Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of Hill-Rom, Inc. Savings Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits – modified cash basis as of December 30, 2022 and December 31, 2021, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits – modified cash basis for the period from January 1, 2022 to December 30, 2022, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Hill-Rom, Inc. Savings Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of December 30, 2022 and December 31, 2021, and for the period from January 1, 2022 to December 30, 2022, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 2.

- The information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Hill-Rom, Inc. Savings Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 2 of the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial statements are prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Our opinion is not modified with respect to that matter.

Plan Mergers

As discussed in Note 1 to the financial statements, the Employer approved a resolution and an amendment to the Plan Agreement on December 21, 2021 to merge the Bardy Diagnostics, Inc. 401(k) Plan into and with the Plan, effective January 1, 2022.

Also as discussed in Note 1 to the financial statements, Baxter International Inc. Administrative Committee, the successor Plan Administrator of the Hill-Rom, Inc. Savings Plan, approved a resolution and an amendment to the Plan Agreement to merge the Plan into and with the Baxter International Inc. and Subsidiaries U.S. Retirement Savings Plan, effective December 30, 2022 at which time the Plan and Trust ceased to exist.

Plan Transfer

As discussed in Note 1 to the financial statements, the Employer approved a resolution and an amendment to the Plan Agreement to authorize a partial plan-to-plan transfer of the net assets related to the participants of Epiphany Healthcare effective April 18, 2022. Epiphany Healthcare was previously an unrelated participating employer in the PathGoal Employer Services 401(k) Plan sponsored by PathGoal Employer Services, LLC.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 2; this includes determining that the modified cash basis of accounting is an acceptable basis for the preparation of the financial statements in the circumstances. Management is also responsible for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of Hill-Rom, Inc. Savings Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.

- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Hill-Rom, Inc. Savings Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audit did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of the modified cash basis of accounting.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS December 30, 2022 and December 31, 2021

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Hill-Rom, Inc. Savings Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General: The Plan was organized effective July 1, 1987, as a defined contribution retirement savings plan covering all eligible employees of Hillrom, Inc. (previously Hill-Rom Holdings, Inc.) and its affiliated participating employers (collectively, the Employer). The Employer classifies its employees as either bargaining employees (covered by a collective bargaining agreement that provides for participation in the Plan) or as non-bargaining employees and are eligible to participate in the Plan upon meeting the Plan's service requirement (generally scheduled to work at least 1,000 hours in a calendar year) as defined in the Plan Agreement.

The Employer was acquired by Baxter International, Inc. on December 13, 2021. Effective January 1, 2022, the Plan Agreement was amended to update the name of the Plan Administrator to Baxter International Inc. Administrative Committee (Baxter Committee) (formerly Hill-Rom Holdings, Inc. Pension Administration Committee) which is responsible for the oversight of the Plan and determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance and reports to the Board of Directors of Baxter International, Inc.

The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Plan Mergers: On December 21, 2021, the Employer amended the Plan Agreement to merge the Bardy Diagnostics, Inc. 401(k) Plan into and with the Plan, effective January 1, 2022. During January 2022, net assets totaling \$3,912,388 were transferred to and received by the Plan to complete the merger of the Bardy Diagnostics, Inc. 401(k) Plan. The net assets from the merged plan were mapped and/or invested per each affected participant's respective investment election. See Note 6.

The Baxter Committee approved a resolution and an amendment to the Plan Agreement to merge the Plan into and with the Baxter International Inc. and Subsidiaries U.S. Retirement Savings Plan (Baxter Retirement Plan), effective December 30, 2022, at which time the Plan and its related trust ceased to exist. All of the Plan's assets and liabilities were transferred to or assumed by the Baxter Retirement Plan as of December 30, 2022 to complete the Plan's merger. The Baxter Retirement Plan was amended to recognize the Employer and its affiliates as participating employers and to recognize service credits for purposes of eligibility, contribution allocations, and vesting under the Baxter Retirement Plan. As such, all participants in the Plan became eligible to participate in the Baxter Retirement Plan. See Note 6.

