Notes to Financial Statements

November 14, 2022

1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the IHC Employees 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan available to eligible employees of Integrity Home Care, LLC. (the Employer) who have completed three months of service and were age 21 or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Effective November 14, 2022, the Employer elected to merge the Plan into the BAYADA Home Health Care 401(k) Plan (BAYADA Plan). As a result, Plan assets were transferred to Empower Retirement, the new recordkeeper on November 14, 2022.

The Employer is responsible for the administration of the Plan and has entrusted the maintenance of records and the day-to-day administration to TAG Resources, LLC (TAG), who processes transactions through Transamerica Financial Life Insurance Company (Transamerica), the custodian.

Contributions

Each year, participants could contribute up to 90% of their pre-tax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. In addition, participants who had attained the age of 50 before the end of the Plan year were eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants could also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollovers). Participants directed the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Participants could change the investment options previously elected at any time.

The Employer could make discretionary matching, nonelective, and qualified nonelective contributions. For 2022, the Employer made a discretionary matching contribution equal to 25% of employee's contributions up to 4% of compensation, plus 50% of employee's contributions from 4 to 6% of compensation. For 2022, the Employer did not make any discretionary nonelective or qualified nonelective contributions to the Plan.

Contributions were subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Notes to Financial Statements (continued)

1. Description of the Plan (continued)

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Employer's safe harbor matching, discretionary nonelective and qualified nonelective contributions and Plan earnings or losses. Participant accounts were charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that were paid by the Plan. Allocations were based on participant earnings, account balances or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants were immediately vested in their voluntary contributions, and discretionary qualified nonelective contributions plus actual earnings on these contributions. Vesting in the Employer's discretionary matching contribution and nonelective contribution portion of their accounts plus related earnings thereon was based on years of vesting service in which the participants complete 1,000 hours of service, as follows:

Less than 2	0%
2 but less than 3	20%
3 but less than 4	40%

5 but less than 6	80%
6 or more	100%

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants could borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans were secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate is set at 1% above the prime rate, as defined. Principal and interest were paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability or early retirement, a participant could elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Participants electing to receive benefits after the normal retirement age could choose either a lump-sum amount or annual installments. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant could receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution or roll over their account into another individual retirement account. The Plan permitted in-service and hardship withdrawals under certain conditions.

1. Description of the Plan (continued)

Forfeitures

Forfeitures were created when participants terminate employment before becoming entitled to their full benefits under the Plan and were considered nonparticipant-directed investments. Forfeitures could first be used to pay administrative expenses and then to reduce future Employer contributions. During 2022, administrative expenses were reduced by \$100, from forfeited non-vested accounts. As of December 31, 2021 forfeited non-vested accounts held in the stable value advantage option total \$24,404.

2. Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan were prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures and changes therein. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments were reported at fair value except for its benefit-responsive investment contract, which was valued at contract value (Note 5). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Employer determined the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the custodian. See Note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities were recorded on a trade date basis. Interest income was recorded on the accrual basis. Net depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held, during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants were measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees were recorded as administrative expenses and were expensed as incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of November 14, 2022 and December 31, 2021. If a participant ceases to make scheduled repayments and the Plan administrator deems the note receivable to be in default, the note receivable balance was reduced and a benefit payment recorded.

Benefits Paid to Participants

Benefits were recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan were paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Employer. Expenses paid by the Employer were excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants were charged directly to the participant's account and were included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses were included in net depreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 18, 2023, the date the financials were available to be issued.

3. Certified Investments

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and note receivable from participant held as of November 14, 2022 and December 31, 2021, and net depreciation in the fair value of investments, interest income on notes receivable, transfer out to other qualified plan, and interest income from stable value advantage option for the period ended November 14, 2022, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Transamerica.

4. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described below:

- Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets the Plan can access.
- Level 2 Inputs to the methodology include:
 - Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
 - Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
 - Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
 - Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

4. Fair Value Measurements (continued)

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy for assets and liabilities is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

Pooled separate accounts: The portion of the Plan’s investment portfolio that is indirectly invested in pooled separate accounts invest directly in the underlying mutual funds (as indicated by the name of the pooled separate accounts which mirror the names of the underlying mutual funds). The contract value (which approximates fair value) is equal to the value of the accumulation units of that variable investment account that were credited to the participant’s account. All of these inputs were generally considered obtainable or observable through the review of existing contracts and readily available financial information on the web sites of the issuing financial institution. Therefore, these accounts were considered level 2 inputs. There were no restrictions on the redemption of these investments.

The following table sets forth by level, within the fair value hierarchy, the Plan’s investments at fair value as of December 31, 2021:

5. Group Annuity Contract

The Plan invested in a fully benefit-responsive investment contract with Transamerica totaling \$71,750 as of December 31, 2021. Transamerica maintained the contributions in a general unallocated account. The account was credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The effective rate of interest was established every January 1 and July 1 and was based on the daily balance, at a rate that was the daily equivalent of the effective annual rate of interest applicable for the six-month period. There was no guaranteed minimum or maximum interest rate under this contract, no unfunded commitments, and redemption frequency and notice period can occur daily.

5. Group Annuity Contract (continued)

The contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment criteria and therefore was reported at contract value. Contract value was the relevant measurement for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, because it was the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Transamerica, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and expenses. Participants could ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due was dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations could be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, bankruptcy of the Employer or other events that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA or premature termination of the contract. The merger of the Plan with the BAYADA Plan did not limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers nor did the merger limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, a breach of material obligation under the contract, a material misrepresentation or a material amendment to the agreement without consent of the issuer.

6. Related Party Transactions and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Plan investments were in accounts of Transamerica, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Notes receivable from participants and participant contributions were also considered to be party-in-interest transactions. Employer contributions were considered to be both party-in-interest and related party transactions.

7. Tax Status

The Plan adopted non-standardized pre-approved profit sharing plan which had received an opinion letter dated August 17, 2021, from the IRS which stated the plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe the Plan was designed and was currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan was qualified, and the related trust was tax-exempt.
