Notes to Financial Statements

1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the Brookhaven Memorial Hospital Medical Center DBA Long Island Community Hospital Retirement Income Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a noncontributory defined benefit pension plan covering substantially all full-time employees of the Brookhaven Memorial Hospital Medical Center DBA Long Island Community Hospital (the Hospital, Plan sponsor) who have attained the age of 21 and have one year of continuous service and/or whose collective-bargaining agreement expressly provides for participation in the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Effective December 31, 2002, the Plan was frozen as to future benefit accruals for existing participants. The Plan was frozen to new participants after that date. On March 4, 2021, the Board of Directors of the Hospital approved a resolution approving a termination of the Plan. A group annuity contract of \$11,469,895 was purchased from CUNA Mutual Retirement Solutions June 22, 2022 to satisfy future benefit payments for the participants. On August 17, 2022, CUNA prepared a revised valuation of the group annuity contracts and determined an excess of \$1,288,791 was to be refunded to the Plan. As of September 30, 2022, all assets of the plan have been liquidated and distributions of benefits were made to all eligible participants in accordance with ERISA and all other applicable legal regulations. The remaining \$1,189,252 of excess contribution was returned back to the Plan Sponsor.

Unless otherwise indicated, the below represent the provisions of the Plan prior to the effective date of the Plan termination.

Funding Policy

In accordance with the Plan, there is no provision for employee contributions to this Plan. The Hospital makes periodic contributions to the Plan based on actuarial estimates. There were \$0 and \$5,600,000 in contributions to the Plan in the three months ended September 30, 2022 and the year ended June 30, 2022, respectively. As of September 30, 2022 the Plan has been fully liquidated and all contributions necessary to satisfy all vested accrued benefit liabilities have been made.

Vesting

Participants became fully vested after three years of service.

Payment of Benefits

Participants are entitled to annual pension benefits beginning at normal retirement date (age 65). A participant who has completed five years of service and has attained the age of 55 is eligible for early retirement and will receive his or her accrued normal retirement benefits on his or her normal retirement date or an adjusted benefit if the participant elects to receive it earlier.

If employment is terminated after completing three or more years of service, an employee's accrued benefit will be 100% vested and, upon attainment of age 65, benefit payments will commence. An

employee, however, may elect to receive adjusted retirement benefits commencing on or after age 55. Effective July 1, 1993, the Plan amended its benefits formula. Prior to July 1, 1993, each participant was eligible to receive a lifetime monthly benefit equal to 1.25% of the participant's final average monthly salary multiplied by the participant's years of credited service, limited to 25 years.

Effective July 1, 1993, the Plan was amended to adopt a "Cash Balance" benefit formula. The following is a brief description of the benefit formula as outlined in the Plan amendment:

The actuarial equivalent lump-sum value of each participant's accrued benefit as of July 1, 1993 was set forth in a cash balance account to be maintained for each participant. Each new participant after June 30, 1993 would have an initial cash balance account of \$0.

For any Plan year beginning after June 30, 1993 through December 31, 2002, in which a participant had at least 1,000 hours of service, an amount equal to a specified percentage of the participant's compensation for the Plan year would be added to the participant's cash balance account at the end of the Plan year. The percentage was based on the participant's age as of the first day of the Plan year, as set forth below:

Beginning after June 30, 1993, an amount equal to the earnings rate multiplied by the participant's cash balance account on the first day of the Plan year is added to the participant's cash balance account at the end of the Plan year. The earnings rate is the published rate for the most recent auction of one-year United States Treasury Bills as of the first day of the Plan year, plus two percentage points. Effective March 1, 2010, the Plan was amended, whereby the earnings rate is the published rate for the most recent auction of one-year United States Treasury Bills as of the first day of the Plan year, plus one percentage point.

Upon an employee's retirement, the accumulated cash balance account will be converted into a monthly annuity using the actuarial basis for interest and mortality set forth in the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Section 417(e) as in effect for the applicable Plan year. For some employees, the monthly annuity, derived based on the employee's cash balance account, will be compared to a grandfathered monthly benefit based on the prior-benefit formula.

The Plan was subsequently amended, whereby a grandfather benefit was adopted to the new "Cash Balance" benefit formula retroactive to July 1, 1993. A participant who by December 31, 1993 was at least age 50 and had at least five years of service would receive a retirement benefit equal to the greater of the participant's benefit calculated prior to the June 30, 1993 amendment or the "Cash Balance" benefit. In determining the value of each benefit for this purpose, each benefit will be stated as a single life annuity with the "Cash Balance" benefit being converted to this annuity

form. The Plan was amended to reduce the compensation level used in calculating retirement benefits to \$160,000 (indexed), in accordance with federal legislation.

