INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Plan Administrator and Participants of

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of Don Martin Trucking 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1—DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Don Martin Trucking 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General – The Plan was established by DTA, LP (the “Company”) on January 1, 1999, to encourage and assist employees in adopting a regular savings program to provide for their retirement. The Plan is a participant-directed defined contribution profit sharing plan for eligible non-union employees of the Company.

The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Merger - On April 29, 2022, the Board of Directors of McClymonds Supply & Transit Company, Inc., a controlling party of DTA, LP, approved the merger of this Plan into the McClymonds Supply & Transit Company, Inc (“Savings Plan”), effective June 6, 2022. As a result, all assets were transferred from the Plan into the Savings Plan as of June 6, 2022.

Eligibility – Eligible individuals who are 18 years of age or older and have completed six months of service are eligible to participate commencing on the first day of the Plan quarter coinciding with or next following the date the requirements are met.

Contributions – Participants may elect to contribute up to 100% of his or her eligible compensation, subject to IRS dollar limitations. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Contributions are subject to certain limitations as defined in the Plan agreement and as limited by statute.

The Plan provides for a discretionary employer matching contribution, which was equal to 100% of the first 4% of each participant's elective deferral in 2021. In addition, the Company may make discretionary profit-sharing contributions to the Plan. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Participant Accounts – Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions and allocations of the Company’s contributions and Plan earnings (losses) and charged with an allocation of any administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Vesting – Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions and actual earnings thereon. Participants became vested in the Company’s discretionary contributions in accordance with the following vesting schedule:

Participants attaining the age of 65 while employed by the Company and those who have died or become disabled before termination of employment are 100% vested.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of his or her vested account balance. Such loans are made, and repayment terms are established, in accordance with regulatory provisions. Terms range from one to five years, or longer if the proceeds are used for the purchase of a primary residence. Each note is secured by the balance in the participant's account and bears interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined quarterly by the Plan administrator. Outstanding notes receivable have been transferred to the Savings Plan as of June 6, 2022.

Payment of Benefits – Participants are eligible to receive distributions upon retirement, disability, or termination of employment with the Company. Distributions can also be approved for immediate financial hardships. Payment is in the form of a lump-sum payout of the participant's vested account balance or via installments.

Forfeited Accounts – Forfeitures of employer contributions may be used to pay administrative costs of the Plan or employer contributions thereto, and any remaining amounts may be allocated to participants in proportion to their compensation for the period. Forfeitures available for use by the Plan were \$0 and \$79,250 as of June 6, 2022 and December 31, 2021, respectively. During the period ended June 6, 2022, \$62,548 of forfeitures were used to reduce the Company's contributions. Remaining forfeitures of \$25,813 were transferred to the Savings Plan as of June 6, 2022.

Plan Expenses and Costs – Certain administrative expenses are paid for by the Company, while others are paid for by the Plan. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements.

NOTE 2—SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The Plan's financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments held by the Plan are stated at fair value. All Plan assets were transferred to the Savings Plan before close of business on June 6, 2022.

Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (an exit price). See Note 4 for further discussion and disclosures related to fair value measurements.

Net appreciation or depreciation in fair value of investments includes realized gains and losses on investments sold during the period as well as the current period change in unrealized appreciation and depreciation of investments held at the end of the period.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest is recorded as earned.

All investments are considered to be participant-directed.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Income Taxes

The underlying non-standardized prototype profit sharing plan with CODA has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated August 1, 2015, stating that the form of the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC), and therefore, the related trust is tax-exempt. In accordance with IRS Procedure 2011-49, the Plan sponsor has determined that it is eligible to and has chosen to rely on the current IRS prototype plan opinion letter. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

The Plan is a qualified plan as described in Section 401(a) of the IRC and is therefore exempt from federal and state income taxes. Income generated by activities that would be considered unrelated to the Plan's purpose would be subject to tax which, if incurred, would be recognized as a current expense. No such tax has been recognized for the period ended June 6, 2022.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that, as of June 6, 2022, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements.

The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2019.

NOTE 3—INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY THE TRUSTEE (UNAUDITED)

The June 6, 2022, and December 31, 2021, Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits, the investment activities included on the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for the period ended June 6, 2022, and the accompanying notes to the financial statements were prepared in part or entirely from information certified by the Trustee in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974. The information certified includes total investments of \$0 and \$2,281,000 at June 6, 2022, and December 31, 2021, respectively, and related losses of \$304,612 for the period ended June 6, 2022.

NOTE 4—FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (UNAUDITED)

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

- Level 2* Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
- Quoted Prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
 - Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
 - Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
 - Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

- Level 3* Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at June 6, 2022 and December 31, 2021.

Mutual Funds: Shares of registered investment companies (mutual funds) are reported at fair value based on the quoted market price of the fund which represents the net asset value of the investments held by the fund at period-end. The mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. The funds must publish their daily net asset value and transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the plan are considered to be actively traded.

