INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Trustees of
Nebraska Humane Society 401(K) Savings Plan:

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Nebraska Humane Society 401(k) Savings Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for plan benefits as of September 22, 2022 (in liquidation) and December 31, 2021, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for plan benefits for the period ended September 22, 2022 (in liquidation), and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits for Nebraska Humane Society 401(k) Savings Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of September 22, 2022 and December 31, 2021 and for the period ending September 22, 2022, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Nebraska Humane Society 401(k) Savings Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Emphasis of Matter – Plan Termination and Liquidation Basis of Accounting

As further discussed in Note 5 to the financial statements, the Organization of Nebraska Humane Society 401(k) Savings Plan determined by resolution that the Plan should be terminated effective July 1, 2022 (the Plan's termination date). As a result, the Nebraska Humane Society 401(k) Savings Plan changed its basis of accounting from going-concern basis of accounting used in presenting the 2021 financial statement to the liquidation basis of accounting used in presenting the financial statements as of and for the period ending September 22, 2022. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of Nebraska Humane Society 401(k) Savings Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audits.

1. Description of the Plan and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies:

The following brief description of Nebraska Humane Society 401(K) Savings Plan (the Plan) is provided for general informational purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was established effective January 1, 2007, and amended and restated effective February 1, 2015. The Plan is a defined contribution plan subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan is available to all employees of Nebraska Humane Society (the Organization) who are 21 years of age and have completed 60 days of service. The Organization established the Plan under the Principal Financial Group Prototype for Savings Plans.

Effective as of January 1, 2020, the Plan adopted a plan amendment pursuant to changes contained in the Bipartisan Budget Act of 2018. The final regulations of this act require plans to eliminate the six month suspension of contributions following a hardship distribution, expand the sources available for a hardship distribution, and add a new type of hardship expense for losses related to a federally declared disaster. In addition, it is no longer a requirement to take a loan before taking a hardship withdrawal.

As of April 20, 2020, the Plan adopted the following provisions of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act (CARES Act):

- Loan limits increased to 100% of the participant's vested account balance or \$100,000.
- Loan payments due from March 27, 2020 through December 31, 2020 may be delayed for one year.
- Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) for 2020 are suspended unless a participant or beneficiary elects to receive such distribution or take any other distribution in 2020.
- Qualified individuals may take a coronavirus-related distribution provided the aggregate amount of the coronavirus-related distribution received by the qualified individual does not exceed \$100,000. These coronavirus-related distributions may be made after January 1, 2020 and before December 31, 2020. The coronavirus-related distributions may be repaid to the Plan in the form of rollovers contributions during the three consecutive years following the distribution.

Effective as of February 17, 2022, the Plan completed a restatement of existing Plan by adopting the adoption agreement together with the Principal Financial Group Pre-Approved Document Basic Savings Plan. This restatement updated the Plan to incorporate provisions of the SECURE Act and the CARE Act that have impacted the Plan and bring the Plan up to date.

General, Continued

The Organization determined by resolution to terminate the Plan effective July 1, 2022 (the Plan's termination date). As a result, the Plan changed its basis of accounting from going-concern basis of account used in presenting the 2021 financial statement to the liquidation basis of accounting used in presenting the financial statements as of and for the period ending September 22, 2022. Participants had the opportunity to elect to have their distributions paid to them directly or to an eligible retirement plan in a direct rollover. Current employees had the option to transfer their existing account balance to the successor plan. All distributions were completed by September 22, 2022.

Plan Administration

The Organization serves as the plan trustee and plan administrator.

Administration Fees, and Other

The Plan's expenses are paid either by the Plan or the Organization, as provided by the plan document. Expenses that are paid directly by the Organization are excluded from these financial statements. Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan that are paid by the Plan are recorded as deductions in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for plan benefits. In addition, certain investment related expenses are included in net appreciation(depreciation) in fair value of investments presented in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for plan benefits.

