We have performed an audit of the financial statements of ADC Physicians, P.A. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the ADC Physicians, P.A. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan), provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established January 1, 1971, intended to qualify under sections 401(a) and 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) and subsequent related amendments and revisions. Charles Schwab Bank (the Custodian) is the Plan's custodian and the Plan was administered by the ADC Physicians, P.A. (ADC PA) (the Plan Administrator).

Eligibility

An employee is eligible to participate in the Plan on the entry date coinciding with the plan year or completion of one year of service. Once eligible, participants can enroll in the Plan on the 1st day of each quarter of the plan year. Years of service are determined under the hours of service method. Hours of service for hourly employees are determined by actual hours worked, and hours of service for salary employees are determined under an equivalency method. One year of service is the equivalent to 1,000 hours worked in one calendar year. All years of service with the employer are credited for purposes of eligibility and vesting.

Contributions

Participants self-direct their contributions and account balances among the funds provided by the Plan. Participants may contribute up to 100% of their total compensation, up to the maximum as permitted by the Internal Revenue Code. Participants immediately vest in their contributions and the associated investment results.

Matching contributions may be made by ADC PA at least annually, or more frequently at their discretion. Participants eligible to receive a regular matching contribution are those who completed 1,000 hours of service during the plan year and were either employed by or on an authorized leave of absence from ADC PA on the last day of the plan year. In years in which the employer makes a safe harbor matching contribution, the requirements for completing 1,000 hours of service and being employed or on an authorized leave of absence are waived.

Contributions - Continued

The Plan was amended effective for the period beginning July 1, 2020 and ending December 31, 2020, to suspend the Safe Harbor Matching Contribution. As a result, participants will not receive Safe Harbor Matching Contributions with respect to any compensation paid to participants on or after July 1, 2020. This change does not have any effect on any Safe Harbor Matching Contributions participants are entitled to receive prior to July 1, 2020. The Safe Harbor Matching Contribution was reinstated on January 1, 2021.

The discretionary contributions from ADC PA are allocated to the accounts of eligible participants based on their relative compensation according to the specific provisions of the plan document. Earnings, gains, and losses within each fund are allocated to each participant's account in proportion to the ratio of the participant's investment in each fund to all participants' total investment in each fund.

During 2022 and 2021, ADC PA made \$976,428 and \$974,134 in safe harbor matching contributions, respectively, to participants' accounts.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the employer matching contribution, and an allocation of (a) employer discretionary contribution, (b) plan earnings, and (c) forfeitures of terminated participants' non-vested accounts, if not used to offset future employer contributions or plan expenses. Allocations are based on participant contributions or account balances as defined in the plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service, a participant may elect to receive benefits as either a lump sum payment or periodic installment over a fixed reasonable period of time. If a participant leaves employment other than by retirement, death, or disability, and the participant's balance is greater than \$1,000 but less than \$5,000, the participant may elect to receive a lump sum distribution or roll the balance into another account. If an election is not made by the participant, the balance may be rolled into an IRA established by the plan sponsor in the name of the participant. If the participant's balance is less than \$1,000, the plan sponsor may distribute the funds in a lump sum to the participant. Distributions are also permitted for reason of proven financial hardship, as outlined in the plan document.

Vesting

The participants' accounts vest according to the following percentages:

Forfeitures are utilized by ADC PA to partially offset its employer contributions and plan expenses. For the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021, \$0 and \$95, respectively, was used to offset employer contributions and plan expenses. As of December 31, 2022 and 2021, forfeitures available to be used totaled \$412 and \$516, respectively; these will be used to offset future employer contributions and plan expenses.

Participants are 100% vested in all employee contributions.

Participant Loans

Participants may borrow a minimum of \$1,000 and up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance reduced by the highest outstanding balance of any additional loan made in the previous twelve month period. Interest rates shall bear a reasonable rate as determined by the Plan Administrator. Principal and interest are paid either bi-weekly or monthly through payroll deductions.

Plan Amendments

The Plan was amended on December 28, 2021, to comply with the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act. The Plan was also amended on December 28, 2021, to allow safe-harbor hardship distributions under Section 22.

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Method of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Fees and Expenses

Fees and expenses incurred in the administration of the Plan, to the extent not paid by the employer, are charged to and paid from the Plan's assets.

Investments

In accordance with Accounting Standard Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurements*, issued by the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB), the Plan's investments are reported at fair value. FASB ASC 820 establishes a framework for measuring fair value. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on the trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net loss or gain on pooled separate accounts include realized and unrealized gains and losses.

Concentration of Credit Risk

Financial instruments which potentially subject the Plan to concentrations of credit risk are primarily investments. The Plan's investments consist primarily of mutual funds which are traded in an active market.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP) requires the Plan Administrator and management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Reporting of Participant Loans

Loans issued to participants are reported as notes receivable, segregated from plan investments, and are measured at their unpaid principal balances plus accrued but unpaid interest.

Contract Not Included with Plan Assets

The plan sponsor has purchased a cash value life insurance contract through the Custodian that has been excluded from plan assets.

Fair Value Measurements

The Plan follows ASC 820, issued by the FASB. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described below:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;

Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in active markets;

Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;

Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Fair Value Measurements - Continued

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value:

Mutual funds are valued at the net asset value (NAV) of shares held at year end as valued by the issuer.

Common/Collective trusts are valued at the NAV of shares held at year end as determined by a third party.

Subsequent Events

Management of the Plan has evaluated subsequent events for disclosure through the date of the independent auditors' report, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE C - INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan obtained its latest determination letter on August 26, 2010, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan Administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. No provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan Administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2019.

NOTE D - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, ADC PA has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of the Code and ERISA.
