**NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN**

The following description of the Jefferson Capital Systems, LLC 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan and Trust Agreement (Plan Document) for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

*General*

The Plan is a 401(k) plan established on July 31, 2012. Employees of Jefferson Capital Systems, LLC, (the Company or Plan Sponsor) are eligible to participate in the plan once they have completed one month of service and attained the age of eighteen. Employees become a participant on the first day of the month on or after the attainment of eligibility. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Company functions as the Plan Administrator.

*Asset Transfer*

During 2022, the Plan transferred approximately \$313,000 in assets from Principal Life Insurance Company to Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America. These assets were included in the Plan in 2021 and therefore is not included in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2022.

*Contributions*

Participants may make voluntary salary reductions (participant contributions) up to the maximum amount allowed by the IRS. For 2022 the deferral limit was \$20,500. Participants may also rollover amounts from other qualified plans. Participants over the age of 50 are eligible for catch up contributions. The Plan includes automatic enrollment for newly eligible participants and will start deferring at 6% of eligible compensation.

The Company, at its discretion, may make employer matching contributions to the Plan, an amount determined by resolution of the owner or other governing authority of the Company. Participants are eligible to receive discretionary matching contributions once they have completed one year of service. During 2022, the match was 25% of up to 6% of eligible compensation. During the year ended December 31, 2022, there were approximately \$131,000 of employer matching contributions.

*Participant Accounts*

Individual accounts are maintained to record participant contributions, discretionary employer matching contributions, rollover contributions, and earnings thereon for each participant. Discretionary employer matching contributions are referred to as Company contributions. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the total benefit, which can be provided from the vested portion of these individual accounts.

**NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN, CONTINUED**

*Vesting*

Upon entry into the Plan, participants are 100 percent vested in their participant contributions, rollover contributions, Company contributions, and earnings thereon.

*Notes Receivable from Participants*

Participants may borrow from their accounts. The amounts borrowed are limited to the lesser of \$50,000 or one half of the participant's vested account balance and must be greater than \$1,000. Loans must bear a reasonable rate of interest and must be repaid within five years.

*Payment of Benefits*

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may request a distribution of their fully vested account balance from the Plan Administrator. Furthermore, upon approval of the Plan Administrator, participants may be entitled to take hardship distributions. Participants may elect to withdraw all, or a portion of their account while still employed, upon attainment of age 59 ½. Vested account balances less than \$5,000 for terminated participants, will be distributed as soon as administratively feasible after termination. Benefits are recorded when paid.

*Forfeited Accounts*

Forfeited accounts will be used to either pay Plan expenses or to reduce Company contributions. As of December 31, 2022 and 2021, the plan had a forfeiture balance of \$800 and \$0, respectively. During 2022, the Plan did not use forfeitures to reduce employer contributions or to pay Plan expenses.

*Subsequent Event*

Management has evaluated subsequent events through October 9, 2023, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

**NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

*Use of Estimates*

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

*Basis of Accounting*

The financial statements of the plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

**NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES , CONTINUED**

*Investments Contracts*

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. See Note 5 for description.

*Investment Valuation and Income Recognition*

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net depreciation includes the plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

*Fair Value Measurements*

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statement of net assets available for benefits. The methods used to measure fair value may produce an amount that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

*Administrative Costs*

All expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid out of the Plan assets or by the Plan Sponsor. Investment-related expenses are included in net depreciation of fair value of investments.

*Market Risk*

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit and overall market volatility risks. Furthermore, due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes, could materially affect the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

**NOTE 3 – INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY CUSTODIANS**

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Principal Life Insurance Company (Principal), the custodian of the Plan for the period of January 1, 2022 through May 22, 2022, and Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC, the custodians of the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2022, (collectively Empower), have supplied the Plan administrator with a certification as to the completeness and accuracy of all investment information reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2022 and the supplemental schedule of assets (held at the end of the year) as of December 31, 2022.

**NOTE 4 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

FASB ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobserved inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described below:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurements.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

**NOTE 4 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS, CONTINUED**

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

*Mutual funds* - Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end and closed-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Collective trust funds* - Valued at NAV based on the market value of the underlying investment assets divided by the number of units outstanding at the end of the Plan year. The NAV, as provided by the custodian, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchased and sales) may occur daily.

**NOTE 5 – INVESTMENT CONTRACT**

The Plan entered into a benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract Empower. Empower maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

Because the guaranteed investment contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contract. The guaranteed investment contract is presented on the face of the statement of net assets available for benefit at fair value due to there being no adjustment to equal contract value. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Empower, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant’s withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participant may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The methodology for calculating the interest crediting rate is based on the earnings of the underlying assets in the entire medium-long term new portfolio comrade to the minimum interest crediting rate as stated in the contract, and prevailing market conditions. Interest crediting rate is reset quarterly.

**NOTE 6 – TAX STATUS**

The Plan has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated November 14, 2022 stating that the written form of the underlying prototype plan document is qualified under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code), and that any employer adopting this form of the Plan will be considered to have a plan qualified under Section 401(a) of the Code. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the Code to maintain its qualification. The plan administrator believes the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax exempt.

**NOTE 7 – PLAN TERMINATION**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue their contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

**NOTE 8 – PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

Empower holds the plan's assets and performs the record-keeping. Alliance Bernstein, LP performs the Plan's investment advising. Therefore, any investment, administrative or compliance fees paid during the year to qualify as party-in-interest transactions.