Contributions

The Plan allows participants to contribute an amount up to Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations of their annual compensation through compensation deferrals in addition to a maximum of an additional catch-up deferral up to IRC limitations for qualified individuals. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investments options offered by the Plan. These compensation deferral contributions are fully vested and nonforfeitable. The Plan allows for Organization matching of 100% of 3% of the participant's compensation. It is a discretionary match and is reviewed each year. The matching contribution is invested into participant directed investment options.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Organization's contribution and (b) Plan earnings. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

1. Description of the Plan and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies, Continued:

Investments

Participants direct all employee and employer contributions into the various investment options. Participants may change their investment options directly through their online access to the custodian's website.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their compensation deferral contributions and the earnings thereon. Participants are fully vested in the employer contributions after the third plan year. Upon termination of the Plan, all participants were fully vested in their account balance.

Loans Receivable from Participants

Prior to April 20, 2020, participants are allowed to borrow from the Plan amounts not to exceed the lesser of 50 percent of the participant's account balance or \$50,000 reduced by the excess, if any, of the highest outstanding balance of loans from the Plan during the one year period prior to the date of the loan over the current outstanding balance. If a participant lives in an area affected by a natural disaster, Federal relief laws may change the maximum amount available for a loan. As of April 20, 2020, The Plan increased the loan limit to not exceed 100% of the participant's vested account balance or \$100,000 as part of the CARES Act provisions. The minimum loan allowed is \$1,000. All borrowings are secured by the balance in the participant's account. No more than one loan may be outstanding for a participant at any given time. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Loans to participants are reported at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued and unpaid interest. The interest rate is based on the Prime Rate (as published by The Wall Street Journal) plus 2 percent.

According to the Plan termination, current employees had the option to transfer their existing account balance and loan balance into the successor plan.

Payment of Benefits

Except for certain withdrawal rights under the Plan, distributions of Plan benefits are made commencing no earlier than the participant's retirement, death, disability, termination of employment, or financial hardship. Benefits are recorded when paid. Hardship withdrawals are permitted for medical expenses, purchase of a principal residence, tuition and related education expenses, prevention of eviction, funeral expenses, damage to a participant's residence, or expenses related to a federal declared disaster. The Plan does not require a six-month suspension of contributions following a hardship distribution.

Payment of Benefits, Continued

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) was signed into law on March 27, 2020 and the Plan adopted the CARES Act provisions on April 20, 2020. The final regulations allow for participants to take up to \$100,000 in Coronavirus related distributions that are not subject to early withdrawal penalty.

Eligible CARES Act distributions were permitted from January 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020. Participants were required to self-certify they qualified for the distributions under the CARES Act. Participants are permitted to repay the distributions back to the Plan in the form of rollovers during the three consecutive years following the distribution. As of April 20, 2020 the Plan adopted the provisions of the CARES Act.

The Organization determined by resolution to terminate the Plan effective July 1, 2022 (the Plan's termination date). During the Plan year ending September 22, 2022, the Plan distributed to the participants all remaining account balances pursuant to the termination of the Plan. All such distributions were made in the form of a single sum payment. Participants had the opportunity to elect to have their single sum distribution paid to them or to an eligible retirement plan in a direct rollover. All Plan assets were to be distributed no later than 12 months after the Plan's termination date and all Plan assets were distributed by September 22, 2022. Upon complete distribution of all Plan assets on September 22, 2022, the Trust Fund relating to the Plan ceased to exist and the Plan thereupon terminated. The account of each participant was 100% vested and nonforfeitable as of the effective date of the complete termination of the Plan. Current employees had the option to transfer their existing account balance and loan balance into the successor plan.

Custodian

The Organization has contracted with Principal Trust Company to hold the Plan's assets and execute investment transactions (Custodian).

