Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the Greenbriar Treatment Center 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits in liquidation as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits in liquidation for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency (qualified institution), provided that the investment information is prepared and certified to by the qualified institution in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, and for the years then ended, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and the procedures performed as described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report

- the amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP); and
- the certified investment information in the accompanying financial statements agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by a qualified institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Emphasis of Matter — Plan Termination and Liquidation Basis of Accounting

As further discussed in Note 1 to the financial statements, the Plan's sponsor approved a plan to terminate the Plan effective November 1, 2022, and management determined liquidation is imminent. As a result, the Plan uses the liquidation basis of accounting used in presenting the financial statements. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Management is responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments. Management is also responsible for administering the Plan and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the *Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit* section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

1. Plan Description

The following description of the Greenbriar Treatment Center 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document or the Summary Plan Description for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

Prior to termination, the Plan was a participant-directed defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of Phoenix-Washington, Inc. d/b/a Greenbriar Treatment Center (the Company) who are age 21 or older. The Company was a wholly-owned subsidiary of Washington Physician Services Organization, which is a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Washington Health System. The Plan was subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

The Company was the sponsor of the Plan. Charles Schwab Bank was the trustee of the Plan and maintained the Plan's investments. Effective January 1, 2021, Charles Schwab Bank transferred its trust business to its affiliate, Charles Schwab Trust Bank.

Effective July 1, 2022, the Company entered into an agreement providing for the sale of its assets. As a result of this sale, the Company's Board of Directors, on September 30, 2022, elected to terminate the Plan effective November 1, 2022. In accordance with Plan provisions, the Sponsor vested 100% of the Plan's assets as of November 1, 2022.

Contributions

Prior to termination of the Plan, participating employees could contribute a fixed dollar amount or any percentage of a dollar amount up to 100% of their compensation, subject to Internal Revenue Code limitations for the calendar year. In addition, eligible employees could make rollover contributions from other qualified retirement plans. The Company would make a matching contribution in an amount and allocation formula that is determined by the Company. The employer matching contribution for 2022 and 2021 was 15%, up to 6% of participant deferrals. The Company could make discretionary profit sharing contributions as defined by the Plan. No employer discretionary profit sharing contributions were made for the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021.

Effective beginning after October 1, 2017, the Plan was amended to include an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Under this feature, participants are subject to an automatic withholding of 3% from their compensation.

Investment Options

Prior to termination of the Plan, upon enrollment, participants would direct their elective contributions in any one of the allowable investment funds offered by the Plan. Participants could make changes in their investment elections at any time.

Participant Accounts

Prior to termination of the Plan, participant accounts were credited with the participant's contributions and an allocation of (a) the Company's matching contribution, (b) the Company's profit sharing contribution, and (c) Plan earnings and administrative expenses. The benefit to which a participant was entitled is the benefit that was provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Prior to termination of the Plan, participant elective contributions and rollover amounts vested immediately, while matching and profit sharing contributions by the Company vested to the participant in accordance with the following schedule:

A participant's interest in the employer's contribution becomes 100% vested and distributable upon disability, death or plan termination.

Participant Loans

Prior to termination of the Plan, the Plan allowed each participant to borrow against his or her account up to the lesser of the following amounts:

- a) \$50,000, or
- b) An amount equal to 50% of the participant's current account vested interest

The minimum loan amount was \$1,000 and a participant would only have one loan outstanding at any time. The period of repayment for any loan was determined by mutual agreement between the plan administrator and the participant in accordance with the Plan. The term was limited to 5 years; however, a longer period was available if the loan was used for purchase of a principal residence. Interest rates on loans outstanding ranged from 4.25% to 6.25%.

Participant loans were valued at their outstanding balances, which approximates fair value.

Payment of Benefits

Prior to termination of the Plan, upon termination of employment, a participant would elect to receive a lump sum distribution of his or her vested account. However, if the value of the participant's vested benefit did not exceed \$1,000, the Plan would distribute the entire amount to the participant.

Participants could keep their funds in the Plan after their normal retirement date, but were required to begin withdrawing once they reached age 70½ unless they remained employed.

Additionally, a participant's vested benefit was distributable upon the occurrence of any one of the following events: (a) death, (b) disability or (c) plan termination.

