## INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

### **Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit**

We have performed an audit of the financial statements of Presentation Productions, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2022, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of Presentation Productions, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of and for the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 5 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

**NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

The following description of the Presentation Products, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

**General**

The Plan covers substantially all employees of Presentation Products, Inc. DBA Spinitar (Company). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Company is the Plan Administrator and is responsible for oversight of the Plan as well as determining and reviewing the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and investment performance.

The Plan is a defined contribution plan under the provision of Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC), which includes a qualified cash or deferred arrangement as described in Section 401(k) of the IRC. The Plan became effective on September 1, 1989 and was restated in its entirety effective March 22, 2021. Through March 22, 2021, the Company contracted with Minnesota Life Insurance Company to serve as Custodian of the Plan's assets and with Securian for plan participant recordkeeping and administrative services. Effective March 22, 2021, the Company contracted with John Hancock Life Insurance Company to provide Plan custodial and recordkeeping services. Certain officers of the Company are trustees of the Plan.

In November 2022, the Company was acquired by Solutionz, Inc. As a result of the transaction, the Company amended the Plan to effectively terminate as of October 31, 2022. Effectively as of this date, all the Plan participants were fully vested in their accounts. The Plan is in the process of liquidating and distributing the plan assets as of the date of these financial statements.

**Eligibility**

Generally, an employee is eligible to participate in the Plan upon attaining age 18 and completing two months of service. Plan entry dates are on the first day of the following month upon meeting eligibility.

**Participant Contributions**

Participants may contribute a portion of their annual compensation into a pre-tax deferral account and/or after-tax Roth account, up to the maximum allowed by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitation. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions (rollovers) from other qualified plans.

Effective March 22, 2021, the Plan allows automatic enrollment whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan at a deferral rate of 3% unless the participant affirmatively elects otherwise. Those automatically enrolled will have automatic increases of 1% per year every January 1, up to a maximum rate of 6%.

### **Employer Contributions**

The Company provided a discretionary matching contribution equal to 10% of the first 6% of eligible compensation contributed by participants. The Company may also provide a discretionary profit-sharing contribution for eligible participants; however, no such contribution was made or declared for the period presented.

### **Participant Accounts**

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Company's contributions and, (b) plan earnings, and (c) charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

### **Notes Receivable from Participants**

The Plan allows participants to borrow against their vested account balances. Loans may not be made for less than \$1,000 and may not exceed the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of a participant's vested account balance. The interest rate for loans is based prevailing interest rates as determined by the Plan Administrator until March 2021. After March 2021, interest rate is prime plus 1% at loan origination. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions not to exceed five years unless the note proceeds were used for the purchase of a principal residence. Only one loan can be outstanding at a time for any participant.

### **Investments**

Participants direct the investment of all assets attributable to their account. Each participant designates the percentage of any one or more of their accounts that is to be invested in each of several authorized investment funds designated by the Plan Administrator.

### **Payment of Benefits**

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or termination of employment, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum distribution, equal installments or a partial withdrawal equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account or paid as a direct rollover to an individual retirement account (IRA) or to another employer's tax qualified plan. Active participants may withdraw a portion in the event of undue financial hardship or attainment of age 59 1/2. If a terminated participant's account is \$5,000 or less, the Plan may distribute the account balance to an IRA without prior approval of the participant.

### **Vesting**

Participants are immediately 100% vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's matching contribution is based on years of qualified service. A qualified year of service is attained upon completion of 1,000 hours of service during a plan

year. A participant is vested in the Company's matching contribution based on the following schedule:

#### **Forfeited Accounts**

Generally, a participant's unvested portion of the Company matching contribution is forfeited upon termination of employment. Forfeitures are maintained in a separate account and may be used to pay Plan expenses and reduce matching contributions.

The balance in the forfeiture account was \$3,680 and \$2,538 as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, respectively. During the year ended December 31, 2022, \$3,680 of forfeitures were used to pay Plan expenses.

#### **Administrative Expenses**

Expenses of the Plan, including professional, administrative, and advisory, are generally paid by the Company. Certain administrative expenses are paid by the Plan and allocated on a pro rata basis to participants and are included in these financial statements.

Certain investment management fees and other charges paid to the Custodian are offset against fund performance in the net appreciation (depreciation) section of the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits and are not, therefore, separately reflected as Plan expenses.

#### **Plan Termination Provision**

In connection with the sale of the Company, the Plan was amended to terminate effective October 31, 2022. In accordance with ERISA, all participant accounts became fully vested and nonforfeitable as of November 5, 2022. Contributions to the Plan ceased as of November 5, 2022, however loan repayments continued until participant accounts were liquidated and distributed in full.

### **NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

#### **Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual method of accounting which is in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of

America (GAAP). Employee and employer contributions are recognized in the period that contributions are due.

### **Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that may affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

### **Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

Investments, other than the guaranteed interest account, are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan Administrator determines the Plan's valuation policy utilizing information provided by the Plan Custodian. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements. The guaranteed interest account is fully benefit responsive; therefore, contract value is the relevant measure for reporting purposes because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the contract.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net depreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

### **Payments of Benefits**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

### **Notes Receivable from Participants**

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. As of December 31, 2022 and 2021, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded.

### **NOTE 3 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENT**

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under GAAP are described as follows:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets.
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability.
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in methodologies used at December 31, 2022 and 2021.

*Pooled separate accounts:* Valued by the insurance company at the separate accounts unit value of shares held by the Plan. The underlying securities in pooled separated accounts are fixed income and equity security mutual funds that were listed on national securities exchanges and valued on the basis of closing prices.

**NOTE 4 - GUARANTEED INTEREST ACCOUNT**

The Plan has guaranteed interest account (GIA) with John Hancock and invested in the John Hancock Stable Value Guaranteed Income fund. The guaranteed portfolio is a general account product that provides a stated rate of return and insulates participant accounts from daily fluctuations in the market. Under the terms of the contract, participants may direct permitted withdrawals and/or transfer transactions of all or a portion of their balance in the fund investment option at contract value. Contract value represents contributions plus credited interest, less participant withdrawals and fees. The fund investment option is benefit responsive for participant-initiated transactions. The minimum rate of return is 1.0% and is reset twice a year or quarterly if certain indexes change by more than 2.0%. Withdrawals caused by the Plan may either be paid out immediately, subject to a market value adjustment or at full contract value over a period of five years. The GIA account had a balance of \$288,209 and \$132,756 as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, respectively.

**NOTE 5 - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN'S CUSTODIAN**

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, John Hancock, the Custodian of the Plan, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants reflected on the accompanying Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits as of December 31, 2022 and 2021.
- Net depreciation in fair value, and interest income reflected on the accompanying Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for the year ended December 31, 2022.

**NOTE 6 - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

Certain Plan investments and notes receivable from participants are managed by John Hancock. John Hancock is the Custodian as defined by the Plan; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Administrative expenses paid by the Plan to service providers are considered to be exempt party-in-interest transactions.

**NOTE 7 - TAX STATUS**

The IRS has informed the Plan sponsor by a letter dated June 30, 2020 or the prototype Plan adopted by the Plan, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC.

Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

GAAP requires the Plan Administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**NOTE 8 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan provides for various investment options in any combination of investment securities offered by the Plan. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investments securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term would materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits and the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits.

**NOTE 9 - SUBSEQUENT EVENT**

Management has evaluated the activity of the Plan through October 11, 2023, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, and has determined that no subsequent events have occurred that would require recognition or disclosure in the financial statements or notes to the financial statements except as described in Note 1 the subsequent event related to the plan termination on October 31, 2022.
