### Notes to Financial Statements For the Year Ended December 31, 2022

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#### Note 1 - Plan Description

The following description of the Seattle Children's Healthcare System Employees' Retirement Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. More complete information regarding the Plan's provisions may be found in the plan document.

**General** - The Plan is a defined contribution plan established by Seattle Children's Healthcare System (the Company) under the provisions of Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (the IRC). Eligible employees of the Company and certain affiliates may participate in the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

**Eligibility** - Employees are eligible to participate in the employee deferral and employer matching portion of the Plan after completion of 45 days of employment with the Company. Employees are eligible to receive employer discretionary nonelective contributions after completing 12 consecutive months of employment with the Company.

**Contributions** - Nonhighly compensated participants may elect to defer up to 75% of their eligible compensation as pretax or Roth contributions. Highly compensated employees may elect to defer up to 6% of their eligible compensation as pretax or Roth contributions. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other eligible retirement plans (rollover). The Plan includes a provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled at a 6% deferral rate unless they elect a different deferral rate or not to participate in the Plan. Nonhighly compensated participants that are automatically enrolled will have their deferral rate increase by 1% each year, up to a maximum of 10%, unless otherwise elected.

The Company makes matching contributions equal to 25% of the first 6% of eligible compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. Effective January 1, 2023, the matching contribution was increased to equal 35% of the first 6% of eligible compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. The Company may also make discretionary nonelective contributions. For 2022, the discretionary nonelective contribution was set at 4% of eligible compensation for eligible participants who had completed fewer than five years of service and 6% of eligible compensation for eligible participants who had completed five or more years of service. Participants must complete 1,000 hours of service during the plan year and be employed on the last day of the plan year to be eligible for discretionary nonelective contributions. Discretionary nonelective contributions are earned annually on December 31 and are funded in the first pay period of the following calendar year. The last day rule is waived if the participant terminates employment due to death, disability or reaching normal retirement age (65).

Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

**Vesting and Forfeitures** - Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested in employer matching and discretionary contributions and earnings thereon after 3 years of credited service with no partial vesting prior to three years of vested service.

At December 31, 2022 and 2021, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled approximately \$108,000 and \$101,000, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions or pay administrative expenses of the Plan. During 2022, employer contributions were reduced by approximately \$646,000 from forfeited nonvested accounts.

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#### Note 1 - Continued

**Plan Administration** - The Plan is administered by the Retirement Administrative Committee of the Company. Fidelity Management Trust Company (Fidelity) and Fidelity Workplace Services are the trustee and record keeper of the Plan, respectively.

**Participant Accounts** - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Company's discretionary nonelective contributions (if any) and plan earnings or losses. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Participants direct the investment of their account into various investment options offered by the Plan.

**Payment of Benefits** - Upon termination of service, retirement, death, or disability, a participant or beneficiary may elect to receive a lump-sum distribution equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account. Participants who have attained age 59 ½ may also elect to receive a distribution of all or any portion of their account balance prior to termination of employment (in-service withdrawals). The Plan allows for hardship withdrawals in accordance with provisions specified in the plan document. Participants may also elect to receive in-service withdrawals from balances rolled into the Plan. Terminated participants with a vested account balance of \$1,000 or less will receive an automatic lump sum distribution of their vested account distributed to them or their beneficiaries.

**Notes Receivable From Participants** - Active participants may borrow the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested balance, with a minimum loan of \$1,000. Loans are repayable through payroll deductions over periods ranging up to five years unless the loan is used to acquire a principal residence in which case the loan term may not exceed ten years. Loans are secured by the vested balance of the participants' accounts. The interest rate is determined by the plan administrator based on the Federal Reserve Board prime rate plus 1% and is fixed over the life of the note.

**Investment Management and Administrative Expenses** - Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Transaction based fees for notes receivable from participants and distributions are charged directly to participant accounts. Certain investment related expenses are charged directly against the fund's investment performance and, therefore, are not separately disclosed in the accompanying financial statements.

