To the Investment Committee of
Shepherd Pooled Employer Plan

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the financial statements of Shepherd Pooled Employer Plan (the PEP or Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) as of December 31, 2022, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the PEP (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of and for the year ended December 31, 2022, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting.
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the PEP and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 2 of the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial statements are prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Our opinion is not modified with respect to that matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the PEP's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the PEP's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the PEP's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the PEP's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the PEP's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audit did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of the modified cash basis of accounting.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter

Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) and schedule of delinquent participant contributions as of or for the year ended December 31, 2022, are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements.

The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

December 31, 2022

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Shepherd Pooled Employer Plan (the PEP) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the PEP basic plan document, and the applicable adoption agreement for the participant's employer which has chosen to participate in the PEP (Participating Employer), for a more complete description of the PEP's provisions.

General

The PEP is a pooled employer plan established and administered by Securian Financial, the Pooled Plan Provider (PPP). Securian Financial is an affiliate of Minnesota Life Insurance Company, the PEP's custodian. The PEP was established under the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2019 (SECURE Act) on January 1, 2021. The PEP is a defined contribution plan covering eligible employees of the Participating Employers, and is intended to qualify under Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (IRC), sections 401(a) and 501(a). The PEP is intended to constitute a multiple employer plan, as described under IRC sections 410(a), 411, 413, and 415. Each Participating Employer elects their own provisions related to eligibility, contributions, notes receivable from participants, and payments of benefits. The PEP is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Eligibility

Only those employees of any particular Participating Employer who are designated by the Participating Employer in its adoption agreement as eligible employees shall be eligible to participate in the PEP. Participating Employers may define eligibility requirements based on factors such as age, service, or employee type. Eligible employees shall be eligible to make participant contributions and receive allocations of Participating Employer contributions if and to the extent specified in the applicable adoption agreement or otherwise provided by the PEP.

Transfer of Funds

Upon termination or new entrance of a Participating Employer, funds may be transferred to or from other qualified plans. The entrance of the first Participating Employer occurred in 2022. During the year ended December 31, 2022, transfers into the PEP from other qualified plans totaled \$18,856,086.

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (Continued)

Contributions

Each year, participants may make pre-tax, Roth, and/or after-tax contributions of their annual eligible compensation, as defined by the PEP and Participating Employer adoption agreement, subject to applicable limits established by law. Participating Employers may elect safe harbor or non-safe harbor contribution provisions as well as compensation definitions. Under certain circumstances, eligible employees may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans to the PEP. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the PEP year are eligible to make catch-up contributions.

The Participating Employers in the PEP may elect auto-enrollment and escalation features whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the PEP unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the PEP. Accordingly, the Participating Employers will automatically withhold a defined percentage of an eligible participant's compensation based on the Participating Employer's adoption agreement and their contributions will be invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant.

Under the terms of the Participating Employer adoption agreements, the Participating Employers may elect to make matching contributions, nonelective contributions, prevailing wage contributions, qualified nonelective contributions (QNECs) or qualified matching contributions (QMACs) to the PEP. Participating Employers may also elect to make true-up matching contributions.

Contributions are subject to certain limitations as mandated by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC).

Investment Options

Participants may direct all their contributions among one or more funds subject to the allocation limitations set forth in the PEP. Changes in allocation of future contributions and transfers among funds of presently invested contributions are permitted pursuant to the terms of the Participating Employer adoption agreements.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Participating Employer's contributions and (b) PEP earnings (losses) and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings (losses), account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance.

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (Continued)

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings (losses) thereon. Vesting in the Participating Employer contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of service ranging from immediate to six years graded or two-year cliff vesting for safe harbor contributions, as elected by each Participating Employer.

