Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

- the information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Emphasis of Matter

As described in Note 1 to the financial statements, the plan sponsor elected to merge the Plan with the Lab Logistics, LLC 401(k) Retirement Plan. The transfer of the Plan's assets occurred on August 31, 2022.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not

detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
AUGUST 31, 2022 AND DECEMBER 31, 2021

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of The Allied Group 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was a defined contribution plan sponsored by Allied Group, LLC (the Company). The Plan covered all full-time employees of the Company, who had completed one year of service and 1,000 hours. Eligible employees were eligible to enter the Plan on the first day of each quarter. The Plan was qualified under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and was subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Plan Merger

In May 2022, Lab Logistics, LLC (Lab Logistics) acquired the Company. On May 31, 2022, the Plan was frozen which prevented any additional participants from entering the Plan as well as the accrual of any employer contributions after such date. On August 31, 2022, the Company merged the assets of the Plan into the assets of Lab Logistics, LLC 401(k) Retirement Plan (Lab Logistics 401(k)).

Contributions

Prior to the Plan being frozen, Participants had the option to contribute to the Plan through voluntary payroll deductions. Participants could have elected to defer up to 50% of their eligible compensation, as defined in the plan agreement, not to exceed the dollar limitations as defined by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). Participants who had attained age 50 before the end of the plan year were eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants could have also contributed amounts representing rollover contributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans prior to becoming a participant in the Plan.

Participants who were employed on the last day of the Plan year were eligible to receive any of the following Company contributions. The Company could make a discretionary matching contribution to the Plan as determined by the Board of Directors, subject to the limitations on deductions under Section 404 of the IRC. The Company elected to provide a discretionary employer matching contribution in the amount of \$57,353 for the period ended August 31, 2022. The Company could also make a discretionary contribution to the Plan as determined by the Board of Directors. Such contribution was allocated to participant accounts on a pro-rata ratio based on the participant's total compensation in relation to the compensation to all qualified participants. For the period ended August 31, 2022, the Company did not make an additional discretionary contribution.

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Participants directed the investment of all contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan offered various mutual funds as investment options for participants.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account was credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's contributions, (b) Plan earnings and (c) administrative expenses. Allocations were based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined in the plan agreement. The benefit to which a participant was entitled was the benefit that could have been provided from the participant's vested account balance.

Vesting

Participants were immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus the annual allocation of Plan earnings on those contributions. Vesting in the employer matching contributions and any discretionary contributions plus actual earnings thereon occurred in 20% increments commencing upon the completion of two years of service, with 100% vesting upon completion of six years of credited service, disability, or death. Upon the Plan merger, all participants became 100% vested in their accounts.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants had the option to borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the vested value of their account. Loan terms ranged from one to five years, or up to 20 years if the loan was for the purpose of purchasing a principal residence. Notes bore interest at rates that ranged from 3.25% to 8.25%, which was commensurate with local prevailing rates. The notes were secured by the balance in the participant's account. Principal and interest was paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant had the option to elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account or periodic installment payments. Participant vested account balances that were \$5,000 or less were to be paid in a lump-sum in accordance with the procedures described in the plan agreement. Benefits were recognized when paid to participants or their designated beneficiaries.

Participants had the option to make in-service distributions from their accounts upon attainment of age 59½ in an amount up to 100% of the vested portion of their account attributable to all contributions, or in the event of a serious financial hardship, up to 100% of the vested portion of their account attributable to their pre-tax elective deferrals, as defined in

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the plan agreement. In addition, hardship withdrawals from the Plan were permitted subject to the applicable ERISA laws.

Forfeitures

When terminations of participation in the Plan occur, the non-vested portion of the participant's account, as defined by the Plan, represents a forfeiture. Forfeitures were available to be used to reduce future employer contributions or to pay Plan expenses. The balance of forfeited non-vested accounts totaling \$490 for the period ended August 31, 2022 was part of the assets merged into the assets of Lab Logistics 401(k). The balance of forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$490 for the year ended December 31, 2021.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The Plan's financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Valuation of Investments and Income Recognition

Investments in mutual funds were stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The plan administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by Vanguard Fiduciary Trust Company (Vanguard), the Plan's Trustee. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities were recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends were recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income was recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation or depreciation included in the fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

All Plan assets were transferred to Lab Logistics 401(k) as disclosed in Note 3.

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Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants were measured at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest and are secured by the balance in the respective participant's account. Interest income on notes receivable from participants was recorded when it was earned. A receivable was considered past due if payment had not been received within stated terms. Delinquent notes receivable from participants were reclassified as distributions based on terms of the Plan document. No allowance for credit losses was deemed necessary to be recorded as of August 31, 2022 or December 31, 2021.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the excess contributions to the applicable participants prior to March 15 of the subsequent year. Due to the plan merger and the asset transfer prior to completion of the non-discrimination testing of the Plan, Lab Logistics 401(k), as the surviving plan, is responsible for the distributions of the excess contributions to the applicable participants included in the accompanying financial statements.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits were recorded when paid.

Plan Expenses

Expenses incurred in the administration of the Plan were paid by the Company unless the Company directed that such expenses were paid by the Plan. Notes receivable from participants' set-up and maintenance fees were paid directly by the participants through a reduction in their account. Investment advisory fees and administrative expenses, if applicable, were paid by the Plan through revenue sharing as a reduction of investment income (net appreciation or depreciation) from the related investment fund.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through June 14, 2023, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. PLAN MERGER

As discussed in Note 1, in May 2022, the Company was acquired by Lab Logistics. On May 31, 2022, the Plan was frozen which prevented any additional participants from entering the

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Plan as well as the accrual of any employer contributions after such date. Effective August 31, 2022, the Plan was merged into Lab Logistics 401(k). Lab Logistics 401(k) is the surviving plan and The Allied Group 401(k) was terminated. The transfer of the Plan's assets was completed on August 31, 2022.

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Plan has the ability to access at the measurement date.

Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted prices included with Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs that are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2021.

Mutual Funds - Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and

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Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

5. RELATED PARTY AND PARTIES-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Parties-in-interest are defined under Department of Labor (DOL) Regulations as any fiduciary of the Plan, any party rendering service to the Plan, the employer, and certain others. For the period January 1, 2022 through August 31, 2022, the Plan's transactions with parties-in-interest were as follows:

Investments - Certain Plan investments were held and managed by Vanguard. Vanguard was the trustee and recordkeeper for the Plan and, therefore, transactions in such investments qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Investment Advisory Services - The Plan had contracted with a company to provide investment advisory services. In accordance with the agreement, the fees are based on a percentage of the market value of the total annual assets managed and are payable quarterly. The agreement can be terminated by either party upon 30 days prior written notice.

Employees - Certain employees of the Company, who were also plan participants, performed administrative services on behalf of the Plan at no cost to the Plan.

6. TAX STATUS OF THE PLAN

On June 30, 2020, the IRS stated that the volume submitter plan adopted by the Plan, as then designed, qualifies under Section 401 of the IRC. The Plan has not received a determination letter specific to the Plan itself; however, the plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan was designed and operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and believe that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax-exempt.

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U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS or the DOL. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions, however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

7. PLAN FINANCIAL INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY TRUSTEE

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at August 31, 2022 and December 31, 2021, and net depreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the period January 1, 2022 through August 31, 2022, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Vanguard, the Plan's Trustee.

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
