Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of the Friendship Senior Options, NFP 401(k) Savings & Retirement Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control related matters that we identified during the audit.

The supplemental schedules of assets (held at end of year) and delinquent participant contributions as of and for the year ended December 31, 2022 are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Friendship Senior Options, NFP 401(k) Savings & Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan originally effective January 1, 1986. The Plan has been amended throughout the years to comply with tax legislation. The Plan was most recently restated effective January 1, 2021. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. The Board of Directors is responsible for the oversight of the Plan, determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, and monitors investment performance.

Eligibility

Employees of the Friendship Senior Options, NFP (the Employer) shall be eligible to participate in the Plan after attaining age 21. Employees are permitted to make pre-tax 401(k) or Roth contributions upon completion of 60 days of service and are eligible for Employer matching contributions upon completion of one year of service or working a minimum of 1,000 hours per year. Employees enter the Plan on the first day of the quarter following the completion of the eligibility requirements.

Contributions

The Plan includes a salary deferral arrangement allowed under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Eligible participants are permitted to elect to have a portion, limited by Plan provisions, of their eligible compensation contributed as pre-tax 401(k) or Roth contributions to the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. The Employer may elect to make a discretionary matching contribution. For the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021, the Employer matching contribution was suspended.

Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans or certain individual retirement accounts (IRA)s (rollover). Participants direct the investment of contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options at any time. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Employer's matching contribution, and an allocation of Plan earnings or losses. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, or participant transactions, as defined. Income is allocated daily based on the shares in the participant's account. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided by the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and Employer contributions, plus actual earnings thereon.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Benefit Payments

Upon termination of service, death, disability, or retirement (age 65), a participant may elect to receive the value of the vested interest in their account in the form of a lump sum distribution or an annuity. The Plan allows for in-service distributions if a participant reaches retirement age (65) and hardship distributions from the deferral account subject to Plan provisions. If a participant terminates employment and the participant's account balance does not exceed \$1,000, the Plan administrator will authorize the benefit payment without the participant's consent. The Plan requires all mandatory distributions of account balances between \$1,000 and \$5,000 to be rolled over to IRA accounts.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeited accounts are first used to reduce administrative expenses and then are used to reduce future Employer contributions. Forfeited accounts as of December 31, 2022 and 2021 totaled \$2,011 and \$1,950, respectively. There were no forfeitures used to pay administrative expenses or used to reduce Employer contributions for the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021.

NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Board of Directors determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the Plan's investment adviser and insurance company. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2022 or 2021. Delinquent notes receivable are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Employer and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and benefit payments are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) of fair value of investments.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events

In preparing these financial statements, the Plan has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure through October 12, 2023, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 CERTIFICATION OF INVESTMENT INFORMATION

Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company, the insurance company of the Plan, has supplied the Plan administrator with a certification as to the completeness and accuracy of the investment information reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the supplemental schedules of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2022.

NOTE 4 FAIR VALUE OF INVESTMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for instruments measured at fair value and their classification in the valuation hierarchy. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2022 and 2021.

Pooled Separate Accounts: Valued using the net asset value (NAV) of units, as determined by the insurance company. NAV is a readily determinable fair value and is the basis for current transactions.

NOTE 5 CONTRACTS WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

In 2003, the Plan entered into a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company, the insurance company of the Plan (formerly ING Life Insurance and Annuity Company). Effective August 1, 2017, the original investment contract was frozen to new deposits and a new contract was entered into with Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company. The insurance company maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 3% under the old contract and 1% under the new contract. The crediting rate is reviewed on an annual basis for resetting. The crediting rate under the old contract was 3% for the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021. The crediting rate under the new contract was 1% for the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021. The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

NOTE 6 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 7 PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

NOTE 8 PLAN TAX STATUS

The IRS has determined and informed the Employer by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan is designed in accordance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, they believe that the Plan is qualified, and is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 9 PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Plan investments are managed by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (Voya). Voya is the insurance company as defined by the Plan and, therefore, the investment transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for administrative services were \$2,950 and \$4,950 for the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021, respectively.

Certain Plan assets are invested in pooled separate accounts which invest in shares of mutual funds. Voya has chosen not to complete and submit an Annual Report (Form 5500) reporting the pooled separate accounts as "direct filing entities" with the Department of Labor (DOL). Therefore, the Plan's interest in the pooled separate accounts will not be reported as an interest in pooled separate accounts in the Plan's Annual Return/Reports (Form 5500) prepared and submitted for the subject audit year. However, the financial statements for the Plan reflect its representative value in the pooled separate accounts.

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of the Friendship Senior Options, NFP 401(k) Savings & Retirement Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Friendship Senior Options, NFP 401(k) Savings & Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan originally effective January 1, 1986. The Plan has been amended throughout the years to comply with tax legislation. The Plan was most recently restated effective January 1, 2021. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. The Board of Directors is responsible for the oversight of the Plan, determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, and monitors investment performance.

