Independent Auditors' Report

To the Trustees and Participants of
Springfield Electric Supply Company
Defined Benefit Plan

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Springfield Electric Supply Company Defined Benefit Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets in liquidation available for benefits as of July 18, 2022 and December 31, 2021, and the related statements of changes in net assets in liquidation available for benefits for the period January 1, 2022 to July 18, 2022 and the year ended December 31, 2021, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of and for the period ended July 18, 2022 and as of and for the year ended December 31, 2021, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note D to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Emphasis of Matter - Terminating Plan and Liquidation Basis of Accounting

As further discussed in Note H to the financial statements, the Board of Directors of Springfield Electric Supply Company, the Plan's sponsor, voted on June 18, 2021 to terminate the plan and management determined liquidation was imminent. As a result, the Springfield Electric Supply Company Defined Benefit Plan changed its basis of accounting to the liquidation basis of accounting used in presenting the 2022 and 2021 financial statements. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if, there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matters - Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental Schedule of Reportable Transactions for the period ended July 18, 2022 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from, and relates directly to, the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

NOTE A | DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following brief description of Springfield Electric Supply Company Defined Benefit Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for more complete information. Information about the Plan agreement, the vesting and benefit provisions, and the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation (PBGC) benefit guarantee is contained in the Summary Plan Description. Copies of the Summary Plan Description and any amendments thereto are available upon request from Springfield Electric Supply Company (the Company).

1. General

The Plan is a non-contributory defined benefit pension plan covering substantially all employees of the Company with one or more years of service and age 21 or over prior to January 1, 2007. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) and is administered by an Administrative Committee consisting of persons appointed by the Board of Directors of the Company. Charles Schwab Bank, as custodian for the Plan, accumulates and invests contributions as directed by the Administrative Committee.

The Plan was frozen as of January 1, 2007. No participants will accrue credited service for any service on or after that date, nor will any compensation earned after such date be used. Participants will continue to accrue vesting service; however, no new participants will be added to the Plan as of January 1, 2007.

On June 18, 2021, the Board of Directors of the Plan approved and adopted an amendment for the termination of the Plan effective August 31, 2021. Plan participants were notified June 24, 2021 of intent to terminate as of August 31, 2021. IRS approval of plan termination was received in November 2021. Effective July 18, 2022, the Plan distributed the remaining assets and the Plan has been deemed terminated.

2. Contributions

Contributions to the Plan are made by the Company based on funding requirements determined annually by actuarial studies and include an amount necessary to amortize the unfunded actuarial liability. The Company contributed \$ 1,035,000 for the period ended July 18, 2022, and \$ 4,000,000 for the year ended December 31, 2021. The contributions made for the year ended December 31, 2021, were the amounts necessary to meet or exceed the minimum funding requirements required by ERISA. The contributions made for the period ended July 18, 2022, were made due to shortfall from plan sponsor escrow accounts from plan termination.

3. Pension Benefits

Prior to Plan termination, Plan participants were entitled to receive benefit payments upon normal retirement at age 65 or at age 55, if the participant had, at a minimum, 10 years of credited service. Plan participants were also entitled to elect a lump-sum benefit payment at the age of 62. The pension benefit was equal to 0.5% of that part of the participant's average annual compensation in excess of a specified social security base in effect for the calendar year in which the participant's normal retirement date occurred, plus 1% of the participant's average annual compensation, the sum of which shall be multiplied by the years of credited service. Average annual compensation was based on the five consecutive highest paid Plan years for which the employee was an active participant in the Plan. Average annual compensation was frozen as of January 1, 2007. The maximum number of years of service which may be counted is 35 years. Participants may have also elected optional modes of payment (which allow for continuing income to a spouse or other beneficiary) or lump-sum payments. Subsequent to Plan termination, participants who had an accrued benefit on the plan termination date immediately became 100% vested. All participants had an immediate benefit payment option as of the Plan termination distribution date subject to the mandatory payment of the participant's benefit in the form of a lump sum benefit. Any participant currently receiving benefits had an annuity contract purchased on their behalf.

4. Disability Benefits

Prior to Plan termination, Plan participants who became totally disabled had, as a disability retirement benefit, a fully vested interest in their accrued benefit from all of their credited years of service at the time of total disability.

5. Vesting

Prior to the termination of the Plan, participants' benefits became fully vested upon five years of credited service.

NOTE B | SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. Basis of Accounting

As a result of the termination of the Plan, effective August 31, 2021, the Plan adopted the liquidation basis of accounting in presenting the financial statements. The adoption of the liquidation basis of accounting did not have an impact on the Plan's financial statements. Investments are stated at fair value with all other additions and related assets recognized when collected rather than when earned, and deductions recognized when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred. Accordingly, the financial statements are not intended to present net assets available for benefits and changes in net assets available for benefits in accordance with accounting standards generally accepted in the United States of America.

2. Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the liquidation basis requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities and the actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

3. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents are stated at cost, which approximates fair value. Cash equivalents consist of highly-liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

4. Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note E for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

NOTE B | SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

5. Accumulated Plan Benefits

Accumulated plan benefits are those future periodic payments, including lump-sum distributions that are attributable under the Plan's provision for services rendered by the employees to the valuation date. Accumulated plan benefits include benefits expected to be paid to (a) retired or terminated employees or their beneficiaries, (b) beneficiaries of employees who have died, and (c) present employees or their beneficiaries upon retirement or termination.

Actuaries determine the actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits, which is the amount that results from applying actuarial assumptions to adjust the accumulated plan benefits for the time value of money (through discounts for interest) and the probability of payments (by means of decrements such as death, disability, withdrawal or retirement) between the valuation date and the expected date of payment.

6. Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

7. Administrative Expenses

Prior to Plan termination, the Plan's expenses were paid either by the Plan or the Company, as provided by the Plan document. Subsequent to Plan termination, the Plan's expenses are paid either by the Plan or out of a sales transaction escrow account. Expenses paid directly by the Company or from the sales transaction escrow account are excluded from these financial statements. Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan that are paid by the Plan are recorded as deductions in the accompanying statements of net assets in liquidation available for benefits. In addition, certain investment expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) of fair value of investments presented in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets in liquidation available for benefits.

8. Subsequent Events

Management has evaluated subsequent events for recognition and disclosure in the financial statements through May 11, 2023, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Through May 11, 2023, no subsequent events required recognition or disclosure in the financial statements.

NOTE C | TAX STATUS OF THE PLAN

The Plan is intended to be qualified under Section 401(a) and tax exempt under Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan obtained its latest determination letter on November 13, 2015, in which the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan received a favorable determination letter on the termination of the Plan dated November 19, 2021.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE D | SUMMARY FINANCIAL INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE CUSTODIAN

The following is a summary of the unaudited information regarding the Plan for the period ended July 18, 2022 and the year ended December 31, 2021, included in the Plan's financial statements and supplementary information that was prepared by Charles Schwab Bank, custodian under the Plan, and furnished to the Company. NOTE E | INVESTMENTS AND FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Fair value is defined to be the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. A three-level hierarchy has been established for fair value measurements based upon the inputs to the valuation of an asset or liability as follows:

Level 1 – Valuation is based on quoted prices for identical assets and liabilities in active markets.

Level 2 – Valuation is derived from inputs, other than quoted prices included in Level 1, which are observable for the asset or liability either directly or indirectly. Investments classified as Level 2 are generally valued by benchmarking model-derived prices to quoted market prices and trade data for identical or comparable securities. The significant inputs used in this approach include interest rates, prepayment timing, yield spreads, maturities, credit losses and credit ratings of the securities.

Level 3 – Valuation is derived from unobservable inputs that are not corroborated by market data.

The fair value of U.S. Government and agency obligations, municipal obligations and certificates of deposit are valued using pricing models maximizing the use of observable inputs for similar securities. This includes basing value on yields currently available on comparable securities of issuers with similar credit ratings.

Money market funds are valued at cost which approximates fair value.

NOTE F | ACCUMULATED PLAN BENEFITS

The Plan did not obtain a calculation of accumulated plan benefits for the period ended July 18, 2022 as the Plan had been terminated and assets of the Plan were being distributed to participants.

NOTE G | RELATED-PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by Charles Schwab Bank. Charles Schwab Bank is the custodian of the Plan’s assets and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Additionally, as described in Note B, the Plan paid certain expenses related to Plan operations and investment activity to various service providers. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

NOTE H | PLAN TERMINATION

The Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA. On April 6, 2021, the Company received a Letter of Intent for the purchase of the Company’s stock. As a result, management determined that liquidation of the Plan was imminent at that time in accordance with ASC 205, Presentation of Financial Statements – Liquidation Basis of Accounting, and changed its basis of accounting to the liquidation basis for the year ended December 31, 2021. Plan participants were notified June 24, 2021 of intent to terminate as of August 31, 2021. The Plan received a favorable determination letter for termination from the IRS on November 19, 2021.

NOTE H | PLAN TERMINATION

The benefits of all affected participants became fully vested and nonforfeitable upon plan termination. Such assets were distributed in accordance with the applicable provisions of the Plan. Individuals already receiving monthly benefit payments had an annuity contract purchased from United of Omaha Life Insurance Company. Individuals not already receiving monthly benefit payments were given an opportunity to elect a lump sum distribution (payable in cash or as a rollover). As of July 18, 2022 all assets of the Plan have been distributed.
