As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, and for the year ended December 31, 2022, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 2.

- The information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Hillenbrand, Inc. Savings Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 2 of the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial statements are prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Plan Transfer

As described in Notes 1 and 7 to the financial statements, the Board of Directors and the Pension Finance and Administration Committee of Hillenbrand, Inc. approved an amended and restated Plan Agreement that authorized a plan-to-plan transfer of certain participant accounts from the Hillenbrand, Inc. Savings Plan to the Process Equipment Group 401(k) Savings Plan.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 2; this includes determining that the modified cash basis of accounting is an acceptable basis for the preparation of financial statements in the circumstances. Management is also responsible for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of Hillenbrand, Inc. Savings Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Hillenbrand, Inc. Savings Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of the modified cash basis of accounting.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2022, is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion:

- The form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, is presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- The information in the supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS December 31, 2022 and 2021

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Hillenbrand, Inc. Savings Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General: The Plan was organized effective April 1, 2008, as a defined contribution retirement savings plan covering all eligible employees of Hillenbrand, Inc. (the Plan Sponsor) and its subsidiaries (collectively, the Employer) who meet the Eligible Employee requirements based on classifications more fully described in the Plan document. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Pension Finance and Administrative Committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan, determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance and reports to the Board of Directors of the Employer.

Plan Transfer - Process Equipment Group 401(k) Savings Plan: The Plan Sponsor also sponsors the Process Equipment Group 401(k) Savings Plan (PEG Plan). The Plan Agreement stipulates that when bargaining employees subsequently become non-bargaining employees of the Employer, such employees that are Plan participants will have their account balances automatically transferred into the PEG Plan from the Plan. Similarly, when non-bargaining employees subsequently become bargaining employees of the Employer, such employees that are Plan participants will have their account balances automatically transferred from the PEG Plan into the Plan.

Effective January 1, 2022, the Plan Sponsor amended and restated the Plan Agreement in its entirety to incorporate all prior Plan amendments and to reflect changes in laws, regulations, and other legal guidance issued since the time of the most recent Plan restatement. In addition, the amended and restated Plan Agreement authorized the transfer of certain additional participant account balances from the Plan into the PEG Plan, effective December 31, 2022. The affected Plan participants had their respective account balances transferred directly to the PEG Plan. Net assets totaling \$18,110,674 were transferred to the PEG Plan from the Plan during 2022. There were no transfers of net assets from the PEG Plan to the Plan during 2022. See Note 7.

Contributions: Each year, eligible employees of the Employer that are bargaining employees (bargaining participants) may authorize the Employer to contribute to the Plan up to 75% of their eligible annual compensation, as defined in the Plan Agreement. The Employer contributes to certain bargaining participant accounts an amount equal to 40% of the first 5% of compensation that such bargaining participants contribute to the Plan if the bargaining participants are eligible for a pension benefit from their respective union. For other bargaining participants, the Employer contributes an amount equal to 50% of the first 6% of compensation that such bargaining participants contribute to the Plan.

Effective January 1, 2023, bargaining employees with a frozen pension benefit in the Hillenbrand, Inc. Pension Plan (the Pension Plan) and certain bargaining employees without any pension benefits receive 4% Employer contributions to the Plan.

Non-bargaining employees hired after July 1, 2003, are no longer eligible to participate in the Pension Plan. Employees hired prior to July 1, 2003, made an election to continue to participate in the Pension Plan or to freeze their Pension Plan accruals effective December 31, 2003. Continuing Plan participants (those who did not elect to freeze their Pension Plan benefit accruals) and commissioned participants receive 3% Employer contributions to the Plan. Effective January 1, 2017, and January 1, 2020, these non-bargaining participants began receiving 4% Employer contributions to the Plan. Participants hired on or after July 1, 2003, and frozen Pension Plan participants receive 4% Employer contributions and Employer matching contributions of 50% of the first 6% of compensation that such participants contribute to the Plan. The benefits of Pension Plan frozen participants will be paid out in accordance with the Pension Plan provisions with future service considered only under the Plan.

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (CONTINUED)

Effective January 1, 2021, non-bargaining employees are no longer eligible to participate in the Plan.

The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby certain employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless an affirmative election not to participate in the Plan is executed. Automatically enrolled bargaining participants have their contribution rate set at 6% of eligible compensation and their contributions are invested in a designated fund until changed by the participant.

Participants may also make rollover contributions from amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans and certain Individual Retirement Accounts (IRA) as defined in the Plan Agreement. Contributions are subject to certain limitations under the Internal Revenue Code (IRC).

