Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit for the 2022 Financial Statements

Emphasis of Matter

As described in Note 6 to the financial statements, the Plan assets were merged into Legacy Partners, LLC 401(k) Plan effective September 8, 2022. In accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, the Plan has changed its basis of accounting from ongoing Plan basis used in presenting the 2021 financial statements to the liquidation basis used in preparing the 2022 financial statements.

Auditor's Report on Compiled 2021 Financial Statements

Plan management is responsible for the accompanying financial statement of Ark Management 401(k) Plan, which comprises the statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2021. We have performed a compilation engagement in accordance with Statements on Standards for Accounting and Review Services promulgated by the Accounting and Review Services committee of the AICPA. We did not audit or review the financial statement nor were we required to perform any procedures to verify the accuracy or completeness of the information provided by Plan management. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion, a conclusion, or provide any form of assurance on the financial statement.

Note 1 DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Ark Management 401(k) Plan (the Plan) established by Ark Management Services, LLC (the Company) provides only general information. Effective December 20, 2021, the Plan changed its name to Ark Management 401(k) Plan from Blue Ox 401(k) Plan. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement and its amendments for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

GENERAL

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of the Company and its wholly owned subsidiaries who are 18 or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

On May 18, 2022, plan participants were notified that the Plan would merge into Legacy Partners, LLC 401(k) Plan effective September 8, 2022. See further discussion in Note 6.

CONTRIBUTIONS

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100 percent of eligible compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Company may make a discretionary matching contribution or non-discretionary contributions. Effective April 1, 2022, the Company made discretionary matching contributions equal to 50 percent of the first 6 percent of eligible compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. Additional non-elective contribution amounts may be contributed at the Company's option. There were no additional contributions made during 2022. Non-union participants are eligible for Company contributions upon 6 months of service. Contributions are subject to certain IRS limitations.

PARTICIPANT ACCOUNTS

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and the Company's matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Company's non-elective contributions and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

VESTING

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings on the contributions. Vesting in the Company's matching and non-elective contribution portion of their accounts are based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100 percent vested after six years of credited service.

NOTES RECEIVABLE FROM PARTICIPANTS

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate on all notes receivable is set at 2 percent above the prime rate, as defined. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

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PAYMENT OF BENEFITS

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount or annual installments equal to the value of the participants account. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump sum distribution. Distributions may also be made in the form of hardship withdrawals from voluntary contributions, excluding investment earnings, subject to certain limitations.

FORFEITED ACCOUNTS

On September 8, 2022 and December 31, 2021, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$0 and \$1,750, respectively. These accounts are used to pay Plan expenses and reduce future Company contributions. The forfeitures were transferred with the net assets. No forfeitures were used during 2022.

Note 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the liquidation basis of accounting as of September 8, 2022, and on the ongoing basis of account as of December 31, 2021.

USE OF ESTIMATES

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

INVESTMENT VALUATION AND INCOME RECOGNITION

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

NOTES RECEIVABLE FROM PARTICIPANTS

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of September 8, 2022 and December 31, 2021.

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PAYMENT OF BENEFITS

Benefits are recorded when paid.

EXPENSES

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Investment-related expenses are included in net depreciation in fair value of investments.

SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Plan management has evaluated subsequent events through July 17, 2023, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 CERTIFIED INVESTMENTS

Certain information related to investments and notes receivables from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements, including investments and notes receivables from participants held at September 8, 2022 and December 31, 2021, and net depreciation in fair value of investments, and interest and dividends for the period from January 1, 2022 to September 8, 2022, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by VOYA Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (VOYA) (the trustee of the Plan) and Dubuque Bank & Trust Co. (the Asset Custodian of the Plan).

Note 4 FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Plan can access at the measurement date.

Level 2 - Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs that are unobservable inputs for the asset or liability.

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Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at September 8, 2022 and December 31, 2021.

Pooled Separate Accounts: Valued using net asset value per share as a practical expedient. Stated at the corresponding unit value of the pooled separate account. The estimated fair value of separate account assets are based on the fair value of the underlying assets owned by the separate account and generally based on observable valuation inputs.

Investment Contract with Insurance Company: The credited rate is communicated to the plan and credited daily. Any market value adjustment or contract surrender charge will be based on the formulas and schedules in the contract.

Note 5 RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain plan investments are managed by VOYA, and Heartland Retirement Plan Services, the record keepers of the Plan, and VOYA and Dubuque Bank & Trust Co., the assets custodians as defined by the Plan, and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net depreciation in fair value of investments, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than direct payment. As described in Note 1, the Plan made direct payments in 2022 to a third party administrator of \$675, which were not covered by revenue sharing. The Company pays directly any other fees related to the Plan's operations.

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Note 6 PLAN TERMINATION

On May 18, 2022, Plan participants were notified that the Plan would be terminated and merged into Legacy Partners, LLC 401(k) Plan effective September 8, 2022, due to the sale of the Company. All participants became fully vested upon termination. All participants' accounts were transferred on September 8, 2022.

Note 7 TAX STATUS

The IRS has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated June 30, 2020 that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with depreciation requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 8 RISK AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
