Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Holman Contract Warehousing, Inc. Employees Retirement Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of June 13, 2022 and December 31, 2021, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Holman Contract Warehousing, Inc. Employees Retirement Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the HCW statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of June 13, 2022 and December 31, 2021, and the period ended June 13, 2022, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note C to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Holman Contract Warehousing, Inc. Employees Retirement Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Holman Contract Warehousing, Inc. Employees Retirement Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

NOTE A.--DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Holman Contract Warehousing, Inc. (Company or Sponsor) Employees Retirement Plan (Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General: Prior to the merger, the Plan was a defined contribution 401(k) and profit-sharing plan established by the Company effective July 2, 1990, and most recently amended and restated January 1, 2019. The Plan was subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). An eligible employee was any person employed by the Company, excluding employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement. For eligibility purposes, years of service includes service with related employers – Holman Distribution Center of Oregon, Inc., Holman Transportation, LLC, and Holman Distribution Center of Washington, Inc. An employee became eligible to participate in the plan after completing 6 months of service. Participants must be employed on the last day of the Plan year, and attain 1,000 hours of service during the year, to be eligible to receive any employer discretionary matching and non-elective contributions. The entry date was the first day of each month following completion of eligibility requirements.

Merger: Effective, June 13, 2022, the Company entered into a Plan Merger Addendum to become a participating employer in the Holman Distribution Center 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan. As a result, eligible employees of the Company will be permitted to participate in the Holman Distribution Center 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan effective June 13, 2022, after a blackout period, in accordance with the new plan documents with prior age and service recognized for eligibility and vesting. See also Note G.

Contributions: Prior to the merger the Plan was funded by eligible participant elective deferrals which may range from 1% to 100% of eligible compensation and employer discretionary matching and non-elective contributions. Participants who had attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year were eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants could also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified retirements plans, including transfers in and out of Holman Distribution Centers 401(k) Plan. Roth rollover contributions and deferrals were not allowed. Contributions were subject to certain limitations.

Participant Accounts: Each participant's account was credited with the participant's contribution, Company matching contributions, an allocation of the Company's discretionary non-elective contributions and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations were based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as applicable, as defined by the Plan document. The benefit to which a participant was entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the vested portion of the participant's account.

Vesting: Participants were immediately vested in their rollover contributions, elective deferrals, and Company match and non-elective contributions, plus actual earnings thereon.

Retirement: The normal retirement date was the later of the date the participant turns 59 ½ or the 5th anniversary of the first day of the Plan year in which the participant entered the Plan. Early retirement was permitted at the later of age 55 or upon completion of 10 years of service.

Payment of Benefits: On termination of service due to termination of employment, death, disability, or retirement, a participant could elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account or other amount. If the balance of the account was greater than \$5,000 and termination was due to normal retirement or death benefits may be either lump sum or in installments with respect to minimum required distributions. If the balance of the vested accounts was \$1,000 or less, payment will be made in a lump-sum without the participant's consent. If such balance was less than \$5,000, but greater than \$1,000, without other election, it will automatically be rolled over into an IRA established by the Company. In-service distributions were allowed at age 59½. Qualified reservist distributions were also allowed. Hardship distributions were allowed in accordance with the provisions of the Plan.

Forfeited Accounts: Participants are fully vested in their employer contributions. Accordingly, forfeitures relate to corrective distributions only. Forfeitures could be used to offset employer contributions. At June 13, 2022 and December 31, 2021, forfeited accounts totaled \$0.

Investment Options: Participants were allowed to direct their contributions and account balances in a variety of investment options including mutual funds and collective trust funds. The Plan Sponsor periodically reviewed the investment fund options available to participants and changed them as warranted. Participants could change their investments at any time.

Plan Expenses: Expenses of maintaining the Plan may be paid by the Company or the Plan. Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Certain fees such as for distributions are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses including 12b-1 fees and revenue sharing fees are deducted from each funds' earnings and are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments.

NOTE B.--SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting: The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates: The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the financial statements and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition: Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's committee determines the Plan's valuation utilizing information provided by investment advisors, custodian and trustee. See Note D for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year. All Plan assets were transferred to another Plan on June 13, 2022. See Note G.

Payment of Benefits: Benefits are recorded when paid.

NOTE C.--CERTIFIED INFORMATION

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedules, including investments held at June 13, 2022 and December 31, 2021, and net depreciation in fair value of investments, dividend income, and other income, for the period ended June 13, 2022, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by the trustee and custodian of the Plan, Principal Trust Company.

NOTE D.--FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) *Accounting Standards Codification* (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described below:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at June 13, 2022 and December 31, 2021.

NOTE D.--FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (Continued)

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Collective investment trusts: Valued at NAV of units held by the Plan at year end. The NAV, as provided by the trustee and custodian, is a readily determinable fair value and is the basis for current transactions. The NAV is based on the fair value of its underlying investments owned by the fund, minus its liabilities and then divided by the number of units outstanding. The NAV of a collective trust is calculated based on a compilation of primarily observable market information. The number of units of the trust that are outstanding on the calculation date is derived from observable purchase and redemption activity in the trust.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE E.--RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are in funds managed by the custodian and trustee, Principal Trust Company, therefore, any transactions with Principal Trust Company would qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Certain administrative functions of the Plan are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.

NOTE F.--TAX STATUS

The Plan was amended effective July 1, 2019 and adopted a prototype non-standardized profit sharing plan with CODA which received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) on March 31, 2014, which stated that the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code.

The Plan has been amended since the date of this determination letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statement.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination.

The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of June 13, 2022 and December 31, 2021, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE G.--PLAN TERMINATION DUE TO MERGER

Effective June 13, 2022, all Plan assets were liquidated by the Plan and its administrator Principal Trust Company and were transferred to the Holman Distribution Centers 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan EIN No. 91-1065515, Plan 003 with Principal Trust Company. Pursuant to the merger, the plan incurred a blackout period from June 3rd to the 10th. The Plan disbursed all Plan benefits by June 13, 2022, the date at which the Plan was considered fully terminated.

NOTE H.--RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invested in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as foreign currency exchange rate, interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

NOTE I.--EXCESS CONTRIBUTIONS

Contributions received from participants for 2021 of \$10,046 were returned in 2022 year end to certain active participants to return them excess deferral contributions as required to satisfy the relevant nondiscrimination provisions of the Plan. Those amounts are included in the Plan's statement of net assets available for benefits as excess contributions payable at December 31, 2021.

NOTE J.--NON-EXEMPT TRANSACTIONS

Late Remittance

As reported on the supplemental Schedule H, Line 4a – Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions for the period ended June 13, 2022, certain Plan contributions of \$1,306 were not remitted to the trust within the time frame specified by the Department of Labor's Regulation 29 CFR 2510.3-102, thus constituting nonexempt transaction between the Plan and the Company for the year ended December 31, 2021. The Company calculated the potential for lost earnings resulting from the delays in the contributions for the nonexempt transactions and made the appropriate deposits in participants accounts during the period ended June 13, 2022.

NOTE K.--SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 11, 2023, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.


