Retirement Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2022, and the related notes to the financial statements.

### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

#### NOTE 1: DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of Pennant Moldings, Inc. Retirement Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provision.

##### General

The Plan is a defined contribution retirement plan that was established for the exclusive benefit of the employees of the controlled group of employers referred to as Pennant Moldings, Inc. (the “Companies”). Employees become eligible to participate in the Plan upon reaching 18 years of age and completing three months of service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan Administrator is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Company’s Board of Directors determines the appropriateness of the Plan’s investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

##### Contributions

Each year, eligible participants may elect to contribute between 1% and 90% of their pretax annual compensation as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may elect to make pre-tax or Roth deferral contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans (rollover contributions). The Companies may, at the discretion of the Board of Directors, make matching contributions. As of January 1, 2021, employer matching contributions equal the sum of 100% of the amount of the Participant’s elective deferrals that do not exceed 3% of the Participant’s compensation plus 50% of participant elective deferrals over 3% but not to exceed 5% of eligible participant earnings. At the discretion of the Company’s Board of Directors, additional discretionary profit sharing contributions may be authorized for the related year. Profit sharing contributions will be allocated to all employees eligible to participate in the Plan and employed on December 31. Profit sharing contributions are allocated based on percentage of eligible earnings. There were no profit sharing contributions from the Companies to the Plan during 2022 or 2021. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

##### Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with participant’s contributions and allocations of (a) Companies’ matching and profit sharing contributions and (b) Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expense that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

##### Participant-Directed Investment Options

Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct the investment of their contributions into any of the several investment options with varying degrees of risk and volatility, allowing participants to allocate their investments in accordance with their own risk tolerances and time horizons. Participants may change their investment options at any time.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. A participant is also immediately 100% vested in the employer's safe harbor contributions.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$500 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate, determined at inception, is set at 1% above the Prime interest rate (7.5% at December 31, 2022 and 3.25% at December 31, 2021), as defined, in accordance with the Plan's loan policy. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to death, disability, attainment of age 59 ½, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or annual installments over a future period. For termination of service or other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution. Distributions of a participant's account balance may be authorized at any time by the Plan Administrator under certain hardship conditions.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2022 and 2021, the amounts of forfeited and unallocated assets were \$15,350 and \$13,072, respectively. During the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021, \$15,354 and \$13,278 of employer contributions were paid from forfeitures, respectively.

NOTE 2: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document. No allowances for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2022 and 2021.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Expenses of maintaining the Plan, including participant recordkeeping, are paid by the Companies and are excluded from these financial statements. Certain fees related to distributions and the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated through September 6, 2023, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

The Plan was restated effective July 31, 2022 with no significant changes to Plan provisions.

Reorganization of the plan sponsor was effective January 1, 2023, whereby the parent company PGI Holdings, LLC absorbed all sub-entities that existed previously. An amendment was made to the retirement plan and the plan was renamed "PGI Holdings, LLC Retirement Plan," also effective January 1, 2023.

NOTE 3: INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY CUSTODIAN

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2022 and 2021, and net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments, interest and dividends for the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan Administrator and certified as complete and accurate by FIS Reliance Trust Company (the custodian of the Plan).

NOTE 4: FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described below:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- or
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2022 and 2021.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

*Mutual funds:* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Common/collective trust funds:* Valued based on the NAV of units of the collective trust fund. The NAV as provided by the custodian, is used as a practical expedient to estimating fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the trust less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the Plan will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

For the year ended December 31, 2022, the Plan did not have any Level 2 or 3 assets.

NOTE 5: RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by Reliance Trust Company. Reliance Trust Company is the custodian of the Plan as defined by the Plan and, therefore such transactions and associated administrative expenses qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Additionally, the Plan holds party-in-interest receivables of \$79,416 and \$58,471 as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, respectively, in the form of notes receivable from participants.

NOTE 6: PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Companies have the right under the Plan to discontinue their contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

NOTE 7: TAX STATUS

Automated Data Processing, sponsor of the Prototype Non-Standardized Profit Sharing Plan, has obtained an opinion letter dated December 31, 2018, in which the IRS stated that the restated volume submitter/prototype plan document was in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The plan sponsor adopted this restated volume submitter/prototype plan document on July 1, 2016. The Plan was amended January 1, 2021. The volume submitter/prototype plan opinion letter has been relied upon by this Plan.

The plan administrator believes the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax exempt.

In accordance with GAAP, Plan management is required to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that, as of December 31, 2022, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 8: RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict.