The standard form of benefit payment is the actuarially equivalent “50% Joint and Survivor Annuity” for married employees and the “Life Annuity” for unmarried employees. Other optional forms of payment include the “100% Joint and Survivor Annuity,” the “75% Joint and Survivor Annuity,” the “Ten-Year Certain and Guaranteed Payment” and the “Lump-Sum Payment.”

The Plan was amended, effective July 1, 1998, to increase the contribution rates by 0.5% and to permit nonmarried participants to elect a beneficiary.

As of June 30, 2022, five missing participants were identified by the Plan Sponsor and submitted to the PBGC as part of the PBGC Missing Participant’s Program.

Deferred Retirement Benefit

A participant may continue employment beyond the normal retirement date and commence receiving normal retirement benefits at a later date.

Death Benefits

Upon the death of a participant prior to his or her actual retirement date and after completion of three years of service, a monthly benefit will be payable to the spouse or non-spouse beneficiary. This benefit is equal to 50% of the accumulated account balance converted to an annuity, but no less than the benefit accrued through June 30, 1993, reduced to reflect the amount that would have been payable had the participant retired on the date of death with the “50% Joint and Survivor Annuity” option in effect. Payments will commence on the first day of the month following the death of the participant, but not earlier than the participant’s early retirement date.

Management of the Funds

The Plan has contracted with Prudential Bank and Trust, FSB, to act as the Plan’s trustee and custodian, and Prudential Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (collectively, Prudential) for the three months ended September 30, 2022 and for the year ended June 30, 2022. Prudential Bank and Trust, FSB holds the assets of the Plan under the trust agreement and a group annuity contract issued and certified by Prudential Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (PRIAC). Prudential Bank and Trust, FSB is an indirect wholly owned subsidiary of Prudential Financial, Inc. and PRIAC is a subsidiary of The Prudential Insurance Company of America (PICA). The investment manager invests cash received and interest and dividend income. Distributions to participants are made from the short-term separate account under the group annuity contract. The actuarial present value of accumulated Plan benefits as of June 30, 2022 was determined by an independent actuary from PRIAC.

Administrative Expenses

Certain costs of administering the Plan are paid by the Plan. The Hospital provides certain accounting and administrative services without charge to the Plan.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

As a result of the Plan's termination (see Note 1), and in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP), the Plan's financial statements have been prepared on the liquidation basis of accounting for the three months ended September 30, 2022 and for the year ended June 30, 2022.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

U.S. GAAP establishes a hierarchy for inputs used in measuring fair value that maximizes the use of observable inputs and minimizes the use of unobservable inputs by requiring that inputs that are most observable be used when available. The input hierarchy is broken down into three levels based on the degree to which the exit price (the amount that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an ordinary transaction between market participants at the measurement date) is independently observable or determinable, as follows:

Level 1 -Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 -Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets.
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability.
- Inputs that are derived principally from, or corroborated by, observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 -Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes

therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

3. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options in any combination of funds offered by the Plan. These funds are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits. For the general accounts with insurance companies, the Plan is subject to the risk that the insurance companies may be unable to meet their respective obligations in the future. As of June 30, 2022, one investment comprised 100% of total assets. The remaining plan assets were distributed and the Plan was fully liquidated as of September 30, 2022.

Plan contributions are made, and the actuarial present value of accumulated Plan benefits are reported based on certain assumptions pertaining to interest rates, inflation rates, and employee demographics, all of which are subject to change. Due to uncertainties inherent in the estimations and assumptions process, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in these estimates and assumptions in the near-term would be material to the financial statements.

4. Fair Value Measurements

The Plan's assets and liabilities recorded at fair value have been categorized based upon a fair value hierarchy, in accordance with U.S. GAAP. See Note 2 for a discussion of the Plan's policies regarding this hierarchy.

A description of the valuation techniques applied to the Plan's major categories of assets measured at fair value is as follows:

Pooled Separate Accounts - The value of pooled separate accounts is measured by the accumulation unit value, which is based on the value of the underlying investment funds and the methods described in the group annuity contract. Accumulation units are valued on a daily basis. There are no unfunded commitments and the pooled separate accounts may be redeemed on a daily basis.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

There were no investments held by the Plan as of September 30, 2022 as all assets have been liquidated as part of the plan termination. The following table set forth by level, within the fair value hierarchy, the Plan's investments measured at fair value on a recurring basis, at June 30, 2022.

