determination letter specific to the Plan itself. The pre-approved plan document was amended since receiving the opinion letter, and the Plan administrator believed that the Plan was designed and was currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or assets) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more-likely-than-not would not have been sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan was subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of June 8, 2022, there were no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or asset or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan was subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdiction.