Participants direct the investment of their contributions, as well as those made by the Employer, into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Participant Accounts: Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Employer contributions, as well as allocations of Plan earnings. Participant accounts may also be charged with an allocation of certain administrative expenses of the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined in the Plan Agreement. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting and Forfeitures: Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Employer's contribution portion of their account is based on years of service. A participant becomes 100% vested after three years of credited service.

At December 31, 2022 and 2021, forfeited nonvested accounts of terminated participants totaled \$2,863 and \$56,504, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future Employer contributions, pay Plan expenses, and/or be allocated or reinstated to the accounts of eligible participants, as defined in the Plan Agreement. In 2022, forfeited nonvested accounts of \$167,919 were used to reduce Employer contributions.

Benefits: Upon the occurrence of a distributable event due to separation from service by termination, death, disability, or retirement, as defined by the Plan Agreement, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum cash distribution equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account or systematic installment payments. Hardship and in-service withdrawals, as well as required minimum distributions, rollover contribution accounts, and automatic distributions to former participants, as defined in the Plan Agreement, are also permitted from a participant's account.

Plan Termination: Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, the participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting: The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting. This method of accounting differs from accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America in that contributions and income are recorded when received, rather than when earned and expenses are recorded when paid, rather than when the obligation is incurred. Although the modified cash basis of accounting represents a departure from accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, it is an acceptable method of accounting for employee benefit plans under the requirements of ERISA.

Estimates: The preparation of financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting requires the Plan's management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition: The Plan's investments are reported at fair value, except the fully benefit-responsive investment contract which is reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. The Pension Finance and Administration Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the Plan's investment advisor and trustee. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest and dividends are recorded when received. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits: Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses: Administrative expenses for maintaining the Plan may be paid by the Employer or the Plan, at the Employer's discretion. Certain administration fees are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments.

Tax Status: The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed the Employer by a letter dated October 6, 2015, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the United States Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended and restated since receiving the determination letter, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

The Puerto Rico Department of the Treasury determined and informed the Employer by a letter dated March 10, 2017, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Puerto Rico Internal Revenue Code of 2011, as amended (PR Code). The Plan has been amended and restated since receiving the determination letter. The Employer received a letter dated August 18, 2020 from the Puerto Rico Department of Treasury indicating that the Plan's first and second amendments, effective January 1, 2015 and January 1, 2017, respectively, will not adversely affect the previously issued determination letter dated March 10, 2017. Although the Plan has been amended and restated since receiving the determination letter, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the PR Code. Therefore, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in process.

Subsequent Events: The Plan Administrator has evaluated the financial statements for subsequent events occurring through August 31, 2023, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. See Note 10.

NOTE 3 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan has categorized its assets and liabilities that are measured at fair value into a three-level fair value hierarchy. The hierarchy prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

NOTE 3 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (CONTINUED)

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include: quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement. In situations where there is little or no market activity for the asset or liability, the Plan makes estimates and assumptions related to the pricing of the asset or liability including assumptions regarding risk.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used by the Plan for assets that are measured at fair value on a recurring basis. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2022 and 2021.

Registered Investment Companies (Mutual Funds) and Money Market Fund Shares: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the funds. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. These funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Collective Trust Funds: Valued at the unit price reported by the sponsoring trust company. The underlying investments owned by the funds can include money market funds, stable value funds, fixed-income securities, registered investment companies, common stocks, corporate bonds, U.S. Government securities, other collective trust funds, or guaranteed investment contracts priced by the sponsoring insurance company using applicable interest rates and contract provisions. The unit price is based on the fair value of these underlying investments owned, less any accrual of fees and expenses borne by the fund, and divided by the number of units outstanding. The unit price is readily determinable and quoted on the active private market on which participants can transact daily with no redemption restrictions on these investments.

The preceding methods may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan's management believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain assets could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Following is a summary, within each level of the fair value hierarchy, of the Plan's assets that are measured at fair value on a recurring basis as of December 31, 2022 and 2021:

NOTE 4 - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN'S TRUSTEE (UNAUDITED INFORMATION)

All information related to investments held at December 31, 2022 and 2021, and net appreciation or depreciation in fair value of investments and interest and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2022, disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule was obtained or derived from information provided to the Plan Administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Fidelity Management Trust Company, the Plan's trustee, in accordance with Section 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

The Plan's independent auditor did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

NOTE 5 - JOINT INVESTMENT IN SYNTHETIC GUARANTEED INVESTMENT CONTRACT

In December 2011, the Plan Sponsor entered into a contract with The Prudential Insurance Company of America to invest in a synthetic guaranteed investment contract (GIC) currently held jointly between the Plan and Process Equipment Group 401(k) Savings Plan. Each plan's allocation of the contract is based on participant-directed investment elections, with interest income allocated daily based on the contract value owned by each respective plan.