There were no transfers between Level 1, Level 2, and Level 3 investments during the three months ended September 30, 2022 and the year ended June 30, 2022. The Plan had no financial assets that were measured at fair value on a non-recurring basis during the three months ended September 30, 2022 and the year ended June 30, 2022.

5. Actuarial Present Value of Accumulated Plan Benefits

Accumulated Plan benefits are those future periodic payments, including lump-sum distributions, that are attributable under the Plan's provisions to the service employees have rendered, until the Plan was frozen on December 31, 2002. Accumulated Plan benefits include benefits expected to be paid to (a) retired or terminated employees or their beneficiaries, (b) beneficiaries of employees who have died, and (c) present employees or their beneficiaries. All benefits under the Plan are valued using the projected unit credit actuarial cost method.

As of June 30, 2022, final calculations were made related to the plan termination and the remaining obligation to be paid out was \$22,078,261, of this amount \$11,469,895 was used to purchase an annuity contract to be used to satisfy future participant benefit payments. As of June 30, 2022, there was no remaining benefit obligation.

Due to the termination of the Plan which culminated in the payment of all benefits during 2022 to participants including the purchase of a group annuity contract to cover any remaining obligation of the Plan, the Plan's accumulated benefits were measured on a liquidation basis. The actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits as of September 30, 2022 and June 30, 2022 is \$0.

6. Information Certified by Prudential

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Prudential Bank and Trust, FSB, and Prudential Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company, qualified institutions, have certified

At the request of the Plan administrator, the Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified investment information, except for comparing such certified investment information to the related investment information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

7. Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed the Plan, by a determination letter dated June 10, 2022, that the termination of the Plan does not adversely affect its qualification for federal tax purposes. The plan administrator believes the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code, and therefore, believes that the Plan, as amended, is qualified and tax-exempt. The Plan has been amended and reflects an expected June 30, 2022 plan termination date.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by a taxing authority. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions. In February 13, 2023, the PBGC selected the June 30, 2021 financial statement of the Plan for an audit.

8. Party-in-Interest Transactions

Plan investments are managed by Prudential and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The fair value of investments managed by the trustee was \$0 and \$165,599 at September 30, 2022 and June 30, 2022, respectively.

9. Plan Termination

As discussed above, the Plan sponsor approved a resolution to terminate the Plan. The net assets of the Plan will be allocated, as prescribed by ERISA and its related regulations, generally to provide the following benefits in the order indicated:

- (a) Annuity benefits that former employees or their beneficiaries have been receiving for at least three years, or that employees eligible to retire for that three-year period would have been receiving if they had retired with benefits in the normal form of annuity under the Plan. The priority amount is limited to the lowest benefit that was payable (or would have been payable) during those three years. The amount is further limited to the lowest benefit that would be payable under Plan provisions in effect at any time during the five years preceding Plan termination.
- (b) Other vested benefits insured by the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation (PBGC) (a U.S. government agency) up to the applicable limitations.
- (c) All other vested benefits not insured by the PBGC.
- (d) All nonvested benefits.
- (e) An amount necessary to provide all other accrued benefits under the Plan.
- (f) Any balance remaining in the Plan, after all the preceding allocations have been made and after provision has been made for any other fixed and contingent obligations existing hereunder as a result of a difference between actual and assumed actuarial experience, may be returned in cash to the Hospital.

Certain benefits under the Plan are insured by the PBGC if the Plan terminates. Generally, the PBGC guarantees most vested normal age retirement benefits, early retirement benefits, and certain disability and survivor's pensions. However, the PBGC does not guarantee all types of benefits under the Plan, and the amount of benefit protection is subject to certain limitations. Vested benefits under the Plan are guaranteed at the level in effect on the date of the Plan's termination.

Whether all participants receive their benefits should the Plan terminate at some future time will depend on the sufficiency, at that time, of the Plan's net assets to provide for accumulated benefit obligations and may also depend on the financial condition of the Hospital and the level of benefits guaranteed by the PBGC. As of September 30, 2022, all assets of the plan have been liquidated and distributions of benefits were made to all eligible participants in accordance with ERISA and all other applicable legal regulations.

10. Subsequent Events

For the purpose of determining the effects of subsequent events on these financial statements, management has evaluated events through April 17, 2023, the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued, and there were no subsequent events requiring adjustments to the financial statements or disclosures as stated herein except for the following:
