As discussed in Note 1 of the financial statements, effective April 1, 2022, the Plan merged into the Hachette Book Group, Inc. 401(k) Plan. As a result, all assets of the Plan have been transferred out of the Plan. Our opinion is not modified with respect to that matter.



Responsibilities of Management for the 2022 Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(c), the audit did not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan by a qualified institution, provided the information is prepared and certified to by the qualified institution in accordance with the 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Their report dated October 7, 2022, expressed an unmodified opinion on those financial statements and included another- matter paragraph that provided an opinion that the information in 2021 supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified information, including its form and content is presented in conformity with DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Notes to Financial Statements

1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Workman Publishing Company Thrift and Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

On September 23, 2021, the Plan Sponsor, Workman Publishing Co., Inc. was acquired by Hachette Book Group.

Plan Merger

Effective January 1, 2022, participants of the Plan became eligible to participate in the Hachette Book Group, Inc. 401(k) Plan. Effective April 1, 2022, the Plan was merged into the Hachette Book Group, Inc. 401(k) Plan.

General

The Plan was a defined contribution plan covering all employees of Workman Publishing Co., Inc. (the "Company"), and covered substantially all eligible employees of the Company. The Plan was intended to satisfy all the requirements for a qualified retirement plan under the appropriate provisions of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

Eligibility

The Plan covered all salaried employees who met the eligibility requirements, as defined, and who elected to participate. The Plan admitted new entrants who had at least six months of credited service on January 1, April 1, July 1 and October 1 of each Plan year.

Contributions

Under the Plan, an employee could make pretax and Roth contributions of up to 50% of base compensation, and the Company made matching contributions of 100% of employee contributions up to a maximum of \$4,000 per employee, subject to IRC limitations. Participants who were age 50 or older before the close of the plan year could elect to make catch-up contributions, subject to IRC limitations. Participants could also make eligible rollover contributions from other qualified plans.

The Plan provided for matching contributions of 100% of participant contributions up to \$4,000. The Plan also provided for discretionary profit-sharing contributions. There were no matching or discretionary profit-sharing contributions for the period from January 1, 2022 to April 1, 2022.

Payment of benefits

The Plan contained provisions for payment of benefits upon normal retirement, early retirement, termination of employment, disability and death. Withdrawals and loans under hardship circumstances were also permitted. Benefits were recorded when paid.

Participants' Accounts

Each participant's account was credited and debited with the participant's contributions and withdrawals, as applicable, and an allocation of (a) the Company's contributions and (b) Plan earnings. Allocations were based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant was entitled was the benefit that could be provided from the participant's vested account balance.

Vesting

Participants were immediately vested in all employee contributions made to their accounts, plus actual earnings thereon. Employer contributions vested 100% when an employee achieved two years of vesting service.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures were used to reduce employer contributions. As of April 1, 2022 and December 31, 2021, there were no unallocated nonvested accounts.

Investment options

The Plan provided for self-directed investment programs for individual participants in separate funds.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants could borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of 50% of their account balance or \$50,000 for terms up to five years or longer for specified reasons. Interest was charged at the prime rate plus 1%. Principal and interest were paid ratably through payroll deductions. Participants were limited to a maximum of three loans outstanding at any time. Delinquent loans were treated as distributions based on the terms of the Plan agreement.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are prepared on the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in the value of investments includes the plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid to the Plan's participants.

Administrative Expenses

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Notes receivable from participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable are treated as distributions based on the terms of the Plan agreement.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and when applicable, disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Other income

The administrative services agreement between the Plan and T. Rowe Price Trust Company (T. Rowe Price) provides that the Plan will receive a quarterly credit to the administrative budget account representing the amount that the revenue sharing payments received exceeds administrative fee payments owed (as defined in the agreement). To the extent that administrative fee payments owed exceeds revenue sharing payments received, the negative amount owed will be billed to the Plan. During the period from January 1, 2022 to April 1, 2022 and year ended December 31, 2021, \$21,909 and \$73,615, respectively, were earned by the Plan under this agreement and deposited into the Plan's administrative budget account. These funds are to be used to pay administrative expenses of the Plan and excess amounts not used are to be allocated to participants.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 12, 2023, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. Investment Certification

The investment assets of the Plan as at April 1, 2022 and December 31, 2021, were held, and all transactions for the period from January 1, 2022 to April 1, 2022 were executed by T. Rowe Price Trust Company (the "Trustee").

In accordance with the provisions of 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, the Trustee has certified as complete and accurate all the investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and the supplemental schedule. Information included in the accompanying financial statements relating to investments and income derived there from was prepared by or derived from information prepared by the Trustee of the Plan and furnished to the Company. The Company has obtained certifications from the Trustee as of April 1, 2022 and December 31, 2021 and for the period from January 1, 2022 to April 1, 2022, that such information is complete and accurate. Such information includes investments at fair value, notes receivable from participants, interest income on notes receivable from participants, dividend income, interest income on deposit account and net appreciation in fair value of investments as shown in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits and statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

4. Fair Value Measurements

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB 820 are described as follows:

- Level 1 – inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2 – inputs to the valuation methodology include: (1) quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; (2) quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; (3) inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; or (4) inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for investment assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of April 1, 2022 and December 31, 2021.

- Money market funds: Money market funds are valued at amortized cost of money market investments that mature within a relatively short period, which approximates fair value.
- Mutual funds: Mutual funds (registered investment companies) are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

5. Tax Status

On August 19, 2020, the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") stated that the prototype plan adopted by the Plan, as then designed, qualifies under 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). The Plan has not received a determination letter specific to the Plan itself; however, the plan administrator believes that the Plan was designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions, however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

6. Related Party and Party-In-Interest Transactions

T. Rowe Price Retirement Plan Services, Inc is the record keeper for the Plan and therefore, these services qualify as party-in-interest transactions. There were no fees paid to T. Rowe Price Retirement Plan Services, Inc. for record keeping and administrative services for the period from January 1, 2022 to April 1, 2022.

7. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options in mutual funds and common / collective trust funds that invest in investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term would materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.
