NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Linesight 401 (K) Plan, (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the plan's provision.

General

The plan is a defined contribution plan covering eligible employees. The plan is subject to the provisions of ERISA. The Plan excludes Union member and independent contractor.

Contributions

Participants may contribute by electing under a salary reduction agreement to have their compensation reduced by the amount equal to the dollar amount or percentage of the contributing participant's compensation not to exceed the limits imposed by Code Section 401(k), 402(g), 404 and 415.

Participant Accounts

Each year participants may contribute a portion of their compensation not to exceed the maximum allowable IRC 402(g) limit of \$20,500 for 2022. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also rollover amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans.

The employer may make a discretionary match based on a percentage of each qualifying contributing participant's elective deferral.

The maximum IRC 415 limit for total contributions made on behalf of a participant (deferrals and employer contributions) is \$61,000. Catch-up contributions can be made in excess of this limit.

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the plan.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 47.5 percent of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate, determined quarterly is set at 1 percent above the prime rate, as determined. Principal and interest is paid ratably through monthly payroll deductions.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the company's matching contributions is based on years of continuous service as such:

Forfeitures

Forfeitures attributable to employer contributions shall be used to offset plan expenses and fund the employer contribution for the Plan year following the year such forfeitures occur.

Payment of Benefits

Participants, or their beneficiaries, are eligible to receive payment of benefits in the event of the participant's retirement, death, disability, or termination or the termination of the Plan. Benefits are distributed according to provisions set forth in the plan document. A participant who incurs a Separation from Service and who will receive distribution before attaining the later of age 62 or Normal Retirement Age. Benefits are paid under various options as defined in the plan document such options include lump sum, partial distribution and roll over distribution.

The plan also allows for in-service distributions upon attainment of age 59½ for any reason, and before age 59½ due to financial hardship and disability, as defined in the plan document.

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Presentation

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting. Employer contributions and income from investments are recorded when they are earned. Employee contributions are recorded when withheld from pay. Expenses are recorded in accounting period in which they are incurred.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded in the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the plan's gains and losses on investment bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Income Recognition

The Plan presents in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits the net appreciation or depreciation in the fair value of its investments, which consists of realized gains or losses and the unrealized appreciation or depreciation on those investments. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a settlement date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Notes receivable from participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

Payments of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Plan Expenses

Professional fees incurred to operate the Plan, such as attorney fees and audit fees are paid directly by the Plan Sponsor. Other fees and expenses related to the day to day operations of the Plan are paid by the Plan. These fees are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events

The plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 22, 2023 the date of the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 as described as follows:

Level 1 *Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the plan has the ability to access.*

Level 2 *Inputs to the valuation methodology include*

- *quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;*
- *quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;*
- *inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;*
- *inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.*

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 *Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.*

The assets or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for asset measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2022 and 2021.

Common Collective Trust Fund: The initial pricing input is the quoted price obtained for the underlying mutual fund which is then adjusted to apply the expense factor disclosed in the annuity contract. The formula-calculated unit value is then compared to an accounting-driven unit value the following morning. The accounting unit value is determined in a manner similar to a mutual fund NAV calculation: dividing the net assets by the number of units outstanding. Any discrepancies between the two-unit values are resolved to ensure the recordkeeping system reflects the accurate value for the day.

Pooled Separate Accounts: The initial pricing input is the quoted price obtained for the underlying mutual fund which is then adjusted to apply the expense factor disclosed in the annuity contract. The formula-calculated unit value is then compared to an accounting-driven unit value the following morning. The accounting unit value is determined in a manner similar to a mutual fund NAV calculation: dividing the net assets by the number of units outstanding. Any discrepancies between the two-unit values are resolved to ensure the recordkeeping system reflects the accurate value for the day.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 6. RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Plan investments at the end of the year are funds managed by Principal Life Insurance Company, the custodian` as defined by the Plan, and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE 7. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the company has the right under the plan to discontinue its operations at any time and to terminate the plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of the plan termination, participants will become 100 percent vested in their accounts. Any unallocated assets of the plan shall be allocated to participant accounts and distributed in such a manner as the company may determine.

NOTE 8. PLAN AMENDMENT AND TAX STATUS

The Company has not obtained an IRS Determination Letter for the restated plan that states the Plan and its related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 9. RISK AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant's account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 10. NON-EXEMPT PARTY-IN-TEREST TRANSACTIONS

For Plan year 2022 the Plan Sponsor did not remit certain participant contributions to the Trustee in a timely manner based on when contributions were withheld from participant paychecks as required under the Department of Labor Regulation §2510.3-102. The Company filed Form 5330 to report and pay an excise tax with respect to 2022 late remittances, and participant accounts were credited with the amount of investment income that would have been earned had the participant contributions been remitted on a timely basis.
