To the Plan Administrator and Participants
Puppet, Inc. 401(k):

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Puppet, Inc. 401(k), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Puppet, Inc. 401(k)'s financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, and for the years then ended, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 6 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
DECEMBER 31, 2022 AND 2021

1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Puppet, Inc. 401(k) (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

a. General

The Plan is a defined contribution savings and profit sharing plan established January 1, 2011 by Puppet, Inc. (the “Company”) under the provisions of Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”), which includes a qualified cash or deferred arrangement as described in Section 401(k) of the IRC, for the benefit of eligible employees of the Company. The Plan is administered by the Company. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”), as amended.

During 2021, the Plan changed its recordkeeper and trustee from Ascensus Trust Company to Fidelity Management Trust Company.

b. Eligibility

Employees of the Company, excluding residents of Puerto Rico, leased employees, interns and internal contractors, are eligible to participate in the Plan upon completing one month of service and reaching the age of 18. Participants can enter the Plan on the first day of the month following the date on which the eligibility requirements are met.

c. Participant Contributions

Unless an eligible employee affirmatively elects otherwise, the employee is automatically enrolled in the Plan at a deferral rate of 4%. Employee deferrals for each active participant having automatic enrollment contributions made on their behalf shall be increased annually by 1%, never to exceed 8% unless the participant elects a different percentage. Participants that make their contribution election may defer up to 100% of their eligible compensation limited by requirements of the IRC. Employees can make pre-tax deferrals, Roth contributions and voluntary non-deductible, after-tax contributions. Upon reaching the age of 50, eligible employees may make additional catch-up contributions as allowed by the IRC. Participants may also roll over amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans into the Plan.

d. Employer Contributions

The Company, at its discretion, may make matching or profit-sharing contributions to the Plan. During 2022 and 2021, the Company made matching contributions of 25 percent of a participant's contributions, with a maximum match of \$1,000 for each participant.

e. Participant Accounts

Individual accounts are maintained for each of the Plan's participants to reflect the participant's contributions, the Company's contributions, and an allocation of the Plan's earnings and expenses. Participants can direct their account into a variety of investments offered by Fidelity

Management Trust Company. The benefit to which a participant is currently entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

f. Vesting

Participants are fully vested at all times in the portion of their accounts attributable to their own contributions and earnings thereon. Participants vest in the portion of their accounts attributable to Company matching and discretionary contributions and earnings thereon at a rate of 25% for each year of service. A participant is fully vested after four years of credited service or in the event a participant becomes disabled or dies.

g. Payment of Benefits

Upon reaching retirement age, age 59 ½, becoming disabled, termination of service or death, a participant or beneficiary may request a distribution equal to the participant's vested account balance in a lump sum, installment payments or a partial payment. Account balances less than \$5,000 but greater than \$1,000, may be distributed in the form of a direct rollover to an individual retirement account designated by the Plan administrator. Account balances less than \$1,000 are distributed in a single lump-sum cash payment to the participant or beneficiary.

h. Hardship Withdrawals

Upon certain conditions, participants, while still employed by the Company, are permitted to withdraw, in a single sum, a portion of their elective deferrals as a result of an immediate and heavy financial need, subject to a minimum withdrawal of \$500. These conditions include unreimbursed medical expenses, the purchase of the participant's principal residence, the payment of post-secondary education tuition, the payment of burial or funeral costs of immediate family members, the payment of natural disaster clean-up on the participant's principal residence, the payment of repairs to the participant's principal residence that would qualify as a casualty deduction or to prevent eviction or foreclosure from the participant's principal residence.

i. Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance, subject to a \$1,000 minimum and certain other restrictions. Loans are secured by the vested account balance of the participant. Loans are repayable through payroll deductions over periods ranging up to five years, unless the loan is used to acquire a principal residence, in which case the loan term may be extended for a reasonable period of time. Effective November 1, 2021, the loan term for all new residential loans was amended to ten years or less. The loans bear a reasonable rate of interest as determined by the Plan Administrator based on prevailing interest rates charged by persons in the business of lending money made under similar circumstances and is fixed at the inception of the loan. The interest rate on outstanding loans at December 31, 2022 was 4.25% to 7.25% and the loans mature through 2036.

j. Forfeitures

The forfeited accounts of non-vested terminated participants may be used to pay administrative expenses of the Plan or to reduce future Company contributions. For the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021 there were approximately \$65,000 and \$0, respectively, in forfeitures utilized to pay employer contributions. Forfeitures available to reduce future Company contributions or to pay administrative expenses were approximately \$0 and \$25,000 at December 31, 2022 and 2021, respectively.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

a. Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“GAAP”).

b. Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management of the Plan to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

c. Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments consists of the net change in unrealized gains or losses during the year and the realized gain or loss on investments sold during the year. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis and dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

d. Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are recorded at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable from participants may be treated as a distribution based on the terms of the Plan document.

e. Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

f. Expenses

Administrative costs, including trustee, recordkeeping, legal and accounting fees, are paid by the Company. Direct expenses totaling approximately \$3,700 and \$17,000 were paid by the Plan during 2022 and 2021, respectively, representing transaction fees incurred and other expenses allocated to participants. Certain expenses are included in the transaction prices of investments bought and sold and cannot be separately quantified.