Collective Trust Funds: The MetLife Stable Value Fund is valued at the net asset value (NAV) of units of the collective trust as determined by the issuer. The fund invests primarily in the MetLife Group Annuity Contract 25053, which consists of separately managed investment portfolios directed by Reliance Trust Company. This fund is a bank collective trust fund for which Reliance Trust Company serves as the trustee and investment manager. The net asset value is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported net asset value. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the collective trust, the issuer reserves the right to require 30 days notification in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner. There are no participant redemption restrictions on these investments; the redemption period notice is only applicable to the Plan. The collective trust's primary investment objectives are to seek the preservation of principal and to provide interest income reasonably obtained under prevailing market conditions and rates, consistent with seeking to maintain required liquidity. There are no unfunded commitments, and the redemption frequency is daily.

The Clearbridge Large Cap Growth Fund is designed to seek long-term capital growth. It is valued in the same fashion as the mutual funds described above.

The Blackrock Equity Index Fund is designed to achieve investment results that are similar to the price and yield performance, before fees and expenses, of the S&P 500 Index. The Fund is invested solely in the BlackRock Equity Index Fund managed by BlackRock Institutional Trust Company, N.A. It is valued at the net asset value (NAV) of units of the collective trust as determined by the issuer. The net asset value is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value.

The BlackRock Mid Cap Equity Index Fund is designed to achieve investment results that are similar to the price and yield performance, before fees and expenses, of the S&P Midcap 400 Index. The Fund is invested solely in the BlackRock Mid Cap Equity Index Fund managed by BlackRock Institutional Trust Company, N.A. It is valued at the net asset value (NAV) of units of the collective trust as determined by the issuer. The net asset value is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value.

The BlackRock MSCI ACWI ex-U.S. Index Fund is designed to achieve investment results that correspond generally to the price and yield performance, before fees and expenses, of the MSCI ACWI ex-U.S. Net Dividend Return Index. The Fund is invested solely in the BlackRock MSCI ACWI ex-U.S. Index Fund managed by BlackRock Institutional Trust Company, N.A. It is valued at the net asset value (NAV) of units of the collective trust as determined by the issuer. The net asset value is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value.

The BlackRock Russell 2000 Index Fund is designed to achieve investment results that are similar to the price and yield performance, before fees and expenses, of the Russell 2000 Index. The Fund is invested solely in the BlackRock Russell 2000 Index Fund managed by BlackRock Institutional Trust Company, N.A. It is valued at the net asset value (NAV) of units of the collective trust as determined by the issuer. The net asset value is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value.

The BlackRock U.S. Debt Index Fund is designed to achieve investment results that are similar to the price and yield performance, before fees and expenses, of the Bloomberg Barclays Capital U.S. Aggregate Bond Index. The Fund is invested solely in the BlackRock U.S. Debt Index Fund managed by BlackRock Institutional Trust Company, N.A. It is valued at the net asset value (NAV) of units of the collective trust as determined by the issuer. The net asset value is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value.

The PGIM Total Return Bond Fund is designed to outperform the Bloomberg Barclays U.S. Aggregate Bond Index. Units of each fee class of each Fund are valued each day on which the New York Stock Exchange ("NYSE") is open for trading in accordance with the valuation procedures established by the Trustee. The net asset value (NAV) per unit is calculated as of the close of trading on the NYSE. The NAV per unit is computed by dividing the total fair value of the assets of each Fund, less its liabilities, by the total number of units outstanding at the time of such computation. Investment income earned is reinvested in each Fund and included in the determination of unit values.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 5—AMENDMENT AND TERMINATION

It is the intention of the Company to continue the Plan indefinitely and to make contributions as herein provided. The Company reserves the right, in its sole discretion by written action by the Plan sponsor, to amend the plan, terminate the plan, or to reduce or cease contributions at any time. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Plan, no action to amend or terminate the Plan may have the effect of decreasing, denying or otherwise adversely affecting any benefit to a participant that is a “protected benefit” within the meaning of Code Section 411(d)(6) and the Treasury Regulations thereunder. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in amounts attributed to the Company’s contributions.

The Plan was last amended effective January 1, 2022.

See Note 1 regarding the merger of the Plan into another Plan.

NOTE 6—RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities that are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants’ account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 7—RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Parties-in-interest are defined under DOL Regulations as any fiduciary of the Plan, any party rendering service to the Plan, the Company, and certain others.

Notes receivable from Plan participants qualify as party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from the prohibited transactions rules.

The Company’s employees perform certain administrative functions on behalf of the Plan for which no fees are charged. Certain Plan investments are in the custody of Charles Schwab Trust Bank, the trustee of the Plan.

During the period ended June 6, 2022, administrative fees of \$7,749 were paid by the Plan to the trustee, which qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Plan sponsor also pays certain fees and expenses of the Plan.

These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

NOTE 8—SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Management has evaluated subsequent events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure in the financial statements as of the date of the independent auditor’s report, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued. There were no subsequent events requiring adjustments to the financial statements or disclosures, as stated herein.
