Basis for Opinion

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with US GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Notes to Financial Statements

Note 1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the Convention and Cultural Services, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the *Plan document* for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions, which is available from Plan management.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of Convention and Cultural Services, Inc. (the Company) who are age twenty-one or older. Effective July 1, 2014, employees expected to work fewer than 32 hours a week and interns were not eligible to participate in the Plan until 1,000 hours of service have been completed. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Board of Directors is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Trustees determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance and reports to the Plan's Board of Directors.

Termination of the Plan

The Company has the right to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA. On January 21, 2022, the Company elected to terminate the Plan and participants were notified and became 100% vested in benefits earned. Participants were allowed to roll their account balances into the Houston First 457 Plan or take a distribution. The Plan liquidation process was completed on May 31, 2022.

Contributions

As of January 1, 2022, the Plan was frozen to any new participants and contributions to the Plan. During 2021, participants may contribute up to 100 percent of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also designate some of their contributions as after tax contributions to a Roth 401(k) option. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at six percent of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant. The Company contributes 100 percent of the first six percent of eligible compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. Additional profit sharing amounts may be contributed at the option of the Company. For profit sharing contributions, the Company contributes 100 percent of the next three percent of eligible compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. During the period ended May 31, 2022, The Company did not make any profit sharing contributions to the Plan. During the year ended December 31, 2021, the Company made a profit sharing contribution to the Plan of \$425,786. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's contributions and (b) Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Notes to Financial Statements

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100 percent vested after four years of credited service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by Plan management. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Pursuant to the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (the CARES Act) that was signed into law on March 27, 2020, Plan participants could request a delay of note repayments for repayments that occurred between March 27, 2020 and December 31, 2020. The participant's note was re-amortized and included any interest accrued during the period of delay. The ability to request a delay in note repayments under the CARES Act ceased as of December 31, 2020, and payments reestablished as of January 1, 2021.

Payment of Benefits

Upon separation of service due to death, disability, retirement or termination of employment, a participant may elect to receive either a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or a partial distribution rollover.

Pursuant to the CARES Act, participants who were currently receiving required minimum distributions were offered the option to waive their 2020 payment and participants who were due to receive the first required distribution in 2020 had their distribution automatically waived. The ability to request special waivers with respect to required minimum distributions under the CARES Act ceased as of December 31, 2020. In addition, the Plan also permits participants to request up to \$100,000 in coronavirus-related distributions, with repayment terms of up to three years, in accordance with the CARES Act. The ability to request coronavirus-related distributions under the CARES Act ceased as of December 30, 2020.

Forfeited Accounts

At May 31, 2022 and December 31, 2021, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$0 and \$4,217, respectively. These accounts are used to reduce future Company contributions and to pay Plan expenses. During 2022, \$3,288 were reallocated to participant accounts and Plan expenses of \$945 were paid from forfeited non-vested accounts. During 2021, Company contributions were reduced by \$36,000 and Plan expenses of \$14,100 were paid from forfeited non-vested accounts.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan for the period ended May 31, 2022 are prepared using the liquidation basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAP). The financial statements of the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2021 are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with US GAAP.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with US GAAP requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Board of Trustees determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians, and insurance company. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded at the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of May 31, 2022 and December 31, 2021.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) of fair value of investments.

Plan Management's Review of Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through February 24, 2023, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3. Certified Investments

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplementary information, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at May 31, 2022 and December 31, 2021, and net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments, interest and dividends and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the period ended May 31, 2022 and for the year ended December 31, 2021, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Empower Trust Company, LLC (Empower) and Great-West Trust Company, LLC (Great West), the trustees of the Plan.

During 2022 and 2021, the Plan held an interest in the MetLife Stable Value Fund (SVF), a common collective investment trust fund. The SVF invests in a high quality fixed income portfolio combined with investment contracts, commonly referred to as wrap contracts, issued by insurance companies and other financial institutions for a fee. The SVF is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The issuer of the wrap contract guarantees a minimum rate of return and provides full benefit responsiveness, provided that all terms of the wrap contract have been met. The fair value of the SVF equals the total of the fair value of the underlying assets plus the total wrap contract rebid value.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the wrap issuer. However, the Plan's management is not aware of the occurrence or likely occurrence of any such events, which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants. The issuer may terminate a wrap contract for cause at any time.

Note 4. Fair Value Measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

- Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
 - Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
 - Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
 - Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

- Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at May 31, 2022 and December 31, 2021.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Stable value fund: Valued at the NAV of the shares held by the Plan at year end, which is based on the fair value underlying investments using information reported by the investment advisor at year end. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value.

Note 5. Related Party Transactions and Party in Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds and a stable value fund provided through Empower and Great-West. Empower is the trustee and record keeper and Great-West is the trustee for the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party in interest transactions. All investment fund earnings or losses posted to each Plan participant's account are net of investment management fees charged by each investment fund under the Plan.

Note 6. Tax Status

Effective September 6, 2016, the Plan adopted a non-standardized prototype defined contribution profit sharing plan with Internal Revenue Code Section 401(k) Cash or Deferred Arrangement (CODA) which received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated June 30, 2020. The Plan has been amended since the date of the last amendment covered by the above mentioned determination letter. However, Plan management believes that the plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code.

US GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 7. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Market risks include global events, which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that some changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
