Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of the Bob Monnig Industries, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of and for the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 6 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the *Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with U.S. generally accepted auditing standards (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the *Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit* section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of U.S. generally accepted accounting principles.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Bob Monnig Industries, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more comprehensive description of the Plan's provisions.

General: The Plan is a safe harbor defined contribution plan covering employees of Bob Monnig Industries, Inc. and certain affiliated companies (the Company). The Plan was established July 1, 1983, and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Eligibility: Employees who have completed two months of service and have attained the age of 18 are eligible to participate in the Plan. Union employees and non-resident aliens are not eligible to participate in the Plan.

Contributions: Participants may contribute up to 92% of pre-tax or post-tax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan, not to exceed maximum amounts specified by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), in accordance with a participant salary deferral agreement. Participants who are at least 50 years of age may make an additional contribution to the Plan not to exceed \$6,500 for 2022 and 2021, under certain conditions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing rollover distributions from other qualified plans. The Company is required to make a safe harbor matching contribution equal to 100% of each participant's deferral contributions up to 4% of participant salary. Additional employer profit sharing amounts may be contributed at the discretion of the Company. There were no additional discretionary profit sharing contributions during 2022 and 2021. Participants direct the investment of contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Participant accounts: Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, Company contributions, the participant's rollover contributions from other qualified benefit plans, and an allocation of Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting: Participants are automatically 100% vested in both their elective salary deferrals and the Company's safe harbor contributions. Participants vest in Company discretionary contributions at a rate of 20% after two years of service and in 20% increments each subsequent year with full vesting in Company discretionary contributions occurring after six years of service. A participant is considered to have one year of service for each one-year period in which he or she has worked 1,000 hours or more.

Participants become automatically 100% vested in Company discretionary contributions upon attaining normal retirement age, total disability, or death.

Forfeitures: Forfeitures may be used to pay Plan expenses or used to reduce Company contributions. During the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021, no forfeitures were used to pay Plan expenses, and forfeitures of \$52 and \$0, respectively, were used to reduce Company contributions. At December 31, 2022 and 2021, forfeited nonvested amounts available to be used to pay future Plan expenses or to reduce future Company contributions were \$242 and \$362, respectively.

Distribution of benefits: Distributions to Plan participants are generally made to participants after the participant's termination from employment. A participant may receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, a partial payment, an annuity, or installment payments.

Administration: Paychex Retirement Services is the Plan's third-party administrator (TPA) and record-keeper and Mid Atlantic Trust Company is the Plan's custodian. The record-keeper maintains the individual participant accounts and provides records of balances and transactions to the Plan administrator and participants. The custodian holds the Plan's assets, administers investment activity, and invests contributions into funds designated by each participant. Certain administrative and record-keeping costs are being absorbed by the Company. The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Plan's management determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance, and reports to the Company's Board of Directors.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting: The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual basis of accounting.

Valuation of investments: Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade date basis. Dividends are recorded on the declaration date. Interest is recorded when earned. Net (depreciation) appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Investment securities of the Plan are exposed to various risks, such as interest rates, market, and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term would materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Payment of benefits: Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses: Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Certain administrative functions are performed by officers and employees of the Company. No officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan for these services. Investment related expenses are included in net (depreciation) appreciation in fair value of investments.

Estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Subsequent events: Events that have occurred subsequent to December 31, 2022, have been evaluated through October 13, 2023, which represents the date the Plan's financial statements were approved by management and, therefore, available to be issued.

3. TAX STATUS

The IRS has determined and informed Paychex Inc. by a letter dated April 10, 2014, that the prototype non-standardized profit sharing plan sponsored by Paychex Inc. as amended through April 2, 2012, is in a form acceptable under section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan adopted this prototype profit sharing plan effective January 1, 2018. Effective April 29, 2019, the Plan was amended to change plan entry dates from quarterly to monthly. Effective February 18, 2022, the Plan was amended to allow hardship withdrawals from the pre-tax deferral source of participant accounts. Effective March 31, 2022, the Plan was amended to also allow hardship withdrawals from the Roth deferral, matching, and profit sharing sources of participant accounts.