Plan Transfer: Effective April 18, 2022, the Employer adopted an amendment to the Plan Agreement to approve a partial plan-to plan transfer of the net assets related to the participants of Epiphany Healthcare. Epiphany Healthcare was previously an unrelated participating employer in the PathGoal Employer Services 401(k) Plan sponsored by PathGoal Employer Services, LLC (EIN: 13-4010751). During April 2022, net assets totaling \$4,855,459 were transferred to and received by the Plan to complete the asset transfer related to Epiphany Healthcare. The net assets received for the participants of Epiphany Healthcare were mapped and/or invested per each affected participant's respective investment election. See Note 6.

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (CONTINUED)

Contributions: Each year, participants could authorize the Employer to contribute to the Plan up to 40% of their eligible annual compensation, subject to the maximum annual amount permitted under Section 402(g) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Participants who attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year were eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants could also make rollover contributions from amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans and certain Individual Retirement Accounts (IRA) as defined in the Plan Agreement. Contributions were subject to certain limitations under the IRC.

The Plan included an auto-enrollment provision whereby certain non-bargaining employees were automatically enrolled in the Plan unless an affirmative election not to participate in the Plan was executed. Automatically enrolled participants had their contribution rate set at 6% of eligible compensation and their contributions were invested in a designated fund until changed by the participant.

The Employer made matching contributions for certain bargaining employees and for certain non-bargaining employees equal to 50% of the first 6% of compensation that each participant contributed to the Plan as defined in the Plan Agreement.

The Employer also made automatic contributions in the amount of 3% or 4% of each eligible non-bargaining employee's compensation based on their respective employee classification as defined in the Plan Agreement.

Participants directed the investment of their contributions, as well as those made by the Employer, into various investment options offered by the Plan and/or through a self-directed brokerage account subject to guidelines established by the Employer.

Participant Accounts: Each participant's account was credited with the participant's contributions and the Employer's matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Employer's automatic contributions and Plan earnings. Participant accounts could also be charged with an allocation of certain administrative expenses of the Plan. Allocations were based on participant earnings or account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined in the Plan Agreement. The benefit to which a participant was entitled was the benefit that could be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting and Forfeitures: Participants were vested immediately in their contributions and the Employer's automatic 3% or 4% contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Employer's matching contribution portion of their account was based on years of service. Generally, a participant became 100% vested after three years of credited service. Certain participants were subject to a different vesting schedule based on their participation in their employer's previous plan that was subsequently merged into the Plan, as defined in the Plan Agreement.

At December 30, 2022 and December 31, 2021, forfeited nonvested accounts of terminated participants totaled \$78,121 and \$283,111, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future Employer contributions, pay Plan expenses, and/or be allocated or reinstated to the accounts of eligible participants, as defined in the Plan Agreement. In the period ended December 30, 2022, forfeited nonvested accounts of \$1,746,988 were used to reduce Employer contributions. The remaining forfeitures at December 30, 2021, was transferred to the Baxter Retirement Plan in connection with the Plan merger.

Notes Receivable from Participants: Participants could borrow from their account a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum amount equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The repayment terms of the notes could not exceed five years except for the purchase of the participant's principal residence, for which the terms could have exceeded five years per the Plan Agreement. The notes were secured by the balance in the participant's account and bore interest at rates which were commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan Administrator. Principal and interest were paid ratably through regular payroll deductions or by self-payment from terminated participants.

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (CONTINUED)

Benefits: Upon the occurrence of a distributable event due to separation from service by termination, death, disability, or retirement, as defined by the Plan Agreement, a participant could elect to receive a lump-sum cash distribution equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account, installment payments over a specified period of time, or partial payments. Certain participants could request a qualified joint and survivor annuity (for a married participant), or life annuity (for a single participant) due to their participation in their employer's previous plan that was subsequently merged into the Plan, as defined in the Plan Agreement. Hardship and in-service withdrawals, as well as required minimum distributions and automatic distributions to former participants, as defined in the Plan Agreement, were also permitted from a participant's account.

Plan Termination: Prior to the Plan's merger into and with Baxter Retirement Plan, the Employer had the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, the participants would become 100% vested in their accounts.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting: The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting. This method of accounting differs from accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America in that contributions and income are recorded when received, rather than when earned and expenses are recorded when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred. Although the modified cash basis of accounting represents a departure from accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, it is an acceptable method of accounting for employee benefit plans under the requirements of ERISA.

