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### Note A – Description of Plan

The following description of Classic Aire Care, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

#### General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of Classic Aire Care, Holdings Inc. and its participating Employers (the “Company” or “Employer”). The Plan was formed and adopted on January 1, 2000 and most recently restated effective January 1, 2020. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan immediately if they are at least 21 years of age. Employees may enter the Plan immediately coinciding with or following the date eligibility requirements are satisfied. Nonresident aliens and union employees whose employment is governed by a collective bargaining agreement under which retirement benefits were the subject of good faith bargaining are excluded from participating in the Plan.

Effective January 1, 2022, the entry date for employer safe harbor match and non-elective contributions was changed to the first day of each quarter. Also, the Plan was amended to include the employees of Weis Comfort Systems and for service with Courtney Heating & Cooling and Weis Comfort Systems to be treated as service with the Company.

The Plan authorized a merger with the Heartland Home Services, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan & Trust effective November 30, 2022. The Plan had a black out period from January 9, 2023 and the Plan assets were transferred on January 17, 2023.

#### Administration

The accounting records are maintained by the Company. The Plan's assets are held and managed by John Hancock Life Insurance Company (the “Custodian”). Contributions are held by the Custodian, who invests cash received, interest and dividend income, as directed by the participant, and makes distributions to participants.

#### Contributions

Participants may contribute up to 100% of their pre-tax annual compensation, as defined, subject to limitations imposed by the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). The maximum participant deferral for the period from January 1, 2023 to January 17, 2023 was \$22,500. A participant who has attained the age of 50 may also make catch up contributions, subject to IRS limitations of \$6,500 for the period from January 1, 2023 to January 17, 2023. Participants may also make post-tax Roth deferral contributions to the Plan. For the period from January 9, 2023 to January 17, 2023, the Plan was preparing for the merger and participants were not allowed to contribute to the Plan.

The Company may also make additional matching contributions at their discretion. During the period from January 1, 2023 to January 17, 2023, the Company made no discretionary match. To be eligible for discretionary matching contributions, the participant must have 1,000 or more hours of service in the Plan year. The Company also has the option to make profit sharing contributions. Participants must be employed on the last day of the year and have completed at least 1,000 hours of service to receive a profit sharing contribution except in the year a disability or death occurred. All Company contributions are invested into the various investment options of the Plan in accordance with the participants' contribution allocation elections. No profit sharing contribution was declared for the period from January 1, 2023 to January 17, 2023.

#### Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of the Company's contribution, if any, and Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations of Plan earnings or losses are based on each participant's investment fund balance in proportion to the total investment fund balance. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account.

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### Note A – Description of Plan (continued)

#### Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their salary deferral contributions, rollover contributions, and Employees safe harbor contribution, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the remainder of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. Participants are credited with a year of service for years with at least 1,000 hours worked.

A participant is 100% vested in the event of death, disability, or for non-elective contributions after six years of credit service as follows:

#### Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account, or other acceptable collateral, and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator. The maximum note repayment period is five years unless the note is for the purchase of a primary residence in which case the repayment schedule may be for a term in excess of five years. Principal and interest payments with respect to the notes are credited solely to the account of the borrowing participant from which the note was made.

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. In the event of default, the unpaid portion of the participant's loan will be treated as a taxable distribution as of the first day of the second calendar quarter following the calendar quarter in which the participant failed to make a required installment payment.

#### Distribution of Benefits

After age 65, upon termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account or installments paid over various periods, as defined in the Plan agreement, less any applicable taxes. Employees may request a hardship withdrawal from their accounts using only pre-tax employee deferral balances for distribution. Participants with less than \$5,000 in their account are automatically distributed upon termination.

#### Forfeitures

Forfeited balances of terminated participants' non-vested accounts are used to reduce future employer contributions. The Company used approximately \$0 of forfeitures during the period from January 1, 2023 to January 17, 2023. The Company had a forfeiture balance remaining of approximately \$0 and \$9,000 as of January 17, 2023 and 2022, respectively.

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### Note B – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

#### Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements are presented on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“US GAAP”).

#### Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with US GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and the changes in net assets available for benefits and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

#### Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes both realized gains and losses and unrealized appreciation and appreciation in the market value of investments. Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recognized when earned. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

#### Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

#### Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Employer. Expenses that are paid by the Employer are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant’s account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

#### Fair Value Measurements

The Financial Accounting Standards Board (“FASB”) has established a framework for measuring fair value in ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements*. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described below:

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used from the period January 1, 2023 to January 17, 2023.

*Pooled separate accounts:* Valued at the net asset value ("NAV") provided by the custodian. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying assets owned by the trust, minus its liabilities, divided by the number of units outstanding. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. There were no unfunded commitments to purchase investments for the period January 1, 2023 to January 17, 2023. Participant-directed redemptions have no restrictions and are recorded at the end of every business day.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date. Investments measured using the NAV as a practical expedient are exempt from being presented in the fair value hierarchy. As all of the Plan's investments are exempt from the fair value hierarchy, the table has been excluded.

### Note C – Certified Investments

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at January 17, 2023 and December 31, 2022, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the period from January 1, 2023 to January 17, 2023, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by the Custodian, a qualified institution. As of January 17, 2023 and December 31, 2022, and for the period from January 1, 2023 to January 17, 2023, the Plan Administrator instructed the auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the information certified by the Custodian, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements, as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

### Note D – Income Tax Status

The Plan has received a determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated June 30, 2020 stating that the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) of the IRC and, therefore, the related trust is exempt from taxation. Subsequent to the issuance of the determination letter, the Plan was amended. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain its qualification. The Plan Administrator believes the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan, as amended, is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

The Plan Administrator evaluated the Plan's tax positions and concluded that the Plan had maintained its tax-exempt status and had taken no uncertain tax positions that require adjustment to the financial statements. Therefore, no provision or liability for income taxes has been included in the accompanying financial statements. The Plan is no longer subject to examination by taxing authorities for years prior to 2020.

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### **Note E – Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

### **Note F – Parties-In-Interest Transactions**

Section 3(14) of ERISA defines a party-in-interest to include, among others, fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, or an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan. Certain Plan investments are mutual funds and guaranteed interest contracts managed by the Custodian. Transactions related to these investments qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Notes receivable from participants are also considered to be party-in-interest transactions because they are transacted with Plan participants. Fees paid to parties-in-interest for services amounted to approximately \$0 during the period from January 1, 2023 to January 17, 2023.

### **Note G - Reconciliation of Financial Statements to Form 5500**

The Plan holds investments in pooled separate accounts, which is how they are reported on Form 5500, Schedule D, DFE/Participating Plan Information. Plan number "000" has been used to report these investments on Schedule D because the Custodian has not filed a Form 5500 directly with the Department of Labor for these investments. As such, the Plan's interest in such investments cannot be included in Schedule H, line 1c(10). Instead, the Plan's interest in the underlying assets of the pooled separate accounts must be allocated and reported in the appropriate categories on a line-by-line basis. Therefore, these investments are reflected as mutual funds on Form 5500, Schedule H, line 1c(13) and line 1c(9), respectively, but as pooled separate accounts for financial statement purposes.

### **Note H – Subsequent Events**

Subsequent events have been evaluated through October 3, 2023 which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