3. Investments

Plan investment assets are held by Fidelity Management Trust Company. Participants can direct their accounts among various mutual funds, money market funds, and a common collective trust.

The Putnam Stable Value Fund (the “SVF”) is a common collective trust investing primarily in nonconvertible bonds, U.S. government securities, asset backed securities and mortgage securities. The SVF also invests in wrap contracts. A wrap contract is an agreement by another party, such as a bank or insurer that agrees to make payments to the fund in certain

circumstances. Wrap contracts are designed to allow a stable value fund to maintain a constant NAV and to protect the fund in extreme circumstances. Certain events could cause the SVF not to transact at contract value including the Plan's failure to qualify under Section 401(a) or Section 401(k) of the IRC, establishment of a defined contribution plan that competes with the Plan for employee contributions, substantive modification of the SVF or the administration of the SVF that is not consented by the wrap issuer, changes in laws, regulations or administrative rulings applicable to the Plan that could have a material adverse effect on the SVF's cash flow, any communication given to unit holders to induce or influence unit holders not to invest in the SVF or transfer assets out of the SVF, or any transfer of assets from the SVF directly to a competing investment option. Earnings from the investment in the common collective trust are included in dividends and interest income on the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

4. Fair Value Measurements

Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820 establishes a framework for fair value measurement, which provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are described below:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for investment assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2022 and 2021.

Mutual funds and money market funds: Valued at fair value based on quoted market prices at year end.

Common collective trust: The Plan invests in a stable value common collective trust. The common collective trust is valued at the NAV practical expedient of the underlying investments. Participant transactions can occur daily.

The common collective trust is a stable value fund with an investment objective to seek the preservation of capital and provide a competitive level of income over time that is consistent with the preservation of capital. To achieve its investment objective, the common collective trust invests in assets (typically fixed-income securities or bond funds and may include derivative instruments such as futures contracts and swap agreements), cash equivalents represented by shares in money market funds and enters into "wrap" contracts issued by third parties.

5. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan assets are invested in a variety of investments. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, foreign currency and overall market volatility risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits, and therefore participant account balances.

6. Information Certified by the Trustee

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. The following information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule was provided and certified by the trustee, Fidelity Management Trust Company, as of December 31, 2022 and 2021 and for the periods November 1, 2021 to December 31, 2021 and January 1, 2022 to December 31, 2022 and Ascensus, Inc., as agent for Ascensus Trust Company, for the period from January 1, 2021 to November 1, 2021 as complete and accurate.

- Investments, at fair value
- Notes receivable from participants
- Investment income (loss)
- Interest on participant notes receivable
- Schedule of assets (held at end of year)

7. Party-in-interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by Fidelity Investments, an affiliate of Fidelity Management Trust Company. Fidelity Management Trust Company is the trustee as defined by the Plan. Certain investment fees are paid by the trustee and are reflected in the investment income or loss for the year. The Plan also issues loans to participants that are secured by the vested balance in the participants' accounts. As such, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules.

Additionally, the Plan sponsor, Puppet, Inc., is a party-in-interest to the Plan. The transactions between the Plan and the Plan sponsor included funding of contributions to the Plan and payment of certain administrative expenses of the Plan, which are exempt transactions.

8. Tax Status

Effective November 1, 2021, the Plan was restated utilizing a Fidelity Volume Submitter Defined Contribution Plan Document. Fidelity received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") on June 30, 2020 in which the IRS stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Management of the Plan believes the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, they believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax exempt as of and for the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021.

Assuming it meets certain initial and ongoing requirements, the Plan is generally exempt from federal and state income taxes. However, GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2022, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements.

The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions. There are currently no audits in process.

9. Plan Termination

In 2022, the Company was acquired by Perforce Software, Inc. (“Perforce”) and on December 16, 2022, Perforce adopted a resolution to terminate the Plan effective December 31, 2022 and transfer the Plan’s assets to the Perforce 401(k) plan. The vested balance of each participant’s account shall remain the same upon transfer.

10. Subsequent Events

In February 2023, all Plan assets were transferred to the 401(k) plan of Perforce Software Inc., whose recordkeeper and administrator is FinDec Benefit Services, Inc. along with Charles Schwab Trust Bank as the custodian.

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events with respect to the Plan through October 10, 2023, the date the financial statements are available to be issued.