Eligibility

Employees of the Friendship Senior Options, NFP (the Employer) shall be eligible to participate in the Plan after attaining age 21. Employees are permitted to make pre-tax 401(k) or Roth contributions upon completion of 60 days of service and are eligible for Employer matching contributions upon completion of one year of service or working a minimum of 1,000 hours per year. Employees enter the Plan on the first day of the quarter following the completion of the eligibility requirements.

Contributions

The Plan includes a salary deferral arrangement allowed under Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Eligible participants are permitted to elect to have a portion, limited by Plan provisions, of their eligible compensation contributed as pre-tax 401(k) or Roth contributions to the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. The Employer may elect to make a discretionary matching contribution. For the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021, the Employer matching contribution was suspended.

Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans or certain individual retirement accounts (IRA)s (rollover). Participants direct the investment of contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options at any time. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Employer's matching contribution, and an allocation of Plan earnings or losses. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, or participant transactions, as defined. Income is allocated daily based on the shares in the participant's account. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided by the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and Employer contributions, plus actual earnings thereon.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Benefit Payments

Upon termination of service, death, disability, or retirement (age 65), a participant may elect to receive the value of the vested interest in their account in the form of a lump sum distribution or an annuity. The Plan allows for in-service distributions if a participant reaches retirement age (65) and hardship distributions from the deferral account subject to Plan provisions. If a participant terminates employment and the participant's account balance does not exceed \$1,000, the Plan administrator will authorize the benefit payment without the participant's consent. The Plan requires all mandatory distributions of account balances between \$1,000 and \$5,000 to be rolled over to IRA accounts.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeited accounts are first used to reduce administrative expenses and then are used to reduce future Employer contributions. Forfeited accounts as of December 31, 2022 and 2021 totaled \$2,011 and \$1,950, respectively. There were no forfeitures used to pay administrative expenses or used to reduce Employer contributions for the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021.

NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Board of Directors determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the Plan's investment adviser and insurance company. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2022 or 2021. Delinquent notes receivable are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Employer and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and benefit payments are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) of fair value of investments.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events

In preparing these financial statements, the Plan has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure through October 12, 2023, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 CERTIFICATION OF INVESTMENT INFORMATION

Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company, the insurance company of the Plan, has supplied the Plan administrator with a certification as to the completeness and accuracy of the investment information reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the supplemental schedules of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2022.

NOTE 4 FAIR VALUE OF INVESTMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for instruments measured at fair value and their classification in the valuation hierarchy. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2022 and 2021.

Pooled Separate Accounts: Valued using the net asset value (NAV) of units, as determined by the insurance company. NAV is a readily determinable fair value and is the basis for current transactions.

NOTE 5 CONTRACTS WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

In 2003, the Plan entered into a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company, the insurance company of the Plan (formerly ING Life Insurance and Annuity Company). Effective August 1, 2017, the original investment contract was frozen to new deposits and a new contract was entered into with Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company. The insurance company maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 3% under the old contract and 1% under the new contract. The crediting rate is reviewed on an annual basis for resetting. The crediting rate under the old contract was 3% for the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021. The crediting rate under the new contract was 1% for the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021. The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

NOTE 6 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 7 PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

NOTE 8 PLAN TAX STATUS

The IRS has determined and informed the Employer by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan is designed in accordance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, they believe that the Plan is qualified, and is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 9 PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The Plan investments are managed by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company (Voya). Voya is the insurance company as defined by the Plan and, therefore, the investment transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for administrative services were \$2,950 and \$4,950 for the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021, respectively.

NOTE 10 RECONCILIATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS TO FORM 5500

Certain Plan assets are invested in pooled separate accounts which invest in shares of mutual funds. Voya has chosen not to complete and submit an Annual Report (Form 5500) reporting the pooled separate accounts as "direct filing entities" with the Department of Labor (DOL). Therefore, the Plan's interest in the pooled separate accounts will not be reported as an interest in pooled separate accounts in the Plan's Annual Return/Reports (Form 5500) prepared and submitted for the subject audit year. However, the financial statements for the Plan reflect its representative value in the pooled separate accounts.

NOTE 11 NONEXEMPT TRANSACTION

The Employer failed to remit a participant contribution for one pay period during the year ended December 31, 2021 within the timeframe prescribed by the Department of Labor (DOL). This is deemed to be a prohibited transaction in accordance with ERISA and the IRC. The Employer corrected the prohibited transaction during the year ended December 31, 2022 as prescribed by the DOL.

NOTE 12 FINANCIAL CONDITION OF THE PLAN SPONSOR

The Employer, Friendship Senior Options, NFP, has filed for bankruptcy effective in June of 2023 due to financial hardships experienced during the COVID-19 pandemic. No formal action has taken place related to the operations of the Plan, and there is no intention to terminate the Plan as of October 12, 2023.