The contract value of the synthetic GIC was \$45,342,878 and \$48,897,645 at December 31, 2022 and 2021, respectively. Interest income earned under the GIC totaled \$475,165 in 2022. The Plan's proportionate share in the contract was \$4,933,396 and \$9,013,568 at December 31, 2022 and 2021, respectively, and included interest income of \$86,295 in 2022.

NOTE 6 - FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT

The GIC meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for a fully benefit-responsive investment contract because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses.

In a synthetic investment contract, the Plan owns the underlying assets of the synthetic investment contract. A synthetic investment contract includes a wrapper contract, which is an agreement for the wrap issuer, such as a bank or insurance company, to make payments to the Plan in certain circumstances. The wrapper contract typically includes certain conditions and limitations on the underlying assets owned by the Plan. Synthetic investment contracts are designed to accrue interest based on crediting rates established by the contract issuer.

The interest in the synthetic investment contract held by the Plan includes a wrapper contract that provides a guarantee that the credit rate will not fall below 0%. Cash flow volatility (for example, timing of benefit payments) as well as asset underperformance can be passed through to the Plan through adjustments to future contract crediting rates. Formulas are provided in the contract that adjust renewal crediting rates to recognize the difference between the fair value and the book value of the underlying assets. Crediting rates are reviewed periodically for resetting.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with the fully benefit-responsive investment contract is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

NOTE 6 - FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT (CONTINUED)

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer. Examples of such events include the following:

1. The Plan's failure to qualify under Section 401(a) of the IRC or the failure of the trust to be tax-exempt under Section 501(a) of the IRC
2. Premature termination of the contract
3. Complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan
4. Changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options
5. Bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spinoffs of a subsidiary) that significantly affect the Plan's normal operations

No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Examples of such events include the following:

1. An uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines
2. A breach of material obligation under the contract
3. A material misrepresentation
4. A material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer

NOTE 7 - PLAN AMENDMENTS

Effective January 1, 2022, the Plan Sponsor amended and restated the Plan Agreement in its entirety to incorporate all prior amendments and to comply with the 2017 Cumulative List of Changes in Plan Qualification Requirements, per IRS Notice 2017-37, and with the requirements under IRS Revenue Procedure 2017-41, and to incorporate certain provisions implemented under the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2019 (SECURE Act), and the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act of 2020 (CARES Act) related to the Plan's distribution, hardship and in-service withdrawal, loan, and other provisions to maintain the Plan's tax-qualified status.

Effective December 31, 2022, the amended and restated Plan Agreement authorized a partial plan-to-plan transfer to the PEG Plan from the Plan limited to the participant account balances related to Manchester Factory Bargaining Employees and Batesville Driver Bargaining Employees. There were no other significant changes in the Plan's provisions.

NOTE 8 - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50% or more of such an employer or employee association, or relatives of such persons.

The Plan has arrangements with several third-party service providers. The Plan pays certain expenses related to the Plan's operation, administration, and investment activity. The Plan's expenses may be paid directly to the respective service provider or indirectly through the Plan's investments returns. Therefore, these transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

The Plan's interest in the fully benefit-responsive investment contract is issued by The Prudential Insurance Company of America. The underlying collective trust fund in the contract is sponsored by Prudential Trust Company. The Plan's allocation of direct fees paid from the contract to these parties-in-interest were \$27,074 in 2022.

NOTE 8 - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS (CONTINUED)

The Plan may receive revenue-sharing compensation from certain Plan investment options. This revenue, if any, is used to offset certain recordkeeping and administration services to the Plan and/or allocated to participant accounts as additional earnings.

The Employer provides certain accounting, administrative and investment management services to the Plan for which it receives no compensation.

NOTE 9 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan's investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 10 - SUBSEQUENT EVENT

Effective February 1, 2023, the Employer amended the Plan Agreement to change the Plan name to Batesville Savings Plan and to change the Plan Sponsor from Hillenbrand, Inc. to Batesville Services, LLC. Hillenbrand, Inc. and its subsidiaries were removed as participating employers in the Batesville Savings Plan. In addition, the following entities were added as participating employers in the Plan: Batesville Casket Company, LLC; Batesville Logistics, LLC; and Batesville Manufacturing, LLC.