Estimates: The preparation of financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting requires the Plan's management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition: The Plan's investments are reported at fair value, except fully benefit-responsive investment contracts are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. The Baxter Committee determined the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the Plan's investment advisor and trustee. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities were recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest and dividend income was recorded when received. Net appreciation (depreciation) included the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the period.

Notes Receivable from Participants: The Plan's notes receivable from participants were measured at their unpaid principal balance. Interest income was recorded when received. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 30, 2022 and December 31, 2021. If a participant ceased to make repayments and the Plan Administrator deemed the note receivable from the participant to be in default, the balance of the note receivable from the participant was reduced and a benefit payment was recorded per the Plan Agreement.

Payment of Benefits: Benefits were recorded when paid.

Expenses: Administrative expenses for maintaining the Plan could be paid by the Employer or the Plan, at the Employer's discretion. Certain administration fees were charged directly to the participant's account and were included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses were included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Tax Status: The Plan has adopted a volume submitter plan document whose sponsor has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated June 30, 2020, stating that the volume submitter plan document was designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan and the volume submitter plan document have been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan was designed, and was operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan was qualified, and the related trust was tax-exempt.

The Plan's management evaluates tax positions and recognizes tax liabilities if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS or other taxing authorities.

The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in process.

Subsequent Events: The Plan Administrator has evaluated the financial statements for subsequent events occurring through July 10, 2023, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan has categorized its assets and liabilities that are measured at fair value into a three-level fair value hierarchy. The hierarchy prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include: quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement. In situations where there is little or no market activity for the asset or liability, the Plan makes estimates and assumptions related to the pricing of the asset or liability including assumptions regarding risk.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used by the Plan for assets that are measured at fair value on a recurring basis. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 30, 2022 and December 31, 2021.

Registered Investment Companies (Mutual Funds and/or Exchange-traded Funds) and Money Market Fund Shares: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the funds. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. These funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

NOTE 3 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (CONTINUED)

Collective Trust Funds: Valued at the unit price reported by the sponsoring trust companies. The underlying investments owned by the funds can include money market funds, stable value funds, fixed-income securities, registered investment companies, common stocks, corporate bonds, U.S. Government securities, other collective trust funds, or guaranteed investment contracts priced by the sponsoring insurance company using applicable interest rates and contract provisions. The unit price is based on the fair value of these underlying investments owned, less any accrual of fees and expenses borne by the fund, and divided by the number of units outstanding. The unit price is readily determinable and quoted on the active private market on which participants can transact daily with no redemption restrictions on these investments.

Common and Preferred Stocks: Valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded.

Corporate Bonds: Valued using pricing models maximizing the use of observable inputs for similar securities. This includes basing the value on yields currently available on comparable securities of issuers with similar credit ratings. When quoted prices are not available for identical or similar bonds, those corporate bonds are valued under a discounted cash flow approach that maximizes observable inputs, such as current yields or similar instruments, but includes adjustments for certain risks that may not be observable, such as credit and liquidity risks.

U.S. Government Securities: Valued using pricing models maximizing the use of observable inputs for similar securities.

Certificates of Deposit: Valued by discounting cash flows based on interest rates of similar instruments with similar credit ratings and duration.

The preceding methods may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan's management believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain assets could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Following is a summary, within each level of the fair value hierarchy, of the Plan's assets that are measured at fair value on a recurring basis as of December 31, 2021. There were no investments measured at fair value as of December 30, 2022.

NOTE 4 - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN'S TRUSTEE (UNAUDITED INFORMATION)

All Plan information related to investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2021, and net appreciation or depreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the period from January 1, 2022 to December 30, 2022, disclosed in the accompanying financial statements was obtained or derived from information provided to the Plan Administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Fidelity Management Trust Company, the Plan's trustee, in accordance with Section 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

The Plan's independent auditor did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements.

NOTE 5 - FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT

The Plan held an interest in a synthetic guaranteed investment contract. This contract met the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore was reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for a fully benefit-responsive investment contract because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses.

