The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2022, and the related notes to the financial statements (financial statements).

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Notes to Financial Statements

1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Caldwell Country 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more comprehensive description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established on January 1, 2004, to provide retirement benefits for employees of Caldwell Automotive Partners, LLC (the "Company"). The Plan is subject to the requirements of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"). The Company is the Plan's sponsor and serves as plan administrator. American Funds Service Company ("AFS") serves as the Plan's custodian.

Employees are eligible to become participants in the plan after attaining the age of 21. Employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement, unions or who are a non-resident alien, are not eligible to participate in the Plan, as defined in the plan document. Participants must complete 1 year of service in which a minimum of 1,000 hours were credited to be eligible to receive any matching and/or profit-sharing contributions.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute compensation, as defined in the plan document, subject to certain Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") limitations. Participant salary deferrals may be traditional 401(k) (pretax) or, Roth 401(k) (after tax). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 3.00% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant. Amounts withheld from employee pay are increased by 1.00% each plan year, starting on the participant's third plan year, to a maximum of 6.00%, unless a contrary election is made.

The Company, at its discretion, may make matching contributions equal to a discretionary percentage of participant's deferrals, determined by the Company's management. For the year ended December 31, 2022, the Company matched 100.00% of the first 1.00% of eligible compensation, and 50.00% of up to an additional 5.00% of eligible compensation. The Company may, at its discretion, make profit sharing contributions to the Plan. The Company did not make any discretionary profit-sharing contributions during 2022.

Participant accounts

Each participant account is credited with the participant's contribution, the Company's contribution, allocation of the Plan's earnings (losses), charged with benefit payments, and transaction fees related to notes receivable from participants and distributions. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are 100.00% vested in all participant contributions plus actual earnings thereon at all times. Vesting in the Company's contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. The Company's contributions vest at a rate of 20.00% after the second year of vesting service and become fully vested after six years of credited service.

Investment options

Participants direct the investment of their accounts into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various mutual funds as investment options for participants.

Notes receivable from participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of (1) 50.00% of the present value of the vested account balance, or (2) \$50,000, reduced by the excess (if any) of the highest outstanding loan balance of plan loans in the prior 12-month period ending on the day before the loan is made over the outstanding balance of plan loans on the date the loan is made. A participant may have only two loans outstanding at any time. The repayment terms of loans may not exceed five years, except for loans used to acquire the participant's principal residence, in which case the loan term may not exceed 30 years. The loans bear interest ranging from 6.00% to 9.00% at December 31, 2022, and are repaid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of benefits

On termination, retirement, or prior to retirement in the case of death, disability or substantiated hardship, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Participants with an account balance less than \$5,000 will receive their distribution in a lump-sum at the next distribution date following the termination or have the option to roll over their balance into another qualified plan. In-service distributions are available from fully vested sources after a participant reaches the age of 59½ years.

Forfeitures

At December 31, 2022 and 2021, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$3,982 and \$3,061, respectively. These accounts may be used to pay administrative expenses or reduce employer contributions. During 2022, no forfeitures were used.

Revisions

Certain immaterial revisions have been made to the 2021 financial statements related to the fair value of investments where mutual funds were incorrectly described as pooled separate accounts. These revisions did not have an impact on the amounts presented in the financial statements.

2. Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP").

Investment valuation and income recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Plan management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the custodian. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes receivable from participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus accrued interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

Payment of benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets, liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates and assumptions.

Administrative expenses

Participant loans fees or transaction expenses are deducted from loan or distribution proceeds, as applicable, or are charged directly to the participant's account. Administrative expenses incurred in connection with the operation of the Plan are paid by the Company.

Subsequent events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 12, 2023, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. Fair Value Measurements

Fair value as defined under GAAP is an exit price, representing the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. GAAP establishes a three-tier fair value hierarchy, which prioritizes the inputs used in measuring fair value. These tiers include:

- Level 1:** Observable inputs such as quoted prices in active markets.
- Level 2:** Inputs other than quoted prices in active markets that are either directly or indirectly observable.
- Level 3:** Unobservable inputs about which little or no market data exists, therefore requiring an entity to develop its own assumptions.

Assets and liabilities are classified in their entirety based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The Plan's assessment of the significance of a particular input to the fair value measurement requires judgment, and may affect the valuation of fair value assets and liabilities and their placement within the fair value hierarchy levels.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies use for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2022 and 2021.

Mutual funds

Mutual funds are publicly traded investments and are valued daily at the closing price reported on the active market on which the funds are traded.

5. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the value of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

6. Exempt Party-In-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are shares of pooled separate accounts managed by AFS. AFS is the custodian defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for investment management services were included as a reduction of the return earned on each fund. Fees paid by the Plan for administrative services totaled \$944 for the year ended December 31, 2022. Loans to participants also qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

7. Non-Exempt Party-in-Interest Transaction

During the 2022 Plan year, there were unintentional delays by the Company in submitting participant contributions in the amount of \$13,967, to the custodian. These delinquent contributions constitute prohibited transactions, and the Company made contributions to the affected participants' accounts to compensate those participants lost income due to delays during 2022 and 2023.

8. Tax Status

The Plan has not obtained a determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service (the "IRS") stating that the Plan was in compliance with the applicable requirement of the IRC. The Plan is relying on the IRS approval of the standardized prototype plan that it is utilizing. The IRS has determined and informed the document sponsor by a letter dated March 31, 2014, that the prototype plan document was designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the plan administrator believes that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that, as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

9. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan at any time subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become fully vested in their accounts.

10. Reconciliation of Financial Statements to Form 5500

The following is a reconciliation of the net assets available for benefits per the financial statements to the Form 5500 as of December 31:
