NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Brady Enterprises, Inc. 401k Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was adopted by Brady Enterprises, Inc., which includes its wholly owned subsidiary Brady Solutions, Inc., (the "Company" or the "Plan Sponsor") as a defined contribution and profit sharing plan for the exclusive benefit of its eligible employees. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"). The Retirement Plan committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan.

The Plan allows for automatic enrollment. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 5% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated fund until changed by the participant. The deferral amount then increases by 1% each Plan year automatically, not to exceed 10% in total.

Eligibility

All employees of the Company are eligible to participate in the Plan on the first pay period after attaining the age of eighteen.

Contributions

Each calendar year, participants may contribute up to 100% of their pretax annual compensation up to the maximum allowed by the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"), as defined in the Plan. The Plan allows for participants to make catch-up contributions and Roth 401(k) contributions as defined by the IRC. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Company, at its discretion, may elect to contribute matching contributions. In 2022, the Company matched 50% of participant contributions up to 5% of compensation as defined by the Plan.

An additional discretionary profit sharing amount may be contributed at the option of the Company's Board of Directors. For the year ended December 31, 2022, no discretionary profit sharing contributions were made.

Effective in 2021, in accordance with the most recently amended Plan Documents, the Company may make qualified matching contributions and allocate them to non-highly compensated participants to help the Plan remain in compliance with required annual nondiscrimination tests. Participants are 100% vested in these contributions. In 2022, no qualified matching contributions were made to the Plan.

Contributions (Continued)

Effective in 2021, in accordance with the most recently amended Plan Documents, the Company may make discretionary non-elective contributions to participants that complete 1,000 hours of service during the year and are employed by the Company as of the end of the plan year. In 2022, no discretionary non-elective contributions were made to the Plan.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, Company contributions and plan earnings and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's matching and discretionary contributions plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service in accordance with the following schedule:

Vesting in the Company's nonelective contributions plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service in accordance with the following schedule:

Notwithstanding the foregoing, a participant shall be 100% vested in and have a non-forfeitable right to his or her account upon normal retirement age (65), death, or total and permanent disability while in service.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Participants are allowed to borrow a minimum of \$1,000 up to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The notes receivable are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates commensurate with local market rates for similar notes. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions over a period not to exceed five years, unless the loan is for the purchase of a participant's primary residence, in which case the repayment period is not to exceed ten years.

NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (CONTINUED)

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or other reasons, a participant or beneficiary may elect to receive a lump-sum distribution equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account balance, in annual or more frequent installments over a period not to extend beyond the life expectancy of the participant. Distributions are made in the form of cash or direct rollover, or a combination of both, based on participant elections. Withdrawals may be made under certain other circumstances including reaching age 59-1/2 or on account of hardship in accordance with the Plan document.

Hardship Withdrawals

In accordance with a uniform and nondiscriminatory policy adopted by the Plan administrator, a participant may withdraw a portion of his or her vested balance to meet immediate and heavy financial needs as defined by the IRC, subject to certain limitations outlined in the Plan.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures represent the non-vested portion of terminated participants' account balances. Forfeited amounts are used to reduce future employer contributions or plan expenses. As of December 31, 2022 and 2021, there was \$2,195 and \$695, respectively, of forfeitures available to reduce future plan expenses and employer contributions. In 2022, \$18,288 was used to reduce employer contributions.

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires the Plan Sponsor to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits at the date of the financial statements and changes in net assets available for benefits during the year. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are held with Fidelity Management Trust Company, the trustee, and are invested in various mutual funds and a common/collective trust at the participants' direction.

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's 401(k) plan committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and trustee.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition (Continued)

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net depreciation includes the Plan's net gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Fair Value Measurements

U.S. GAAP defines fair value and for certain investments, establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are as follows:

- Level 1 Inputs are quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the reporting entity has the ability to access at the measurement date.

- Level 2 Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as (1) Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets, (2) Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets, (3) Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability, (4) Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of asset or liability.

- Level 3 Unobservable inputs based on the Plan's assessment of the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for all investments measured at fair value, on a recurring basis, as well as the general classification pursuant to the valuation hierarchy. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2022 and 2021, for the Plan's investments.

Fair Value Measurement (Continued)

Mutual funds – The fair value of mutual funds are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded and are considered Level 1 investments in the fair value hierarchy.

Common/collective trust – The common/collective trust is a managed income portfolio that is comprised of investment contracts issued by insurance companies and other financial institutions, fixed income securities, and money market funds that are valued at the NAV of units of the collective trust. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment at an amount different from the reported net asset value. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the common/collective trust, the issuer reserves the right to require 12 months' notification in order to ensure that the securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner. Investments which use NAV as the practical expedient valuation are not included in the fair value hierarchy.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan administrator believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of the certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed as they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2022 and 2021. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a distribution is recorded.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and benefit payments to participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included with the net depreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated all subsequent events through October _____, 2023, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued and has determined that there are no subsequent events, other than those mentioned in Note 7, that require disclosure under Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") Topic 855, *Subsequent Events*.

The plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, the trustee, Fidelity Management Trust Company, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments and notes receivable from participants reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, Schedule H, line 4i - (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2022, and the related investment activity and interest income on notes receivable from participants reflected in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2022. Accordingly, as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's ("DOL's") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, the plan administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the information, except for comparing such information with the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

NOTE 6. RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company, the trustee as defined by the Plan. Therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for investment management services are net against net depreciation in fair value of the investments, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. The Plan Sponsor pays directly any other fees related to the Plan's operations. Notes receivable from participants are also considered party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE 7. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100 % vested in their accounts.

As a result of a reduction of the Plan Sponsor's workforce in 2022, the Plan experienced a partial plan termination as defined by ERISA. Under ERISA, a partial plan termination may occur if a significant percentage of the Plan participants are terminated because of an action taken by the Plan Sponsor. If a partial plan termination occurs, full vesting of the employer matching contribution is required for the affected participants, but the remaining participants' vesting continues to be determined per the Plan provisions.

Subsequent to December 31, 2022, the Plan Sponsor further reduced its workforce in April 2023. Participants will become 100% vested in their accounts as a result of this reduction of the Plan Sponsor's workforce in 2023.

NOTE 8. TAX STATUS

The Plan has adopted the most recent Fidelity Defined Contribution Plan. The Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") has determined and informed the Plan by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the most recent Fidelity Pre-Approved Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Code. The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and therefore believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability or asset if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or asset or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 9. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rates, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 10. RECONCILIATION WITH FORM 5500

Schedule H Parts I and II of Form 5500 are in substantial agreement with the statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2022 and 2021 and the Statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2022, and there are no reconciling items.