Forfeited Accounts

As of December 31, 2022, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$192,046. These amounts will be used by the applicable Participating Employers in accordance with the terms of the Participating Employer adoption agreements. In addition, in 2022, administrative expenses were reduced by \$26,601 from forfeited nonvested accounts.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to the maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance, less defaulted loans (if any). The loans are secured by the balances in the participants' accounts and bear interest at rates that range from 4.25% to 8.25%, which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the PEP administrator. The term of the loan may not exceed 5 years or 30 years if the loan proceeds will be used to acquire the principal residence of the participant. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. A participant can only have one loan currently outstanding from the PEP, unless as a result of a conversion from a prior plan, the participant has loans that were transferred to the PEP.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service, death, disability, or retirement, a participant may receive a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or in substantially equal installments or partial withdrawals, as defined by each Participating Employer adoption agreement. If the value of a separated participant's vested balance is less than \$5,000, vested portions will be distributed to the participant without consent. If the distribution is greater than \$0.01, but less than \$5,000, the Plan will pay the distribution in an automatic direct rollover to an individual retirement account. Participants are permitted certain in-service withdrawals from their accounts for financial hardships or attaining age 59½.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the PEP are paid by the PPP or the Participating Employers and are excluded from these financial statements. Loan administration and distribution fees are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. The PEP also pays certain investment advisory and PEP administration fees from PEP assets. Certain investment-related expenses are included in net depreciation of fair value of investments.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The statements of net assets available for benefits and statements of changes in net assets available for benefits are presented on the modified cash basis, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAP). Accordingly, all transactions are reported on the basis of cash receipts and disbursements, with the exception of fair value or contract value of investments held by the custodian.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements is in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting and requires the PEP administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The PEP's Investment Committee determines the PEP's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians, and insurance company. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Net depreciation includes the PEP's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest less amounts defaulted (if any). Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events are events or transactions that occur after year end but before financial statements are issued or are available to be issued. These events and transactions either provide additional evidence about conditions that existed at year end, including the estimates inherent in the process of preparing financial statements (that is, recognized subsequent events), or provide evidence about conditions that did not exist at year end but arose after that date (that is, nonrecognized subsequent events).

The PEP has evaluated subsequent events through October 13, 2023, which was the date that these financial statements were available for issuance and determined that there were no significant nonrecognized subsequent events through that date, except as disclosed in Note 10.

3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Topic 820 are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the PEP has the ability to access at the measurement date.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- a. Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets,
- b. Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets,
- c. Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability,

Level 2: (Continued)

- d. Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value as of December 31, 2022.

Pooled separate accounts: Investments in units of pooled separate accounts held with an insurance company are stated at estimated fair market value and are valued by the insurance company based on the net asset value of units held by the PEP at year end. The net asset value is determined by the insurance company based on the market value of the underlying investments held in the pooled fund.

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the PEP believes its valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

4. CERTIFICATION OF FINANCIAL INFORMATION

The following financial data included in the accompanying financial statements as of and for the year ended December 31, 2022, and the supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2022, has been certified as complete and accurate by Minnesota Life Insurance Company, a qualified institution, and has not been audited by the independent auditors for the PEP: investments at fair value, notes receivable from participants, interest on notes receivable from participants, and net depreciation in fair value of investments.

5. PEP TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the PPP has the right under the PEP to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the PEP subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of PEP termination, participants would become 100% vested in their participating employer contributions. Any unallocated assets of the PEP shall be allocated to participant accounts and distributed in such a manner as the PPP may determine. Additionally, the Participating Employers have the right to transfer the assets attributable to their participants to another plan should the PPP terminate the PEP.

6. TAX STATUS

The PEP adopted a non-standardized pre-approved plan document, which received an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) stated that the non-standardized pre-approved plan document was in compliance with applicable requirements of the IRC. The PEP has not received a determination letter specific to the PEP itself and has been amended since adopting the non-standardized pre-approved plan document; however, the PEP administrator believes that the PEP is designed, and is being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

US GAAP requires management to evaluate tax positions taken by the PEP and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the PEP has taken an uncertain position that more-likely-than-not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The PEP is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

7. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain PEP investments are managed by affiliates of Minnesota Life Insurance Company, the custodian; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest. Fees paid by the PEP for investment management services were included as a reduction of the return earned on each fund. Certain administrative expenses were paid by the PEP or the PPP. The PEP issues loans to participants, which are secured by the vested balance in the participants' accounts. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest. Employees of the PPP provide administrative services to the PEP for which no fees are charged.

8. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The PEP invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis).

For the year ended December 31, 2022, eight Participating Employers individually comprised 5% or more of total contributions, and in the aggregate, these Participating Employers comprised 86% of total contributions. For the year ended December 31, 2022, nine Participating Employers individually comprised 5% or more of transfers in from other qualified plans and in the aggregate, these Participating Employers comprised 93% of transfers in from other qualified plans.

9. PROHIBITED TRANSACTIONS

During 2022, certain Participating Employers failed to remit to the PEP certain employee contributions and loan repayments totaling \$67,592 within the period prescribed by Department of Labor's regulations. Delays in remitting contributions and loan repayments to the PEP were due to administrative errors, and the Participating Employers will make contributions to the affected participants' accounts to compensate those participants for potential lost income due to the delays.

10. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Subsequent to year end, seven Participating Employers have joined the PEP. Related transfers into the PEP from other qualified plans totaled approximately \$2,200,000.

During 2022, Securian Financial was acquired by Standard Insurance Company and the recordkeeping platform conversion is anticipated in early 2024. Additionally, Standard Retirement Services, Inc. became the PPP and recordkeeper of the PEP in 2023.
