### **Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit of the Financial Statements**

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Quik Pick Express 401(k) Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for plan benefits as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for plan benefits for the year then ended December 31, 2022, and the related notes to the financial statements.

As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, and for the year ended December 31, 2022, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### **Opinion**

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

As discussed in Note 8 to the financial statements, the Plan Sponsor elected to subsequently merge the Plan into the Custom Goods, LLC Consolidated 401(k) Plan effective January 1, 2023. All plan assets were transferred to the Custom Goods, LLC Consolidated 401(k) Plan on January 6, 2023. Our opinion has not been modified with respect to this matter.

### **Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements**

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are issued or available to be issued.

## NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

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### NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Quik Pick Express 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

#### General

The Plan is a defined-contribution plan established October 1, 2014 by Quik Pick Express, LLC (the “Employer”) under the provision of Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan provides for a qualified cash or deferred arrangement as described in Section 401(k) of the IRC, for the benefit of eligible employees of the Employer. The Plan is administered by the Employer and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA). Minnesota Life Insurance Company (the “Custodian”) is responsible for the custody of the Plan’s assets. Tom Boyle, the Trustee, is responsible for the management of the Plan’s assets. Securian Retirement serves as the Plan’s Recordkeeper.

#### Eligibility

Any employee who has attained age 18 and completed six months of service is eligible to participate in the Plan, with the exception of leased employees. Participation in the Plan may begin the first day of the Plan-year quarter, following completion of eligibility requirements.

#### Participant Contributions

Participants may elect to contribute, on a pretax basis, up to one hundred percent (100%) of their eligible compensation, in an amount not in excess of the maximum allowed by the IRC (\$20,500 for 2022). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make additional catch-up contributions (\$6,500 for 2022). Participants may also make contributions to the Plan on an after-tax basis, as Roth deferrals, as defined in the Plan agreement and subject to the limitations under the IRC as listed above. Participants may also rollover amounts representing distributions from other qualified benefit or contribution plans.

#### Employer Contributions

The Employer may make discretionary contributions to match each participant’s elective contribution. The Employer may also make additional discretionary profit-sharing contributions to the Plan in one or more installment(s). The Employer also makes non-elective safe harbor contributions of 100% of a participant’s elective deferral not to exceed 3% of the participants’ eligible compensation, plus 50% of the amount exceeding 3% of the participant’s compensation but does not exceed 5% of the participant’s eligible compensation. No additional discretionary contributions were made for the Plan year ended December 31, 2022.

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### NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (Continued)

#### Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions, safe harbor contributions, and rollover contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting of Employer discretionary matching and profit sharing contributions are based upon the participant's continuous years of service with the Employer as follows:

#### Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of the Employer's contribution and Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses to the extent that were not paid by the Employer. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

#### Investment Options

Participants may direct their contribution and Employer contributions as desired in any of several investment options offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options any time throughout the year via the Internet website or by using the automated telephone system offered by the Custodian.

#### Notes from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or fifty percent (50%) of their account balance, whichever is less. Loan terms range from one (1) to five (5) years, except for loans related to the purchase of a primary residence. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate that a bank or other professional lender would charge for making a loan in a similar circumstance. The outstanding loans bear interest rates of 2.53% to 4.05% as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, and mature through May 2027. Principal and interest are paid ratably through ACH payments directly from the Participant's checking account and not through payroll deductions. Participants may only have one (1) loan for the purpose of a primary residence and one (1) loan for any other purpose.

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### NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (Continued)

#### Benefit Payments

Upon termination of employment with the Employer, a participant will receive a lump sum disbursement if his or her vested account balance is \$5,000 or less. The participant is entitled to receive a lump sum amount, direct transfer to another qualified plan, installments or partial withdrawals. In the event of death or total and permanent disability, a participant's beneficiary or the participant is entitled to the total value of the participant's account. In-service distributions may be made from fully vested accounts for currently employed participants who have attained age 59 ½. Hardship withdrawals are also permitted if certain criteria are met.

#### Financial Hardship Distributions

The Plan allows hardship withdrawals in accordance with IRS regulations. Among other things, the withdrawal must be necessary in light of immediate and heavy financial needs of the participant and is limited to certain purposes.