**Risks and Uncertainties** - The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Market risks include global events such as a pandemic or international conflict which could impact the value of investment securities. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

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#### Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

**Basis of Accounting and Use of Estimates** - The accompanying financial statements are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting. The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition** - Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements. Purchases and sales are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

**Notes Receivable From Participants** - Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance. Accrued but unpaid interest, if any, would not have a material impact on the Plan's financial statements. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2022 and 2021.

**Payment of Benefits** - Benefits are recorded when paid.

#### Note 3 - Fair Value Measurements

GAAP provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

Level 1 - Unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets, quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets, inputs other than the quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability, and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability. Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

Level 3 - Unobservable inputs that are significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based upon the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

**Note 3 - Continued**

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2022 and 2021.

Registered Investment Company Funds - Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Registered investment company funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Collective Trust Fund - Valued at the NAV provided by the fund's trustee. The fund calculates NAV in a manner consistent with the measurement principles applicable to investment companies under GAAP. The fund trades on a regular basis, has a published price that the Plan can obtain at any time and is valued based on this published price.

Self-Directed Brokerage Accounts - Accounts primarily consist of registered investment company funds, common stocks, and cash. Registered investment company funds are valued as described above. Common stocks are valued at quoted market prices in active markets. Cash is valued at cost plus accrued interest which approximates fair value.

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#### **Note 4 - Tax Status**

The IRS has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated June 30, 2023, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2022, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

#### **Note 5 - Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become fully vested in their account balances.

#### **Note 6 - Certified Information**

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Investments held at December 31, 2022 and 2021, and investment income or loss for the year ended December 31, 2022, that is disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplementary information, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Fidelity Management Trust Company. The Plan's independent accountants did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplementary information.

#### **Note 7 - Party-in-Interest Transactions**

Certain plan investments are managed by Fidelity and its affiliates. Fidelity is the trustee for the Plan and, therefore, transactions with such investments are party-in-interest transactions. The Plan pays certain expenses related to plan operations to various service providers and also issues loans to participants. These transactions are party-in-interest transactions.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

## **Other Matter - Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA**

The supplementary information, as listed in the accompanying table of contents, is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplementary information, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplementary information that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplementary information, we evaluated whether the supplementary information, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, are presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion:

- The form and content of the supplementary information, other than the information in the supplementary information that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, is presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- The certified investment information in the supplementary information agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by a qualified institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

### Notes to Financial Statements For the Year Ended December 31, 2022

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#### Note 1 - Plan Description

The following description of the Seattle Children's Healthcare System Employees' Retirement Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. More complete information regarding the Plan's provisions may be found in the plan document.

**General** - The Plan is a defined contribution plan established by Seattle Children's Healthcare System (the Company) under the provisions of Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (the IRC). Eligible employees of the Company and certain affiliates may participate in the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

**Eligibility** - Employees are eligible to participate in the employee deferral and employer matching portion of the Plan after completion of 45 days of employment with the Company. Employees are eligible to receive employer discretionary nonelective contributions after completing 12 consecutive months of employment with the Company.

**Contributions** - Nonhighly compensated participants may elect to defer up to 75% of their eligible compensation as pretax or Roth contributions. Highly compensated employees may elect to defer up to 6% of their eligible compensation as pretax or Roth contributions. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other eligible retirement plans (rollover). The Plan includes a provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled at a 6% deferral rate unless they elect a different deferral rate or not to participate in the Plan. Nonhighly compensated participants that are automatically enrolled will have their deferral rate increase by 1% each year, up to a maximum of 10%, unless otherwise elected.

The Company makes matching contributions equal to 25% of the first 6% of eligible compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. Effective January 1, 2023, the matching contribution was increased to equal 35% of the first 6% of eligible compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. The Company may also make discretionary nonelective contributions. For 2022, the discretionary nonelective contribution was set at 4% of eligible compensation for eligible participants who had completed fewer than five years of service and 6% of eligible compensation for eligible participants who had completed five or more years of service. Participants must complete 1,000 hours of service during the plan year and be employed on the last day of the plan year to be eligible for discretionary nonelective contributions. Discretionary nonelective contributions are earned annually on December 31 and are funded in the first pay period of the following calendar year. The last day rule is waived if the participant terminates employment due to death, disability or reaching normal retirement age (65).

Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

**Vesting and Forfeitures** - Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested in employer matching and discretionary contributions and earnings thereon after 3 years of credited service with no partial vesting prior to three years of vested service.

At December 31, 2022 and 2021, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled approximately \$108,000 and \$101,000, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions or pay administrative expenses of the Plan. During 2022, employer contributions were reduced by approximately \$646,000 from forfeited nonvested accounts.

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#### Note 1 - Continued

**Plan Administration** - The Plan is administered by the Retirement Administrative Committee of the Company. Fidelity Management Trust Company (Fidelity) and Fidelity Workplace Services are the trustee and record keeper of the Plan, respectively.

**Participant Accounts** - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Company's discretionary nonelective contributions (if any) and plan earnings or losses. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Participants direct the investment of their account into various investment options offered by the Plan.

**Payment of Benefits** - Upon termination of service, retirement, death, or disability, a participant or beneficiary may elect to receive a lump-sum distribution equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account. Participants who have attained age 59 ½ may also elect to receive a distribution of all or any portion of their account balance prior to termination of employment (in-service withdrawals). The Plan allows for hardship withdrawals in accordance with provisions specified in the plan document. Participants may also elect to receive in-service withdrawals from balances rolled into the Plan. Terminated participants with a vested account balance of \$1,000 or less will receive an automatic lump sum distribution of their vested account distributed to them or their beneficiaries.

**Notes Receivable From Participants** - Active participants may borrow the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested balance, with a minimum loan of \$1,000. Loans are repayable through payroll deductions over periods ranging up to five years unless the loan is used to acquire a principal residence in which case the loan term may not exceed ten years. Loans are secured by the vested balance of the participants' accounts. The interest rate is determined by the plan administrator based on the Federal Reserve Board prime rate plus 1% and is fixed over the life of the note.

**Investment Management and Administrative Expenses** - Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Transaction based fees for notes receivable from participants and distributions are charged directly to participant accounts. Certain investment related expenses are charged directly against the fund's investment performance and, therefore, are not separately disclosed in the accompanying financial statements.

**Risks and Uncertainties** - The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Market risks include global events such as a pandemic or international conflict which could impact the value of investment securities. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

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#### Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

**Basis of Accounting and Use of Estimates** - The accompanying financial statements are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting. The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition** - Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements. Purchases and sales are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

**Notes Receivable From Participants** - Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance. Accrued but unpaid interest, if any, would not have a material impact on the Plan's financial statements. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2022 and 2021.

**Payment of Benefits** - Benefits are recorded when paid.

#### Note 3 - Fair Value Measurements

GAAP provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

Level 1 - Unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets, quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets, inputs other than the quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability, and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability. Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

Level 3 - Unobservable inputs that are significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based upon the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

**Note 3 - Continued**

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2022 and 2021.

Registered Investment Company Funds - Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Registered investment company funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Collective Trust Fund - Valued at the NAV provided by the fund's trustee. The fund calculates NAV in a manner consistent with the measurement principles applicable to investment companies under GAAP. The fund trades on a regular basis, has a published price that the Plan can obtain at any time and is valued based on this published price.

Self-Directed Brokerage Accounts - Accounts primarily consist of registered investment company funds, common stocks, and cash. Registered investment company funds are valued as described above. Common stocks are valued at quoted market prices in active markets. Cash is valued at cost plus accrued interest which approximates fair value.

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#### **Note 4 - Tax Status**

The IRS has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated June 30, 2023, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2022, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

#### **Note 5 - Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become fully vested in their account balances.

#### **Note 6 - Certified Information**

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Investments held at December 31, 2022 and 2021, and investment income or loss for the year ended December 31, 2022, that is disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplementary information, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Fidelity Management Trust Company. The Plan's independent accountants did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplementary information.

#### **Note 7 - Party-in-Interest Transactions**

Certain plan investments are managed by Fidelity and its affiliates. Fidelity is the trustee for the Plan and, therefore, transactions with such investments are party-in-interest transactions. The Plan pays certain expenses related to plan operations to various service providers and also issues loans to participants. These transactions are party-in-interest transactions.
