## Independent Auditor's Report

To the Plan Administrator of the Providence Washington Insurance Company Employees' Pension Plan:

### **Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit**

We have performed audits of the financial statements of the Providence Washington Insurance Company Employees' Pension Plan ("the Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits in liquidation and of accumulated plan benefits in liquidation as of September 30, 2022 and December 31, 2021, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits in liquidation and of changes in accumulated plan benefits in liquidation for the period ended September 30, 2022, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's ("DOL") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA ("qualified institution").

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of September 30, 2022 and December 31, 2021 and for the periods then ended, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note F to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### **Opinion**

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report:

- the amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP").
- the information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets which provide benefits under the plan and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

### ***Basis for Opinion***

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (“GAAS”). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

### ***Emphasis of Matter - Plan Termination***

As further discussed in Notes A and E to the financial statements, the Company adopted an amendment on December 10, 2021 to terminate the Plan. In accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, the Plan is presenting the 2022 and 2021 financial statements using the liquidation basis of accounting. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

### ***Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements***

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are issued or available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

### ***Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements***

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

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A. PLAN DESCRIPTION:

The following brief description of Providence Washington Insurance Company Employees' Pension Plan (the "Plan") is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the plan document for more complete information.

General

The Plan is a non-contributory defined benefit pension plan covering all eligible employees of Providence Washington Insurance Company (the "Company"). Prior to March 31, 2004, employees with one year of service were eligible to participate in the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended ("ERISA") and the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC").

Effective March 31, 2004, the Plan was frozen to new participants; no new participants are eligible for the Plan and participants no longer accrue benefits. In conjunction with the Plan freeze, certain employees were granted additional years of credited service based on their age and years of service with the Company.

On December 10, 2021, the Company adopted an amendment to terminate the Plan, and thereafter distribute benefits as an annuity contract sold to Mutual of Omaha for \$11,783,134.

Contributions and Funding Policy

The Company's funding policy is to make annual contributions to the Plan in amounts recommended by the actuary based on aggregate cost method to maintain the Plan on a sound actuarial basis. In determining the amounts and incidence of such contributions, the Company considers the actuarial recommendations provided by an enrolled actuary to comply with ERISA. The Plan has met the ERISA minimum funding requirements.

Benefits

Employees with five or more years of service are entitled to annual pension benefits beginning at normal retirement age (65). Benefits are based on compensation and years of service. The Plan permits early retirement with reduced benefits for participants beginning at age 55. Employees may elect to receive their pension benefits in the form of a life annuity, a joint and 50%, 75% or 100% survivor annuity. There are no lump sum provisions in the Plan except for benefits aggregating \$5,000 or less or for certain terminated participants with less than 5 years of vesting service.

Death Benefits

If a married participant dies after completing five years of vesting service or if an unmarried participant dies after attaining his/her earliest retirement age, his/her eligible surviving spouse or beneficiary will be entitled to receive a reduced monthly pension benefit as defined in the Plan. If a married participant dies prior to completing five years of service or if an unmarried participant dies before attaining his/her earliest retirement age, the participants eligible surviving spouse or beneficiary will only be entitled to receive the participant's accumulated contributions plus earnings.

Vesting

Effective January 1, 2004, all participants were 100% vested in their benefits.

B. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

Basis of Presentation

As a result of the termination of the Plan, the Plan's financial statements are presented using the liquidation basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein; disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities; and the actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits at the date of the financial statements, and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value which approximates liquidation value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants on the measurement date. See Note C for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses consisting of trustee fees are paid by the Plan. All other administrative expenses are paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements.

Actuarial Present Value of Accumulated Plan Benefits

Accumulated plan benefits are those future periodic payments, including lump-sum distributions, which are attributable, under the Plan's provisions, to the services rendered by the employees to the valuation date. Accumulated plan benefits include benefits expected to be paid to (a) retired or terminated employees or their beneficiaries, and (b) beneficiaries of participants who have died, and (c) present employees or their beneficiaries. Benefits payable under all circumstances – retirement, death, disability, and termination of employment – are included, to the extent they are deemed attributable to employee service rendered to the valuation date.

Actuarial Assumptions

The significant actuarial assumptions used in determining accumulated plan benefits as stated in the actuarial valuation reports as of December 31, 2021 are as follows:

Investment Return - 2.25%

Mortality Table - PRI- 2012 Mortality table adjusted to Scale  
MP-2021 in 2021

The computation of the actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits was made as of January 1, 2022. Had the valuation been performed as of December 31, there would be no material difference.

C. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS:

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

*Level 1* - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

*Level 2* - Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

*Level 3* - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used by the Plan. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at September 30, 2022 and December 31, 2021.

*Mutual funds* – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Guaranteed insurance contract* – Valued at fair value by the insurance company by discounting the related cash flows based on current yields of similar instruments with comparable durations considering the creditworthiness of the issuer. Since the Plan transacts at contract value, fair value is determined annually for financial statement reporting purposes only. In determining the reasonableness of the methodology, the Investment Committee evaluates a variety of factors including review of existing contracts, economic conditions, industry and market developments, and overall credit ratings. Certain unobservable inputs are assessed through review of contract terms (for example, minimum crediting rate, duration or payout date) while others are substantiated utilizing available market data (for example, discount rate).

