NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Ferrie, Franzmann Industries, LLC 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General: The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all full-time employees of Ferrie, Franzmann Industries, LLC (the “Employer” or “Plan Sponsor”) who are not members of a collective bargaining agreement, non-resident aliens or leased employees. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act (“ERISA”), as amended. The Plan Administrative Committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Plan Administrator determines the appropriateness of the Plan’s investment offerings, monitors investment performance and reports to the Plan’s Administrative Committee.

Contributions: Each year, eligible participants may elect to have a portion of their pre-tax and after-tax eligible compensation, as defined in the Plan, deferred and contributed to the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans (rollover). The Employer, at the discretion of management, may make a discretionary matching contribution to eligible participants. Eligibility criteria include: (1) the employee is employed at the Employer on December 31st, and (2) the employee worked over 1,000 hours during the year. No discretionary matching contribution was made for the year ended December 31, 2022. Contributions are subject to certain IRS limitations.

Participant Accounts: Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions and an allocation of (a) the Employer’s contributions, if any, (b) Plan earnings (losses), and (c) is charged with his or her withdrawals and an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant contributions, eligible compensation, participant account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account. Each participant directs the investment of his or her account to any of the investment options available under the Plan.

Retirement, Death and Disability: A participant is entitled to 100% of his or her account balance upon retirement, death or disability.

Vesting: Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and rollovers plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Employer’s discretionary matching contribution portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100 percent vested in Employer contributions after five years of credited service.

Payment of Benefits: Upon termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or termination of employment, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum distribution, installment payments or a direct rollover to another qualified retirement plan, as defined, in an amount equal to the value of the participant’s vested interest in his or her account. In certain circumstances, participants may make “hardship withdrawals” as defined in the Plan. Active participants may also take distributions from the Plan upon attainment of age 59 ½.

Notes Receivable from Participants: Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance, whichever is less. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's vested account and bear interest at rates that are commensurate with market rates for similar loans. All loans are covered by demand notes and must be repaid to the Plan within a period specified by the Plan agreement, generally not exceeding five years. The Employer establishes the specific terms and conditions of each loan. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Forfeitures: Forfeitures represent the portion of the Employer's contributions that are lost by a participant who terminates employment prior to becoming fully vested under the Plan's vesting schedule. At December 31, 2022 and 2021, forfeited non-vested accounts were not significant. These accounts will be used to pay administrative expenses of the Plan or reduce future Employer contributions. During the year ended December 31, 2022, no forfeitures were used to pay Plan administrative expenses or reduce employer contributions.

Plan Termination: Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan agreement to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in the Employer's discretionary contributions and earnings thereon.

Administrative and Investment Management Expenses: Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Employer and are excluded from these financial statements. Plan recordkeeping, professional services and trustee fees are paid by the Plan and are reflected in the financial statements as administrative expenses. Investment management fees are charged to the Plan as a reduction of investment return and included in the investment income reported by the Plan.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting: The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures, and actual results may differ from these estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition: The Plan's investments other than fully benefit-responsive investment contracts are reported at fair value as further described in Notes 4 and 5. Fair value is the price that would be received by the Plan for an asset or paid by the Plan to transfer a liability (an exit price) in an orderly transaction between market participants on the measurement date in the Plan's principal or most advantageous market for the asset or liability. Contract value is the relevant measure for the Plan's fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, because contract value is the amount Plan participants generally receive when executing transactions under the terms of the contract and Plan provisions.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants: Notes receivable from participants are reported at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest, with no allowance for credit losses, as repayments of principal and interest are received through payroll deductions and the notes are collateralized by the participants' account balances. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

Payment of Benefits: Benefits are recorded when paid.

Risks and Uncertainties: The Plan holds various investments. Investments are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, liquidity, credit risks and global events. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the fair values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 3 – CERTIFIED INVESTMENTS

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2022, and net depreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2022, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by the trustees. For the period from January 1, 2022 and through April 30, 2022, the information was certified as complete and accurate by Reliance Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan, and Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America ("EAIC") as an agent for Massachusetts Mutual Life Insurance Company. As of December 31, 2022 and for the period from May 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022, the information was certified as complete and accurate by Empower Trust Company, trustee of the Plan and EAIC as complete and accurate.

For the year ended December 31, 2021, the information was certified as complete and accurate by Reliance Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan, and Great-West Life & Annuity Insurance Company, as Agent for Massachusetts Mutual Life Insurance Company ("Mass Mutual").

