## Notes to Financial Statements

### Note 1: Description of the Plan

#### **General**

The following description of XenoTech LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

The Plan is a defined contribution plan sponsored by XenoTech, LLC (the Company). All employees of the Company, excluding nonresident aliens and those covered by collective bargaining agreements, are eligible to participate in the Plan provided they have at least one year of service with a minimum of 1,000 hours of service, and are age 21 or older. Employees may enter the Plan on the first day of each month after meeting the eligibility requirements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA).

Empower Retirement provides recordkeeping services to the Plan. Effective June 1, 2022, the custodian and trustee of the Plan's mutual funds and common/collective trust accounts changed from Reliance Trust Company (Reliance) to Empower Trust Company, LLC (ETC) (formerly Great-West Trust Company, LLC). Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (EAIC) (formerly Great-West Life & Annuity Insurance Company) serves as Plan custodian and trustee of the guaranteed investment contract. The Company is the Plan Administrator and has overall responsibility for the operation and administration of the Plan. The Plan Administrator determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

Effective January 1, 2023, BioIVT, LLC ("Parent") acquired the Company and approved an amendment to merge the Plan into the BioIVT, LLC Retirement Plan ("Parent Plan"). All participants of the Plan became 100 percent vested in their account balances on the effective date. Participants were provided the option to have their account balance rolled into any qualified plan (including the Parent Plan) or IRA, receive a lump-sum distribution or be paid through an annuity contract. On February 22, 2023, an aggregate of \$13,726,814 was transferred from the Plan.

#### **Contributions**

The Plan permits eligible employees through a salary deferral election to have the Company make annual contributions of up to 100 percent of their eligible compensation. Employee rollover contributions are also permitted. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions.

The Company makes safe harbor matching contributions of 100 percent of employees' salary deferral amounts on the first 3 percent of employees' eligible compensation and 50 percent of employee salary deferral amounts on eligible compensation between 3 percent and 5 percent. Company profit-sharing contributions are discretionary as determined by the Company's Board of Directors. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

### ***Participant Investment Account Options***

Each participant has the option of directing their contributions into any of the various investment options offered by the Plan and may change the allocation daily.

### ***Participant Accounts***

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the Company's contributions and plan earnings and is charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

### ***Vesting***

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus earnings thereon.

### ***Notes Receivable from Participants***

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate, determined quarterly, is set at the prime rate, as defined. Principal and interest is paid ratably through monthly payroll deductions.

### ***Payment of Benefits***

Upon termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the vested interest in their account or annual installments, depending on the size of the participant's account balance at the time of termination. Participants with a vested account balance of less than \$5,000 must take a lump-sum distribution. The account of a participant with a vested account balance between \$1,000 and \$5,000 who does not request distribution will be rolled to an individual retirement account in the participant's name.

The Company may authorize certain withdrawals from a participant's account in the event of proven financial hardship. Hardship withdrawals are allowed from a participant's elective deferral account and are subject to specific statutory and regulatory requirements.

In-service distributions are permitted from all vested accounts when a participant has attained age 65.

## **Note 2: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

### ***Basis of Accounting***

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of net assets available for benefits attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

### ***Use of Estimates***

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets, changes in net assets and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

### ***Investment Valuation and Income Recognition***

Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Quoted market prices, if available, are used to value investments. Mutual funds are valued at the net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the Plan at year end.

The Plan's interest in the collective trust is valued based on information reported by the investment advisor using the audited financial statements of the collective trust at year end. Fair value is determined using NAV as a practical expedient.

Fully benefit-responsive investment contracts are valued at contract value. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus interest at the contract rate, less participant withdrawals and administration expenses.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) in the fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

### ***Notes Receivable from Participants***

Notes receivable from participants are reported at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan Document.

### ***Payment of Benefits***

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

### ***Administrative Expenses***

Administrative expenses may be paid by the Company or the Plan, at the Company's discretion.

**Note 3: Certification of Plan Trustee and Custodian**

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, EAIC, Reliance, and ETC, qualified institutions, have certified the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedules are complete and accurate:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2022 and 2021.
- Investment income (loss) and interest income on notes receivable from participants as shown in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021.
- Investment information and notes receivable from participants included in the accompanying schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2022 and the accompanying schedule of delinquent participant contributions for the year ended December 31, 2022.

The Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified investment information, except for comparing such certified investment information to the related investment information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedules.

**Note 4: Related-Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions**

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50 percent or more of such an employer or employee association or relatives of such persons.

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds managed by Reliance and ETC. Reliance and ETC are the custodians as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Company directly pays any other fees related to the Plan's operations.

The Plan paid \$0 and \$33,465 of recordkeeping fees to Reliance and ETC during the period ended January 1, 2023 and year ended December 31, 2022, respectively. The Company provides certain administrative services at no cost to the Plan.

#### **Note 5: Plan Amendments**

Effective June 1, 2022 the Plan was amended and restated (“Plan Amendment”) and a new trustee, administrator and custodian (“Trustee”) of the Plan was appointed. Plan assets transferred to the new Trustee were transferred into funds comparable to those offered by the previous custodian. The conversion initiated a “Black Out” period beginning September 8, 2022 and continued through September 11, 2022. During this period, funds could not be applied to the employee-selected funds with the Trustee or withdrawn from the Plan until the Trustee had time to accurately complete the conversion. During this period, employee contributions continued to be made through payroll deductions and the contributions were deposited and held in the Equity Fund until the completion of the Black Out period. At the end of the Black Out period, these funds were transferred to the new Trustee and invested in funds as requested by each participant. The name of the Plan was not changed.

See *Note 1* for a description of the Plan Amendment in 2023 that resulted in the termination of the Plan and transfer of all net assets to the Parent Plan.

#### **Note 6: Disclosures About Fair Value of Plan Assets and Liabilities**

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Fair value measurements must maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The hierarchy comprises three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value:

- Level 1** Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities
- Level 2** Observable inputs other than Level 1 prices, such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities
- Level 3** Unobservable inputs supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies and inputs used for assets measured at fair value on a recurring basis and recognized in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits, as well as the general classification of such assets pursuant to the valuation hierarchy. There have been no significant changes in the valuation techniques during the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021. The Plan had no liabilities measured at fair value on a recurring basis. In addition, the Plan had no assets or liabilities measured at fair value on a nonrecurring basis. For assets classified within Level 3 of the fair value hierarchy, the process used to develop the reported fair value is described below.

### *Investments*

Where quoted market prices are available in an active market, securities are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy. If quoted market prices are not available, then fair values are estimated by using quoted prices of securities with similar characteristics or independent asset pricing services and pricing models, the inputs of which are market-based or independently sourced market parameters, including, but not limited to, yield curves, interest rates, volatilities, prepayments, defaults, cumulative loss projections and cash flows. Such securities are classified in Level 2 of the valuation hierarchy. In certain cases where Level 1 or Level 2 inputs are not available, securities are classified within Level 3 of the hierarchy.

The value of certain collective trust fund investments is determined using net asset value (or its equivalent) as a practical expedient. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported net asset value. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the collective trust, the issuer reserves the right to require 12 months' notification in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

### **Note 7: Investment Contract with Insurance Company**

The Plan has a fully benefit-responsive investment contract with Massachusetts Mutual Life Insurance Company (MassMutual). On December 31, 2020, Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (EAIC) (formerly Great-West Life & Annuity Insurance Company) acquired the retirement business of MassMutual. EAIC is the certifying entity of the guaranteed investment contract on behalf of MassMutual under a power of attorney granted to EAIC. EAIC maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate guaranteed to the Plan.

The guaranteed investment contract is fully benefit responsive; therefore, contract value is the relevant measurement. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by EAIC, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against the contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan Documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Company or other Company events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan Administrator does not believe the occurrence of any such value event, which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants, is probable.

The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

### Note 8: Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in their employer contributions.

See *Note 1* for a description of the Plan Amendment in 2023 that resulted in the merger of the Plan and transfer of all net assets the Parent Plan.

### Note 9: Tax Status

The Plan operates under a nonstandardized adoption agreement in connection with a prototype retirement plan and trust/custodial document sponsored by XenoTech, LLC. This prototype plan document has been filed with the appropriate agency. The Plan has not obtained or requested a determination letter. However, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax exempt as of the financial statement date.