In a synthetic investment contract, the Plan owns the underlying assets of the contract. A synthetic investment contract includes a wrapper contract, which is an agreement for the wrap issuer, such as a bank or insurance company, to make payments to the Plan in certain circumstances. The wrapper contract typically includes certain conditions and limitations on the underlying assets owned by the Plan. The synthetic investment contract is designed to accrue interest based on crediting rates established by the contract issuer.

The synthetic investment contract held by the Plan included a wrapper contract that provided a guarantee that the credit rate will not fall below 0%. Cash flow volatility (for example, timing of benefit payments) as well as asset underperformance could be passed through to the Plan through adjustments to future contract crediting rates. Formulas were provided in the contract that adjusted renewal crediting rates to recognize the difference between the fair value and the book value of the underlying assets. Crediting rates were reviewed periodically for resetting.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with the fully benefit-responsive investment contract was dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations could be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events limited the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer. Examples of such events included the following:

1. The Plan's failure to qualify under Section 401(a) of the IRC or the failure of the trust to be tax-exempt under Section 501(a) of the IRC
2. Premature termination of the contract
3. Complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan
4. Changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options
5. Bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spinoffs of a subsidiary) that significantly affect the Plan's normal operations

In addition, certain events allowed the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Examples of such events included the following:

1. An uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines
2. A breach of material obligation under the contract
3. A material misrepresentation
4. A material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer

NOTE 6 - PLAN AMENDMENTS

On December 21, 2021, the Employer amended the Plan Agreement to merge the Bardy Diagnostics, Inc. 401(k) Plan into and with the Plan, effective January 1, 2022. The amendment recognizes Bardy Diagnostics, Inc. (EIN: 46-2660949) as a participating employer in the Plan and provides service credits for purposes of eligibility, contribution allocations, and vesting under the Plan and updates the Plan's distribution options related to the affected merged participants' account balances.

Effective February 28, 2022, the Employer amended and restated the Plan Agreement in its entirety to incorporate all prior amendments and to comply with the 2017 Cumulative List of Changes in Plan Qualification Requirements, per IRS Notice 2017-37, and with the requirements under IRS Revenue Procedure 2017-41 to maintain the Plan's tax-qualified status. The Plan has adopted a pre-approved defined contribution plan document whose sponsor has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated June 30, 2020, stated that the plan document was designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC. There were no other significant changes in the Plan's provisions as part of the amended and restated Plan Agreement.

On April 1, 2022, the Employer adopted an amendment to the Plan Agreement to recognize Epiphany Healthcare Data Management, LLC (Epiphany Healthcare) (EIN: 37-1740511) as a participating employer in the Plan and to update the name of the Plan Administrator to Baxter International, Inc. Administrative Committee, effective January 1, 2022.

Effective April 18, 2022, the Employer adopted an amendment to the Plan Agreement to clarify the Plan's vesting schedule related to the participants of Epiphany Healthcare and to approve a partial plan-to-plan transfer of the net assets related to the participants of Epiphany Healthcare. Epiphany Healthcare was previously an unrelated participating employer in the PathGoal Employer Services 401(k) Plan sponsored by PathGoal Employer Services, LLC (EIN: 13-4010751).

On December 28, 2022, the Baxter Committee approved a resolution and an amendment to the Plan Agreement to merge the Plan into and with the Baxter International Inc. and Subsidiaries U.S. Retirement Savings Plan (Baxter Retirement Plan), effective December 30, 2022.

NOTE 7 - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50% or more of such an employer or employee association, or relatives of such persons.

The Plan has arrangements with several third-party service providers. The Plan pays certain expenses related to the Plan's operation, administration, and investment activity. The Plan's expenses may be paid directly to the respective service provider or indirectly through the Plan's investments returns. Therefore, these transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

The Plan may receive revenue-sharing compensation from certain Plan investment options. This revenue, if any, is used to offset certain recordkeeping and administration services to the Plan and/or allocated to participant accounts as additional earnings.

The Employer provided certain accounting, administrative and investment management services to the Plan for which it received no compensation.

Notes receivable from participants were permitted party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE 8 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan's investment securities were exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it was at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities could occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