Participants could withdraw any part of their elective deferral account upon written notice of financial hardship as determined by the plan administrator. Participants were also eligible to receive in-service distributions.

Forfeited Accounts

Prior to termination of the Plan, forfeitures were used first to restore forfeited amounts to reemployed participants and second to reduce Company contributions or to pay for Plan expenses. Forfeitures from the Plan during 2022 and 2021 were \$2,877 and \$148, respectively. The balance remaining in the forfeiture account at December 31, 2022 and 2021 was \$0 and \$148, respectively.

Plan Expenses and Related Party Transactions

Plan investments consisted of shares of mutual funds and collective investment trusts, which were held by Charles Schwab Bank and Charles Schwab Trust Bank, the trustees.

A portion of expenses incurred for administration of the Plan are paid by the Company and from participant forfeitures.

Fees paid by the Plan for recordkeeping and loan/distribution fees totaled \$20,395 and \$6,728 for the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021. Recordkeeping fees are allocated equally to each participant, while loan/distribution fees are specifically charged to the participant. In addition, for the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021, the Plan paid investment fees of \$17,882 and \$23,120 to Schneider Downs Wealth Management Advisors, an affiliate of Schneider Downs and Co., Inc., the Third Party Administrator. These fees are allocated to participants based on their account balances.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

For the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021, the financial statements of the Plan were prepared using the liquidation basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The investments of the Plan were reported at fair value, including the collective investment trusts, which held units in indirect investment trusts. The fair value of a financial instrument is the amount that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (see Note 4).

Purchases and sales of the investments within the Plan are reflected on a settlement date basis. Dividend income was recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income was recorded on the accrual basis.

The change between years in the market value of investments and realized gains and losses through purchases and sales of investments are reflected as net (depreciation) appreciation in fair value of investments in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits in liquidation.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants were recorded when paid.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates and these differences could be material.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities which are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

3. Information Certified by the Plan's Trustees

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements, including investments held at December 31, 2022 and 2021, and net (depreciation) appreciation in fair value of investments, dividend and interest income from mutual funds, dividend and interest income from collective trusts for the years then ended, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Charles Schwab Trust Bank and Charles Schwab Bank (each a qualified institution and the trustees of the Plan). The plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

4. Fair Value Measurements

The Plan applies the provisions of FASB Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) Topic 820, *Fair Value Measurement and Disclosures*, (ASC 820) which establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are described below:

Basis of Fair Value Measurement

Level 1 – Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets that are accessible at the measurement date for identical, unrestricted assets or liabilities;

Level 2 – Quoted prices of securities in markets that are not considered to be active or financial instruments for which all significant inputs are observable, either directly or indirectly;

Level 3 – Prices or valuations that require inputs that are both significant to the fair value measurement and unobservable.

A financial instrument's level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

Valuation methodologies maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies used as of and for the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021.

Mutual Funds

Mutual funds represent investments with various investment managers. The fair value of these investments are determined by reference to the fund's underlying assets, which are principally marketable equity and fixed income securities. Shares held in mutual funds traded on national securities exchanges are valued at the net asset value.

Collective Investment Trusts

Collective investment trusts represent investments with various investment managers. Units held in collective investment trusts are valued at the daily unit value as reported by the investment managers. The collective investment trusts have no restrictions or redemption period requirements. There are no unfunded commitments relating to the collective investment trusts.

The valuation methods described above may provide a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. While the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, it is possible that different fair value measurements may arise due to the use of different methodologies or assumptions in determining the fair value measurement at the reporting date.

6. Income Tax Status

The Plan was a 401(k) prototype profit sharing plan sponsored by Schneider Downs and Co., Inc. The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) issued an opinion letter on the Plan document dated August 1, 2015 stating that the form of the Prototype Plan was acceptable under Section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code for use by adopting employers, and that an employer adopting the Plan could rely on the opinion letter with respect to the qualification of the Plan under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan was amended since receiving the opinion letter. The Plan administrator believed that the Plan was designed, and was operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and, therefore, believes that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax exempt. The Plan was subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions. There are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Generally accepted accounting principles require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the relevant taxing authority. Management has determined that no provision for income taxes is required to be reflected in the accompanying financial statements.

7. Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated through the date of the independent auditors' report. Management did not identify any events requiring recording in or disclosure to the financial statements as of and for the year ended December 31, 2022.
