Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Jesse Engineering Co. Employee Profit Sharing/Savings Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of October 31, 2022 and December 31, 2021, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the ten months ended October 31, 2022, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of October 31, 2022 and December 31, 2021, and for the ten months ended October 31, 2022, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Emphasis of Matter

As discussed in Note 1 to the financial statements, the Plan merged into the Ekstra 401(k) Multiple Employer Plan at October 31, 2022. Plan assets were transferred to this Plan on October 31, 2022. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

NOTE 1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the Jesse Engineering Co. Employee Profit Sharing/Savings Plan (the Plan), provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

General:

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of Jesse Engineering Company (the Sponsor). Employees become eligible to participate in the Plan immediately following their date of hire. All employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement are not eligible to participate in the Plan.

Plan Merger:

Effective October 31, 2022, the plan merged into the Ekstra 401(k) Multiple Employer Plan by executing a participation agreement as an adopting employer. All Plan assets were transferred on October 31, 2022 and participants of the Plan were immediately eligible to participate in the new Ekstra 401(k) Plan.

Contributions:

Each participant may contribute up to 100 percent of their annual compensation as defined in the Plan agreement, but limited to maximum amounts allowed by law. Participant contributions may be made as pre-tax or Roth elective deferrals. The amount of the employer contribution will be determined by Jesse Engineering Company. For 2022, the Sponsors' officials and representatives for the manufacturing employees agreed on an hourly rate of contribution of \$1.50.

Participant Accounts and Investment Options:

Contributions to participant accounts are deposited into participant-directed funds and self-directed brokerage accounts at Nationwide Trust Company (Nationwide). Within the participant-directed accounts, participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Sponsor periodically reviews the investment fund options available to participants and drops or adds investment funds as warranted.

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, and allocation of the Sponsor contribution and Plan earnings. Allocations are based on participant hours of service or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Notes Receivable from Participants:

Participants may borrow from their accounts a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. Loan transactions are treated as a transfer between investment funds and the participant loan fund. Loan terms range from one to five years, or more if for the purchase of primary residence. The loans are secured by the balance in the participants account and bear interest at 1 percent over prime rate at the time of loan initiation. Interest rates range from 4.5 to 7.25 percent at October 31, 2022. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Vesting:

All participants are 100 percent vested in their accounts.

Payment of Benefits:

On termination of service, a participant whose vested account balance is over \$5,000 may elect to leave the vested account balance invested in the Plan or receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of his or her account. A participant whose vested account balance is below \$5,000 will receive a lump-sum payment as soon as administratively possible. Upon death, a beneficiary will receive 100 percent of the account balance.

Additionally, for participants reaching age 59½ or requesting a hardship withdrawal, in-service withdrawals are allowed.

NOTE 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Presentation:

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America and present the net assets available for Plan benefits and the changes in those net assets.

Use of Estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of additions and deductions of net assets available for benefits during the reporting period. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Notes Receivable from Participants:

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance, plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition:

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are stated at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. See Notes 5 and 6 for discussion of fair value measurements and contract value investments, respectively.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income, if any, is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends, if any, are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits:

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative and Investment Management Expenses:

The Plan's expenses are paid either by the Plan or the Plan Sponsor, as determined by the trustees, plan document, or service provider agreements. Expenses that are paid directly by the Plan Sponsor are excluded from these financial statements and are not intended to be reimbursed by the Plan. Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan that are paid by the Plan are recorded as deductions in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. In addition, certain investment related expenses are included in net appreciation or depreciation of fair value of investments presented in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Date Through Which Subsequent Events Evaluated:

The date to which events occurring after October 31, 2022, the date of the most recent statement of net assets available for benefits, have been evaluated for possible adjustments to the financial statements or disclosure is August 11, 2023, which is the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3. Risk and Uncertainties

The Plan is exposed to market and credit risk due to the various foreign and domestic investment securities that may be selected by the participant in any combination. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as foreign currency exchange rate, interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant's account balance and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 5. Fair Value Measurements

FASB ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the techniques and inputs used at October 31, 2022 and December 31, 2021.

Mutual and Money Funds: Generally valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the funds are traded. However, mutual funds held by Nationwide Trust Company are reported in unit values, a method for valuing accounts that are not the same as the net asset value reported by the fund house. While the resulting unit value is not the same as the daily price reported by the fund house, the financial trend should be the same, and is considered equivalent to net asset value. In accordance with Subtopic 820-10, certain investments that were measured at net asset value per share (or its equivalent) have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy. The fair value amounts presented in this table are intended to permit reconciliation of the fair value hierarchy to the line items in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Self-Directed Brokerage Accounts: Accounts primarily consist of investments in mutual and money funds that are valued on the basis of readily determinable market prices.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation techniques and inputs are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different techniques and inputs or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 6. Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contract

The Plan holds a traditional investment contract. This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria, and is therefore reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses.

The traditional investment contract held by the Plan is a guaranteed investment contract. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer. The crediting rate is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The contract has no scheduled maturity date.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer. Examples of such events include the following:

1. The Plan's failure to qualify under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code
2. Changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options
3. Partial or total Plan termination or merger
4. Changes to the Plan Sponsor, including significant layoffs, spin-offs, or divestitures that significantly affect the Plan's normal operations

No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants. The Plan must notify the issuer at least 30 days prior to any such event.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contracts with the Plan and settle at an amount different from the contract value. Examples of such events include the following:

1. The contract owner's failure to abide by state or federal law
2. A breach of material obligation under the contract
3. A material misrepresentation
4. A material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the contract issuer

The Contract allows the issuer to terminate the contract within 90 days written notice. The contract will continue in force until the later of: the day the fund is exhausted by withdrawals; no further annuity payments are payable; or if twelve months following the issue date of the contract, no deposits have been made to the contract.

NOTE 7. Party-in-Interest Transactions and Administration of Plan Assets

A party-in-interest is defined as a fiduciary or employee of the Plan, any person who provides service to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50 percent or more of such an employer or employee organization, or a relative of such persons mentioned.

The Plan's investment options are held in self-directed brokerage and participant directed accounts at Nationwide, the Custodian of the Plan; therefore, any transaction executed with Nationwide qualifies as a party-in-interest transaction.

As described in Note 2, the Plan paid certain expenses related to Plan operations and investment activities to various service providers. These transactions are party-in-interest transactions.

The Plan Sponsor, Jesse Engineering Company, is a party-in-interest. Certain administrative functions are performed by employees of the Sponsor. No such employee receives compensation from the Plan. The Sponsor has the discretion to appoint or remove any trustee or agent of the Plan. The Trustees have the full power to administer the Plan and apply all of its provisions on behalf of the Sponsor.

NOTE 8. Tax Status

The Plan has adopted a defined contribution volume submitter profit sharing plan with CODA sponsored by Definiti, LLC (formerly Panagiotu Pension Advisors, Inc.), which received a favorable opinion letter on September 30, 2014. Although the opinion letter is not specific to the Plan, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and is currently being operated in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code; therefore, they believe that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

Management evaluated the Plan's tax positions and concluded that the Plan has maintained its tax-exempt status and has taken no material uncertain tax positions that require adjustments to the financial statements. Therefore, no provision or liability for income taxes has been included in the financial statements.
