The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. ### **Emphasis of Matter**

As discussed in Note 1 to the financial statements, the Plan merged into the University of Vermont Health Network 403(b) Retirement Savings Plan effective December 31, 2022. As a result, subsequent to the merger the Plan is no longer a going concern.

### **Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements**

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the Plan; and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

### **Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audits of the Financial Statements**

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audits.

### 1. Description of Plan

The following description of Porter Medical Center 403(b) Retirement Savings Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

#### (a) General

The Plan, adopted on January 1, 2007, is a tax-exempt, defined contribution retirement plan sponsored by Porter Medical Center, Inc. (“PMC” or “Hospital”). All employees of PMC and its related entities, including Porter Hospital, Inc. and Helen Porter Nursing Home, Inc. were eligible to participate in the Plan. The Plan was subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Effective December 30, 2022, the Plan merged into the University of Vermont Health Network 403(b) Retirement Savings Plan (UVMHN Plan).

#### (b) Contributions

Participants could contribute up to 100% of pre-tax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. The maximum amount that participants could contribute on a pre-tax basis was limited by provisions of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC).

Employees became eligible for PMC contributions after completing 1,000 hours of service and attaining age 21 or older. PMC would make a contribution on participants’ eligible compensation based on the following schedule:

Contributions were subject to certain limitations.

#### (c) Vesting

Participants were immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the PMC contributions and earnings thereon was based on years of service. A participant vests according to the schedule below:

#### (d) Forfeiture Accounts

When a participant terminated employment prior to fully vesting, unvested employer contributions and the net investment income thereon were forfeited. Forfeited balances of terminated participants' nonvested accounts were to be used to reduce future employer contributions. During the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021, participants forfeited \$62,450 and \$118,056, respectively. As of December 31, 2022 and 2021, there were \$0 and \$622,977, respectively, in forfeitures available. There were \$685,427 of forfeitures transferred to UVMHN Plan on December 30, 2022.

#### (e) Participant Accounts

Each participant's account was credited with the participant's contributions, PMC's contributions, and an allocation of Plan earnings. The account was also charged with an allocation of investment losses and certain administrative expense. Allocations were based on participants' earnings or account balances, as defined.

The Plan allowed participants to direct their individual accounts to various investment options within the Plan.

#### (f) Payment of Benefits

Participants would become eligible to receive their vested account balances upon retirement (normal retirement age is 65), death, disability, or termination. Participants could withdraw their account balances upon attaining age 59 ½. Participants could also be subject to involuntary cash-outs if the participant separated from service at a time when the vested portion of the account balance had a value not greater than \$5,000. Participants would receive their benefit payments in a single lump-sum payment.

#### (g) Notes Receivable

The Plan permitted participants to borrow from their accounts. Participants could borrow up to 50% of their individual account balance, not to exceed \$50,000. The minimum loan was \$1,000. All notes receivable would bear an interest rate of prime plus 1% and were to be repaid within five years unless the note receivable is for a primary residence. Participants were limited to one note receivable outstanding at any given time.

### 2. Summary of Accounting Policies

#### (a) Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual basis of accounting.

#### (b) Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities, at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### (c) Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments were reported at fair value, except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which was reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determined the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, trustee, and insurance company.

Contract value is the relevant measure for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Purchase and sales of securities were recorded on trade-date basis. Interest and dividend income was recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments included the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

#### (d) Administrative Expenses

Expenses related to the Plan were paid either by the Plan or the Hospital.

#### (e) Benefit Payments

Benefit payments were recorded upon distribution.

#### (f) Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through September 22, 2023, the date the Plan's financial statements were available to be issued.

### 3. Investment Contract

The Plan had entered into a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract. The custodian maintained the contributions in a general account. The account was credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer was contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that was guaranteed to the Plan.

Because the guaranteed investment contract was fully benefit-responsive, contract value was the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contract. The guaranteed investment contract was presented on the face of the statements of net assets available for benefits at contract value. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawals or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There were no reserves against contract value for credit risk of contract issuer or otherwise. The crediting interest rate was based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer. Such interest rates were reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting.

Certain events limited the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events included the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Hospital or other Hospital events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. Furthermore, certain events allowed the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Examples of such events include (a) an uncured breach of the Plan's investment guidelines, (b) a material amendment to the contract without the issuer's consent, (c) a violation of a material obligation under the contract, (d) a material misrepresentation. The Plan administrator did not believe that any events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with plan participants are probable of occurring.

### 4. Fair Value Measurements

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America establish a framework for measuring fair value. The framework provides a hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There had been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2022 and 2021.

*Mutual Funds and Money Market Funds* – Valued at quoted market prices by the Plan at year-end. These investments are considered Level 1 and total \$0 and \$48,590,798 at December 31, 2022 and 2021, respectively.

The preceding method described would produce a fair value calculation that would not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believed its valuation methods were appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could have resulted in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

### 5. Information Certified by the Plan's Custodian

The Plan administrator had elected the method of compliance as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosures under ERISA. Accordingly, Fidelity Management Trust Company, the custodian of the Plan, had certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, and the related investment activity reflected in the statements of changes in net asset available for benefits for the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021.

### 6. Plan Termination

The Plan merged with the University of Vermont Health Network 403(b) Retirement Savings Plan effective December 30, 2022.

### 7. Income Tax Status

The Plan had not obtained a determination letter. The Plan is required to operate in conformity with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan administrator believed that the Plan was currently designed and was being operated in compliance with applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes had been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan had taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authorities. The Plan administrator had analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and had concluded that as of December 31, 2022, there were no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan was subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there were currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan was no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to December 31, 2019.

### 8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invested in various investment securities. Investments securities were exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it was at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities would occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

### 9. Related Party Transactions

The Plan had several service providers who are considered parties-in-interest under ERISA.
