Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Laird Technologies, Inc. 401(k) and Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of Laird Technologies, Inc. and its related companies: Laird Controls North America, Inc.; Laird Durham, Inc.; R&F Products, Inc.; Summit Data Communications, Inc.; Thermagon, Inc.; Centurian Wireless Technologies, Inc.; Antenex, Inc.; RecepTec Corp.; Emerson & Cuming Microwave Products, Inc.; Steward, Inc.; AeroComm, Inc. (collectively, the Company). The Plan excludes leased employees and union employees. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

The Plan was restated effective February 15, 2022 in order to comply with required legislative updates. There were no significant changes to the plan provisions as a result of the restatement.

Effective July 1, 2022, the Plan was merged into the DuPont Retirement Savings Plan (DuPont Plan). The net assets of the Plan were transferred to the DuPont Plan at the close of business on June 30, 2022. Management of the Company believes that the Plan merger was a tax-exempt transaction under the applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and, therefore is not subject to federal income taxes.

Contributions

Each year, participants could contribute up to 60% of pre-tax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants were permitted to designate a portion or all of their deferral contributions as Roth 401(k) contributions. Participants who had attained age 50 before the end of the plan year were eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants could also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans.

The Plan included an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees were automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elected not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants had their deferral rate set at 3% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant. Automatically enrolled participants had their deferral rate increased at a rate of 1% per year on April 1 up to a maximum of 10% of eligible compensation, unless otherwise elected by the participant.

Contributions (Continued)

The Company could make discretionary matching contributions. For the period ended June 30, 2022 and the year ended December 31, 2021, the Company matched 50% of the first 6% of eligible compensation that a participant contributed to the Plan.

The Company could also make discretionary profit sharing contributions. For the period ended June 30, 2022 and the year ended December 31, 2021, the Company did not make any discretionary profit sharing contributions.

Contributions were subject to certain limitations as mandated by the IRC.

Investment Options

Participants could direct all their contributions among one or more funds subject to the allocation limitations set forth in the Plan. Changes in allocation of future contributions and transfers among funds of presently invested contributions was permitted pursuant to the Plan's provisions.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account was credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's contribution(s) and (b) plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant was entitled was the benefit that could be provided from the participant's vested account balance.

Vesting

Participants were 100% vested immediately in their contributions, discretionary employer matching contributions and discretionary profit sharing contributions, plus actual earnings thereon.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants could borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to the maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance, less defaulted loans (if any). The loans were secured by the balances in the participants' accounts and bore interest at rates that ranged from 6% to 12%, which was commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the plan administrator. The term of the loan could not exceed 5 years or 10 years if the loan proceeds was used to acquire the principal residence of the participant. Principal and interest were paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service, death, disability, or retirement, a participant could receive a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or annual installments.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan were paid by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Loan administration and distribution fees were charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. The Plan also paid certain investment advisory and plan administration fees from plan assets. Certain investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) of fair value of investments.

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements is in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAP) and requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Plan Management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and trustee. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis and dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest less amounts defaulted (if any). Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events are events or transactions that occur after year end but before financial statements are issued or are available to be issued. These events and transactions either provide additional evidence about conditions that existed at year end, including the estimates inherent in the process of preparing financial statements (that is, recognized subsequent events), or provide evidence about conditions that did not exist at year end but arose after that date (that is, nonrecognized subsequent events).

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Subsequent Events (Continued)

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through DATE OF F/S, which was the date that these financial statements were available for issuance, and determined that there were no significant nonrecognized subsequent events through that date.

3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Topic 820 are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access at the measurement date.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- a. Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets,
- b. Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets,
- c. Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability,
- d. Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full-term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at June 30, 2022 and December 31, 2021.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Stable value collective trust: A stable value fund that is composed primarily of fully benefit-responsive investment contracts that is valued at the net asset value of units of the bank collective trust. The net asset value is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported net asset value. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the collective trust, the issuer reserves the right to require 12 months' notification in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

4. CERTIFICATION OF FINANCIAL INFORMATION

The following financial data included in the accompanying financial statements as of and for the period ended June 30, 2022 and as of and for the year ended December 31, 2021 has been certified as complete and accurate by Fidelity Management Trust Company, a qualified institution, and has not been audited by the independent auditors for the Plan: investments at fair value, notes receivable from participants, interest and dividends, interest on notes receivable from participants, and net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments.

5. PLAN TERMINATION

While the Company has not expressed any intent to terminate the Plan, the Plan was merged into the DuPont Plan on June 30, 2022. In the event such termination occurs, the distribution of the Plan's assets to participants or their beneficiaries will be made by the trusts of the Plan in accordance with the plan document and subject to the provisions of ERISA.

6. TAX STATUS

The Company adopted a non-standardized pre-approved plan document, which received an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) stated that the pre-approved plan document was in compliance with applicable requirements of the IRC. The Plan has not received a determination letter specific to the Plan itself and has been amended since the date of the opinion letter; however, the plan administrator believes that the Plan was designed, and is being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

US GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more-likely-than-not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

7. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments were managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company, the trustee; and its affiliates, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest. Fees paid by the Plan for investment management services were included as a reduction of the return earned on each fund. Certain administrative expenses were paid by the Plan or the Company. The Plan issued loans to participants, which were secured by the vested balance in the participant's accounts. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest. Employees of the Company provided administrative services to the Plan for which no fees were charged.

8. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
