## INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

### Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

## NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2022 AND 2021

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### 1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Hammer Packaging Corporation Deferred Profit Sharing & Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

#### **General**

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering the non-union employees of Hammer Packaging Corporation (the Company). The Plan contains both 401(k) and profit-sharing components. Unless otherwise indicated, the provisions of the Plan are identical for both components. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

The Plan sponsor had the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA and the Plan.

#### **Merger or Transfer and Plan Termination**

The Plan will not be merged or consolidated with, nor shall any assets or liabilities of the Plan be transferred to, any other plan unless each Participant would receive (if the Plan then terminated) a benefit immediately after the merger, consolidation, or transfer which is equal to or greater than the benefit that each participant would have been entitled to receive immediately before the merger, consolidation, or transfer (if the Plan had then terminated).

The right to terminate participation in the Plan is reserved to each participating company. Upon termination or permanent suspension of contributions with respect to all or any one of the participating companies, the accounts of all participants affected thereby will become fully vested, and the balances in their accounts will be distributed in accordance with the provisions of the Plan.

Effective January 1, 2023, the Plan, including all assets and liabilities, was merged into and with the Multi-Color 401(k) Savings Plan with participants of the Plan becoming participants in the Multi-Color 401(k) Savings Plan.

Upon merger of the Plan, participants became 100% vested in their account, regardless of length of service. In connection with the merger, the Plan had \$21,861,282 of investments and \$119,117 of notes receivable which were transferred out of the Plan on December 30, 2022.

#### **Administration**

The Company is the plan sponsor and is responsible for general administration of the Plan. As of the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021, all Plan assets were held and managed by Principal Financial Group (the Custodian). Principal Retirement Plan Processing Services provides recordkeeping services for the Plan. Rimkus Marciano & Associates, Inc. is the Plan's third-party administrator.

## 1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (Continued)

### **Eligibility**

Employees of the Company are eligible to participate in the 401(k) component of the Plan after three months of service and are eligible to participate in the profit-sharing component of the Plan upon completion of at least 1,000 hours of service within a plan year. There is no minimum age requirement to participate in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified retirement plans (rollovers). The Plan has an automatic enrollment provision whereby employees that have met the eligibility requirements are automatically enrolled in the Plan and 4% of their compensation is contributed unless they elect not to contribute. The Plan also has an automatic deferral increase in the amount of 1% each year on the first day of the Plan year, up to a maximum of 10% of the Participant's compensation. Participants have the option to change their deferral percentage or discontinue deferrals at any time.

### **Contributions**

Participants may make tax-deferred contributions to the Plan, subject to the limits set forth in the Internal Revenue Code. The Company makes matching contributions equal to 50% of the first 4% of the participant's elective deferrals. The Company may also make profit sharing contributions to the plan on a discretionary basis. No profit sharing contribution was made in 2022 or 2021.

Participants direct the investment of their contributions and Company contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

### **Participant Accounts**

Each participant's account is credited with participant contributions, Company matching contributions and actual earnings (losses) thereon. Participant accounts are also credited with allocations of profit-sharing contributions and related earnings (losses) and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant wages or account balances, as defined by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

### **Vesting**

Participants are immediately vested in their 401(k) contributions and employer matching contributions, plus actual earnings (losses) thereon. Profit-sharing contributions vest 20% per year beginning upon completion of two years of service and are fully vested after six years of credited service.

### **Forfeitures**

Forfeitures of non-vested account balances are used to pay administrative expenses or allocated to the remaining participants in the Plan. Forfeitures used for these purposes totaled \$5,892 and \$5,282 in 2022 and 2021, respectively. The remaining forfeiture balance to be used for these purposes totaled \$5,544 as of December 31, 2021. There was no forfeiture balance as of December 31, 2022.

### **Notes Receivable from Participants**

Participants may borrow up to the lesser of 50% of their vested account balances or \$50,000. Participants can choose an amortization schedule of up to five years, unless the note is used for a primary residence, in which case the amortization schedule may be up to 25 years. Principal and interest are paid through payroll deductions. Interest on notes receivable from participants is charged at the prime rate at the time of loan origination plus 2% (9.50% at December 31, 2022).

## 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

### **Payment of Benefits**

The Plan provides for benefit payments upon either the termination of employment or the attainment of the age of 65. Benefit payments are made in the form of a partial payment, lump-sum distribution, or a rollover to another qualified investment. Additionally, the Plan provides for in-service withdrawals once a participant reaches age 59 ½, even if still employed.

### **Hardship Withdrawals**

Hardship withdrawals from the Plan are not permitted.

### **Basis of Accounting**

The Plan's financial statements have been prepared in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

### **Investments**

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value as reported by the Custodian. Purchases and sales of securities are reflected on a trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held, during the year. Investment expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) of fair value of investments.

### **Fair Value Measurement**

Generally accepted accounting principles provide a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair market value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

- Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets and liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access. All of the Plan's assets were valued using level 1 inputs.
- Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
  - Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
  - Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
  - Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
  - Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.
- Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

A description of where the Plan's investments fall within the hierarchy is provided in Note 3.

### **Benefit Payments**

Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

## 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

### Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Principal and interest are paid through payroll deductions. Delinquent notes are reclassified as distributions based on the terms of the Plan document.

### Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with investments and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the near term could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Due to the nature of the investments held by common collective trusts, changes in market conditions and the economic environment may significantly impact the net asset value (NAV) of the funds and, consequently, the fair value of the Plan's interests in the funds. Furthermore, changes to the liquidity provisions of the funds may significantly impact the fair value of the Plan's interest in the funds.

### Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Significant estimates included in these financial statements include investment valuation, as noted above.

### Events Occurring After Reporting Date

The Plan has evaluated events and transactions that occurred between December 31, 2022 and October 6, 2023, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued, for possible disclosure and recognition in the financial statements. The Plan was formally merged into another 401k Plan on January 1, 2023 (See note 1).

Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine fair value could result in different fair value measurements at the reporting date.

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Principal Financial Group has certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

### 5. INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan obtained its latest determination letter on March 31, 2014, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan has been amended since receiving that determination letter. However, the plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements. By statute, tax years 2019 through 2022 remain open to examination by the major taxing jurisdictions to which the Plan is subject.

### 6. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Principal Financial Group is the custodian of the Plan's assets. As such, transactions between Principal Financial Group and the Plan qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Additionally, notes receivable from participants also qualify as party-in-interest transactions.