Effective May 20, 2022, the Plan adopted a Cycle 3 Restatement as an amendment and restatement of the existing plan to bring the Plan into compliance with legislative and regulatory changes. There were no significant change to plan provisions as a result of the restatement. The IRS has determined and informed Paychex Inc. by a letter dated August 31, 2020, that the non-standardized pre-approved profit sharing plan as amended through December 31, 2018, is in a form acceptable under section 401 of the IRC.

The Company may rely on the opinion letters issued by the IRS as evidence that the Plan is qualified under the applicable sections of the IRC. The Plan is relying on the opinion letters. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letters, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is qualified as of the financial statement date.

Effective February 6, 2023, the Plan adopted a non-standardized pre-approved profit sharing plan sponsored by FMR LLC as a restatement of the existing plan. As a result of this restatement, the Plan name was changed to Monnig Global 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan & Trust, hardship withdrawals were removed, and participant loans were added to the Plan.

U.S. generally accepted accounting principles require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken as uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

4. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

5. TERMINATED PARTICIPANTS

Net assets available for benefits at December 31, 2022 and 2021 included approximately \$896,000 and \$778,000, respectively, allocated to the accounts of individuals who, as of or prior to that date, had withdrawn from actively participating in the operations of the Plan, generally as a result of terminating employment. These amounts may be paid within the next year, at the request of the participants. These participants receive no further contributions but do receive allocations of investment income and Plan expenses.

6. CERTIFICATION OF INVESTMENT INFORMATION

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Mid Atlantic Trust Company, the custodian of the Plan, has certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule are complete and accurate.

- Investments at fair value as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
- Investment income as shown in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.
- Schedule of assets held at year end.

The Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

7. FAIR VALUE OF INVESTMENTS

Plan investments are held in a trust managed by Mid Atlantic Trust Company and are unsecured. Therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

A fair value hierarchy is used that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value of balances that are required or permitted to be measured at fair value for reporting in financial statements. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to the unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to the unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1	Valuation is based upon quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Plan has the ability to access.
Level 2	Valuation is based upon quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets, quoted market prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets, inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability, or inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. Observable inputs may include interest rates, foreign exchange rates, and yield curves that are observable at commonly quoted intervals.
Level 3	Valuation is based on methodologies that are unobservable and significant to the fair value measure. These may be generated from model-based techniques that use at least one significant assumption based on unobservable inputs for the asset or liability, which are typically based on an entity's own assumptions, as there is little, if any, related market activity.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The Plan's assessment of the significance of a particular input to the fair value measurement in its entirety requires judgment and considers factors specific to the asset or liability. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of valuation methodologies used for assets recorded at fair value.

Registered investment companies (mutual funds): Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund on an active market which is based on the underlying net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the Plan at year-end. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common collective trusts: Valued at the NAV of the units of a bank or trust company collective trust. Stable value collective trusts are composed primarily of fully benefit responsive investment contracts. The NAV, as provided by the custodian, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Investments in common collective trusts can generally be redeemed without restriction; however, in certain cases, redemption or purchase may be limited to prevent excess and/or short-term trading. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the collective trust, the issuer reserves the right to require 12 months' notification in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

8. RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Party-in-interest transactions include transactions with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person providing services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50% or more of such an employer, and relatives of parties-in-interest. The Plan has various parties-in-interest. Investments are held with parties-in-interest and certain fees are paid to parties-in-interest.

9. PROHIBITED TRANSACTIONS

The DOL considers late deposits to be nonexempt prohibited transactions. During the year ended December 31, 2021, the Company inadvertently failed to remit certain employee deferrals totaling \$909 within the time frame required by the DOL under plan asset rules. The Company remitted the late contributions to the Plan in August 2021 and remitted the related missed earnings of \$6 to the Plan in October 2022.