Forfeited Accounts

At September 22, 2022, employer matching contributions were reduced by the forfeited nonvested accounts which totaled \$0. Forfeitures may first be used to pay plan expenses. Any forfeitures remaining after paying plan expenses may be used to offset employer contributions.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments held by the Plan are presented at fair value. Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors, custodians, and insurance company. See Note 3 for further discussion of Plan investments and fair value methodologies.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition, Continued

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend dated. Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gain and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Basis of Accounting

The Organization determined by resolution that the Nebraska Humane Society 401(k) Savings Plan should be terminated effective July 1, 2022 (the Plan's termination date). As a result, the Plan changed its basis of accounting from going-concern basis of accounting used in presenting the 2021 financial statement to the liquidation basis of accounting used in presenting the financial statements as of and for the period ending September 22, 2022.

Excess Contributions

If the participant is a highly paid employee and they have made deferrals in excess of the IRC limit, then the Plan will wither restrict the amount that participant can contribute in the future or return the excess contribution over the IRC limit. If the participant is not considered a highly paid employee and their deferrals are in excess of the IRC limit, then it is the participant's responsibility to instruct the Plan by March 1 of the following year to refund any payments made during the year which were in excess of the IRC limit.

2. Income Tax Status:

The Organization has adopted the Principal Life Insurance Company Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan with CODA. In an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, the Internal Revenue Service has stated that in their opinion, the form of the Non-Standard Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan with CODA is acceptable for use by employers for the benefit of their employees under Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Section 401.

Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

2. Income Tax Status, Continued:

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The plan administrator believes the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years ended prior to December 31, 2019.

3. Fair Value Measurements:

Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) Topic 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures, establishes a framework for measuring fair value and expands disclosures about fair value measurements. Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (i.e., an exit price). ASC Topic 820 includes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC Topic 820 are described below:

Level 1 - Valuation is based on quoted prices in active markets for identical securities.

Level 2 - Valuation is based upon other significant observable inputs such as quoted prices for similar assets or quoted prices in markets that are not active.

Level 3 - Valuation is based on significant unobservable inputs (i.e., supported by little or no market activity). Level 3 inputs include the Organization's own assumption about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the securities (including assumptions about risk).

The level in the fair value hierarchy within which the fair value measurement is classified is determined based on the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measure in its entirety.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

Pooled Separate Accounts - The Pooled Separate Accounts are valued at net asset value which is based on the latest quoted market price of the investments held within the fund.

Collective Investment Trusts - The Collective Investment are valued at net asset value which is based on the latest quoted market price of the investments held within the fund.

Registered Investment Companies - Registered Investment Companies consist of mutual funds. The fair value of the mutual funds is based on quoted net asset values of the shares held by the Plan as of year-end.

5. Plan Termination:

The Organization has determined by resolution that the Plan should be terminated effective July 1, 2022 (the Plan's termination date). During the Plan year ending September 22, 2022, the Plan distributed to the participants all remaining account balances pursuant to the termination of the Plan. All such distributions were made in the form of a single sum payment. Participants had the opportunity to elect to have their single sum distribution paid to them or to an eligible retirement plan in a direct rollover. All Plan assets were distributed by September 22, 2022. Upon complete distribution of all Plan assets on September 22, 2022, the Trust Fund relating to the Plan ceased to exist and the Plan thereupon terminated. The account of each participant was 100% vested and nonforfeitable as of the effective date of the complete termination of the Plan. Current employees had the option to transfer their existing account balance and loan balance into the successor plan.

6. Exempt Party-in-Interest Transactions:

The Plan holds various investments managed by Principal Trust Company. Principal Trust Company is the custodian of the Plan; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Plan paid administration fees to Principal Trust Company of \$8,270 for the period ended September 22, 2022. These expenses were included in administration fees, and other on the statement of changes in net assets available for plan benefits.

These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transactions rules under ERISA.

7. Risks and Uncertainties:

The Plan invests in various investment securities, primarily mutual funds. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

The COVID-19 (coronavirus) outbreak continues to prompt global health concerns. Consequently, it is possible that the Plan and Organization could be impacted by the resulting volatility in the economy beyond the financial statements date. Specifically, the Plan could see more hardship benefit payments, decrease in employee or employer contributions, and or fluctuations in the market value of the investments.

8. Subsequent Events:

Subsequent events have been evaluated through July 17, 2023, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