There were no assets in the Plan at September 30, 2022.

Purchases and sales of the Plan's level 3 investments during the period ending September 30, 2022 and the year ending December 31, 2021 were both \$0. There were no transfers into or out of level 3 investments during the period.

**D. TAX STATUS:**

The Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated September 19, 2016 that the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been recorded in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

E. PLAN TERMINATION:

On December 10, 2021 the Company elected to terminate the Plan. The Plan's assets will be allocated, as prescribed by ERISA and its regulations, generally to provide the following benefits in the order indicated:

1. Costs for participants who have been receiving benefits or who have been eligible to receive benefits upon normal or late retirement.
2. Costs for participants who are vested but have not reached retirement age as of the termination.
3. Costs for participants who if they would have continued employment would have become vested.
4. Costs for any other remaining benefits.

Certain benefits under the Plan are insured by the PBGC upon termination of the Plan. Generally, the PBGC guarantees most vested normal age retirement benefits, early retirement benefits, and certain disability and survivors' pensions. Vested benefits under the Plan are guaranteed at the level in effect on the date of the Plan's termination. However, the PBGC does not guarantee all types of benefits under the Plan and the amount of benefit protection is subject to certain limitations. Also, there is a statutory ceiling on the amount of an individual's monthly benefit that the PBGC guarantees.

Whether or not all participants will receive their benefits in whole or in part upon plan termination will depend on the sufficiency, at that time, of the Plan's net assets to provide those benefits, and may also depend on the financial condition of the plan sponsor and the level of benefits guaranteed by the PBGC.

On June 30, 2022 the Plan entered into an annuity contract with Mutual of Omaha to assume responsibility for the amounts owed to annuitant participants that are receiving a benefit from the Plan and deferred vested participants who will receive a benefit upon reaching retirement age. The Plan paid \$11,783,134 to Mutual of Omaha and Mutual of Omaha assumed responsibility for the annuity payments commencing June 30, 2022 and future annuity payments. The final payment to Mutual of Omaha was made on August 19, 2022.

F. CERTIFIED INVESTMENTS:

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedules, including investments and held at September 30, 2022 and December 31, 2021, and net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments and interest and dividends for the period ended September 30, 2022, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by John Hancock Trust Company, LLC, the trustee of the Plan.

G. PARTY-IN INTEREST TRANSACTIONS:

Certain plan investments are managed by the trustee of the Plan and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest. Expenses paid to the trustee, or its affiliates, by the Plan qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

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H. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES:

The Plan's investments are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the values of investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term would materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Contributions and the actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits are based on certain assumptions pertaining to interest rates and employee demographics. Due to the changing nature of these assumptions, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the assumptions will occur in the near term and, due to the uncertainties inherent in setting assumptions, that the effect of such changes could be material to the financial statements.

I. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS:

The Company has evaluated subsequent events through July 10, 2023, the date these financial statements were available for issuance.

## Actuarial cost method

### Funding target and target normal cost

An actuarial cost method allocates the expected cost of a pension plan on a year-by-year basis. The primary objective is to accumulate enough assets prior to each participant's retirement to provide the promised pension benefits.

The Pension Protection Act of 2006 (PPA) requires plan sponsors to use the Traditional Unit Credit actuarial cost method in which the estimated accrued benefit is based on service and, if applicable, earnings as of the valuation date. The funding target is equal to the actuarial present value of all accrued benefits as of the valuation date. The target normal cost is the actuarial present value, as of the valuation date, of the expected increases in projected accrued benefits attributable to service expected to be completed during the plan year (i.e., if applicable, one year's salary growth is reflected in the determination of target normal cost).

For tax deduction purposes, the funding target may reflect the value of future pay increases on accrued benefits, if applicable.

### PPA discounting method

The plan sponsor must choose between full yield curve spot rates or a segmented yield curve of 24-month average corporate bond rates. If the segmented yield curve is selected, the plan sponsor can use either the rates as of the month of the valuation or as of a lookback month, up to 4 months prior to the valuation date. If the full yield curve is selected, the rates as of the month of valuation must be used.

For purposes of this valuation, the following discounting method was used and is assumed to be approved by the plan sponsor:

**Segment rates through the month of December preceding the valuation date, adjusted so each segment rate is no less than the applicable minimum percentage\* of the corresponding 25-year average segment rate for the calendar year that contains the first day of the plan year and no more than the applicable maximum percentage\*\* of that 25-year average segment rate. The 25-year average cannot be less than 5.0% prior to application of the corridor.**

### Asset valuation method

Plan assets for purposes of this actuarial valuation are valued under the asset averaging method, including, if applicable, discounted receivable contributions. The value is equal to the average of the fair market value of assets on the valuation date and the adjusted fair market value (including expected earnings) for the two earlier annual determination dates. Expected earnings are calculated using a rate no greater than the third segment rate of the segmented yield-curve in effect at the beginning of each valuation year. The resulting average value must be fall between 90 and 110 percent of the fair market value of assets on the valuation date.

\* Minimum is 95% through 2030, decreasing 5% per year beginning in 2031 until 70% is reached in 2035

\*\* Maximum is 105% through 2030 and increasing 5% per year beginning in 2031 until 130% is reached in 2035