On December 31, 2020, Empower acquired the retirement business of Mass Mutual. Following an initial transition period, Empower became the sole administrator of this business in 2021.

NOTE 4 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Fair value measurements are determined by maximizing the use of observable inputs and minimizing the use of unobservable inputs. The hierarchy places the highest priority on unadjusted quoted market prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and gives the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of inputs within the fair value hierarchy are defined as follows:

Level 1: Quoted prices (unadjusted) for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access as of the measurement date.

Level 2: Significant other observable inputs other than Level 1 prices such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities; quoted prices in markets that are not active; or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data.

Level 3: Significant unobservable inputs that reflect the Plan’s own assumptions about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing an asset or liability.

In some cases, a valuation technique used to measure fair value may include inputs from multiple levels of the fair value hierarchy. The lowest level of significant input determines the placement of the entire fair value measurement in the hierarchy.

The following presents the valuation methods and assumptions used by the Plan to estimate the fair values of investments. There were no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2022 and 2021.

Mutual Funds: The fair values of mutual fund investments are determined by obtaining quoted prices on nationally recognized securities exchanges.

Pooled Separate Accounts: The fair values of participation units held in pooled separate accounts are based on the net asset values reported by the fund managers as of the financial statement dates and recent transaction prices. Each pooled separate account provides for daily redemptions by the Plan with no advance notice requirements and has redemption prices determined by the fund’s net asset value per unit. The pooled separate accounts, which do not file as direct filing entities, have underlying investments in a single mutual fund. The objectives of these pooled separate accounts are in alignment with the objectives of the underlying mutual funds.

*Investments measured at fair value using net asset value per share (or its equivalent) as a practical expedient have not been classified in the fair value hierarchy. The fair value amounts presented in the hierarchy tables for such investments are intended to permit reconciliation of the fair value hierarchy to the investments at fair value line item presented in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 5 – FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACTS

The Plan holds a fully benefit-responsive traditional investment contract, a guaranteed interest account (GIA), whereby contributions are maintained in a general account. This contract was originally issued by Mass Mutual. Through power of attorney, EAIC, now serves as administrator of this contract. Because the GIA is fully benefit-responsive, it is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by EAIC, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The GIA issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

There are no reserves against the contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer, but it may not be less than three percent. Such interest rates are reviewed on a semi-annual basis for resetting.

Certain events may limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include but may not be limited to a participant termination of employment due to: (1) removal of a group of participants from plan coverage as a result of temporary absence; (2) change in position or other occurrence qualifying as a temporary break in service under the Plan; (3) transfer or other change of position resulting in employment by an entity controlling, controlled by, or under common control with the Employer; or (4) cessation of an employment relationship resulting from a reorganization, merger, layoff or the sale or discontinuance of all or any part of the Plan Sponsor's business. Such events also include (1) removal from the Plan of one or more groups or classifications of participants; (2) partial or complete Plan termination; or (3) Plan disqualification. The Plan Administrator believes that any events which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are not probable of occurring.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

In the event of early termination of the contract by the Plan or the failure by the Plan Sponsor to accept the guaranteed rates, EAIC will liquidate the contract pursuant to procedures specified in the contract agreement.

NOTE 6 – PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Parties-in-interest are defined under DOL regulations as any fiduciary of the Plan, any party rendering service to the Plan, the employer, and certain others. Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Plan Sponsor. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan. Some administrative expenses of the Plan are paid directly by the Plan Sponsor. The Plan holds pooled separate accounts and a guaranteed interest account issued by Mass Mutual or affiliates of Mass Mutual. Through December 29, 2020, Mass Mutual was the recordkeeper for the Plan. On December 30, 2020 Empower Retirement, LLC acquired the retirement business of Mass Mutual. In addition, Mesirow Financial, Inc. is the Plan's investment advisor. Transactions with and fees paid to these service providers of the Plan, qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Notes receivable from participants also qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE 7 – TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service issued an opinion letter dated November 14, 2022, indicating that the prototype adopted by the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). The Plan has been amended from the original prototype document; however, Plan management believes that the Plan is currently being operated in accordance with the Internal Revenue Code.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2019.

NOTE 8 – SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Plan management has evaluated subsequent events for recognition and disclosure through October 11, 2023, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Effective February 1, 2023, the Plan merged into the Riot Blockchain 401(k) Plan, a defined contribution formed on January 1, 2023 by the parent of the Plan Sponsor.