#### Forfeitures

Plan forfeitures represent the non-vested portion of terminated participants' account balances. Forfeitures may be used to pay Plan expenses and reduce Employer contributions. During the Plan year ended December 31, 2022 and 2021, \$0 and \$183 of forfeitures were used to reduce Employer contributions, respectively. As of December 31, 2022 and 2021, all forfeitures were fully allocated.

#### Administrative Expenses

The Plan pays substantially all administrative expenses of the Plan and allocates expenses proportionately to each Participant, with the exception of certain transactional fees, as defined in the Plan document. Expenses that are paid by the Employer are excluded from these financial statements.

### NOTE 2 – SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of Presentation

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan have been prepared in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

#### Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments in pooled separate accounts are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Management fees charged to the Plan for investments are based on assets invested and are deducted on a daily basis. Management fees are reflected as a reduction of investment return for such investments.

#### Notes from Participants

Notes from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued unpaid interest. Interest income is recognized when earned. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document. As of December 31, 2022 and 2021, there were \$0 and \$7,141 delinquent participant loans, respectively. No allowance for credit losses have been recorded as of December 31, 2022 and 2021.

#### Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

### NOTE 3 – INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN'S CUSTODIAN

The Plan's management has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Securian Retirement, the recordkeeper of the Plan as agent for Minnesota Life Insurance Company, the custodian of the Plan, has certified the completeness and accuracy of all investments and notes from participants reflected on the accompanying statements of net assets available for plan benefits as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, and the related investment activity and interest income on notes from participants reflected in the statement of changes in net assets available for plan benefits for the year ended December 31, 2022, and the assets reflected on the supplemental schedule, Schedule H, Line 4i, Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2022.

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### NOTE 4 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

FASB ASC Topic 820, “Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures” (ASC 820), establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are described below:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets,
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets,
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability,
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset’s or liability’s fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2022 and 2021.

*Pooled separate accounts:* Units held in pooled separate accounts (PSA) are valued using the net asset value (NAV) practical expedient of the PSA as reported by the account managers. The NAV practical expedient is based on the fair value of the underlying assets owned by the PSA, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of units outstanding. The NAV practical expedient of a PSA is calculated based on a compilation of primary observable market information. The PSA have a daily redemption frequency, no redemption period or restrictions and have no unfunded commitments.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

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#### **NOTE 5 – RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

Certain Plan transactions qualify as exempt “party-in-interest” transactions permitted by the United States Department of Labor (DOL) Rules and Regulations. The Employer and Plan Administrator are also a party-in-interest with respect to the Plan. Fees paid by the Plan to the Custodian amounted to \$4,922 for the year ended December 31, 2022. Notes from participants and the related interest income of \$3,827 are also considered related-party transactions.

#### **NOTE 6 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities, including pooled separate accounts. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants’ account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for plan benefits and statement of changes in net assets available for plan benefits.

#### **NOTE 7 – FEDERAL INCOME TAX STATUS**

Effective March 31, 2014, the Plan adopted a volume submitter plan sponsored by Minnesota Life Insurance Company. The volume submitter plan has received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) as to the volume submitter plan’s qualified status. The volume submitter plan opinion letter has been relied upon by this Plan. Therefore, no provision for income tax has been included in the Plan’s financial statements.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognizes a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable authorities. Plan management has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that, as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, respectively, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability, asset, or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

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### **NOTE 8 – PLAN MERGER**

In November 2021, the Plan Sponsor was acquired by Custom Goods, LLC. On January 1, 2023, the Plan was merged with the Custom Goods, LLC Consolidated 401(k) Plan, with Fidelity Workplace Services serving as the custodian. Custom Goods, LLC assumed responsibility as the Plan trustee. As a result of the merger, net assets of \$3,201,247 were transferred to the control of Custom Goods, LLC. Consolidated 401(k) Plan on January 6, 2023. The merger does not impact participant benefits as the benefit provisions were incorporated in the Custom Goods, LLC Consolidated 401(k) Plan.

### **NOTE 9 – SUBSEQUENT EVENTS**

The Plan Administrator has evaluated all activity through October 13, 2023, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
