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## Independent Auditor's Report

To the Participants and Plan Administrator of  
Perspecta Enterprise Solutions LLC Supplemental Unemployment Benefit Plan

### ***Opinion***

We have audited the financial statements of Perspecta Enterprise Solutions LLC Supplemental Unemployment Benefit Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), which comprise the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits (in liquidation) for the period from January 1, 2023 through July 31, 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2022, and the related notes to the financial statements (the financial statements).

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the changes in net assets available for benefits (in liquidation) for the period from January 1, 2023 through July 31, 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2022 in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAP).

### ***Basis for Opinion***

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

### ***Emphasis of Matter - Terminating Plan and Liquidation Basis of Accounting***

As discussed in Note 4 to the financial statements, the Perspecta Enterprise Solutions LLC decided to terminate the Plan effective July 31, 2023, and Plan management determined that liquidation is imminent. As a result, the Plan changed its basis of accounting from the going-concern basis of accounting used in presenting the 2021 financial statements to the liquidation basis of accounting used in presenting the financial statements for the period from January 1, 2023 through July 31, 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2022. Our opinion is not modified with respect to that matter.

### ***Responsibilities of Plan Management for the Financial Statements***

Plan management (Management) is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with US GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, Management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current Plan instrument, including all Plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

## *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements*

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with US GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

**Note 1 – Description of Plan**

The Perspecta Enterprise Solutions LLC Supplemental Unemployment Benefit Plan (the Plan) was created during the year ended December 31, 2021, and covers certain employees of the Perspecta Enterprise Solutions LLC (the Company) who performed services under the Company's Next Generation Enterprise Network contract with the US Navy (NGEN Employees). When the Government awarded the new NGEN contract to a different service provider, certain NGEN Employees accepted jobs with that service provider and terminated employment with the Company. They are not covered under the Plan. Certain NGEN Employees who were terminated by the Company involuntarily as a result of the loss of the NGEN contract qualify for enhanced post-employment benefits under the Plan. The benefits provided by the Plan, when combined with government unemployment insurance benefits, result in a payments up to the limits specified in the following schedule:

Years of Service	Combined Benefit
Up to 3 years	2 weeks' wages
3 to 5 years	4 weeks' wages
5 to 9 years	5 weeks' wages
9 to 15 years	6 weeks' wages
15 to 20 years	8 weeks' wages
20 years or more	10 weeks' wages maximum

In certain states, the maximum was 26 weeks' wages for certain employees. The payment thresholds in the table above are not guaranteed. If a person becomes employed during the payment period specified in this schedule, the benefits cease (because unemployment benefits cease at that time). If the employee fails or refuses to comply with the ongoing administrative requirements of the plan, they are no longer eligible for benefits.

A trust was created for the benefit of the Plan, but the trust held no assets and the Company paid all benefits. The Plan's financial statements report the payments made by the Company to Plan participants.

**Note 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

***Basis of Accounting***

As disclosed in Note 4, the Company terminated the Plan effective July 31, 2023, and liquidation of the Plan is imminent. As a result, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAP), the Plan has presented the accompanying financial statements using the liquidation basis of accounting.

***Use of Estimates***

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with US GAAP requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

***Employer Contributions***

The amounts paid by the Company for benefits and administrative expenses are reported in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits as employer contributions.

***Return From Participant***

A benefit paid by the Company in a prior period was returned by the participant during the year ended December 31, 2022, and is reported in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits as return from participant.

***Payments to Participant***

The amounts paid by the Company for benefits are reported in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits as payments to participants.

***Administrative Expenses***

The Plan uses a third-party administrator to calculate the benefits to participants, and the related payments were made by the Company. Certain expenses of the Plan, including charges and expenses incurred in connection with the administration of the Plan, are reported as administrative expenses.

***Plan Management's Review of Financial Statements***

In preparing the accompanying financial statements, Plan management has reviewed all known events that have occurred after July 31, 2023, and through October 11, 2023, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued, for inclusion in the financial statements and footnotes.

**Note 3 – Plan Tax Status**

The Plan administrator and the Plan's benefits counsel believe that the trust is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code.

US GAAP requires the plan administrator to evaluate uncertain tax positions taken by the Plan. The financial statement effects of a tax position are recognized when the position is more likely than not, based on the technical merits, to be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken. The Plan has recognized no interest or penalties related to uncertain tax positions. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**Note 4 – Plan Termination**

The Plan was established to provide benefits to a select group of employees affected by the transition of a Company contract to a new service provider. Upon completion of that transition, no further benefits were payable under the Plan, and it was terminated as of July 31, 2023 (the Termination Date). Effective on the Termination Date, no further employer contributions will be made, no further benefits will be paid to Plan participants and no additional administrative costs will be incurred by the Plan.