### Note 10: Nonexempt Transactions

Defined contribution plans are required to remit employee contributions to the Plan as soon as they can be reasonably segregated from the employer's general assets, but no later than the 15th business day of the month following the month in which the participant contributions are withheld by the employer. While the Company remitted all employee contributions to the Plan, contributions of \$119,940 were not remitted within the required time period for the year ended December 31, 2022.

### **Note 11: Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

### **Note 12: Subsequent Events**

Subsequent events have been evaluated through October 13, 2023 which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

### Note 1: Description of the Plan

#### **General**

The following description of XenoTech LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

The Plan is a defined contribution plan sponsored by XenoTech, LLC (the Company). All employees of the Company, excluding nonresident aliens and those covered by collective bargaining agreements, are eligible to participate in the Plan provided they have at least one year of service with a minimum of 1,000 hours of service, and are age 21 or older. Employees may enter the Plan on the first day of each month after meeting the eligibility requirements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA).

Empower Retirement provides recordkeeping services to the Plan. Effective June 1, 2022, the custodian and trustee of the Plan's mutual funds and common/collective trust accounts changed from Reliance Trust Company (Reliance) to Empower Trust Company, LLC (ETC) (formerly Great-West Trust Company, LLC). Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (EAIC) (formerly Great-West Life & Annuity Insurance Company) serves as Plan custodian and trustee of the guaranteed investment contract. The Company is the Plan Administrator and has overall responsibility for the operation and administration of the Plan. The Plan Administrator determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

Effective January 1, 2023, BioIVT, LLC ("Parent") acquired the Company and approved an amendment to merge the Plan into the BioIVT, LLC Retirement Plan ("Parent Plan"). All participants of the Plan became 100 percent vested in their account balances on the effective date. Participants were provided the option to have their account balance rolled into any qualified plan (including the Parent Plan) or IRA, receive a lump-sum distribution or be paid through an annuity contract. On February 22, 2023, an aggregate of \$13,726,814 was transferred from the Plan.

#### **Contributions**

The Plan permits eligible employees through a salary deferral election to have the Company make annual contributions of up to 100 percent of their eligible compensation. Employee rollover contributions are also permitted. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions.

The Company makes safe harbor matching contributions of 100 percent of employees' salary deferral amounts on the first 3 percent of employees' eligible compensation and 50 percent of employee salary deferral amounts on eligible compensation between 3 percent and 5 percent. Company profit-sharing contributions are discretionary as determined by the Company's Board of Directors. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

### ***Participant Investment Account Options***

Each participant has the option of directing their contributions into any of the various investment options offered by the Plan and may change the allocation daily.

### ***Participant Accounts***

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the Company's contributions and plan earnings and is charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

### ***Vesting***

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus earnings thereon.

### ***Notes Receivable from Participants***

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate, determined quarterly, is set at the prime rate, as defined. Principal and interest is paid ratably through monthly payroll deductions.

### ***Payment of Benefits***

Upon termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the vested interest in their account or annual installments, depending on the size of the participant's account balance at the time of termination. Participants with a vested account balance of less than \$5,000 must take a lump-sum distribution. The account of a participant with a vested account balance between \$1,000 and \$5,000 who does not request distribution will be rolled to an individual retirement account in the participant's name.

The Company may authorize certain withdrawals from a participant's account in the event of proven financial hardship. Hardship withdrawals are allowed from a participant's elective deferral account and are subject to specific statutory and regulatory requirements.

In-service distributions are permitted from all vested accounts when a participant has attained age 65.

## **Note 2: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

### ***Basis of Accounting***

The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of net assets available for benefits attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

### ***Use of Estimates***

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets, changes in net assets and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

### ***Investment Valuation and Income Recognition***

Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Quoted market prices, if available, are used to value investments. Mutual funds are valued at the net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the Plan at year end.

The Plan's interest in the collective trust is valued based on information reported by the investment advisor using the audited financial statements of the collective trust at year end. Fair value is determined using NAV as a practical expedient.

Fully benefit-responsive investment contracts are valued at contract value. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus interest at the contract rate, less participant withdrawals and administration expenses.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) in the fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

### ***Notes Receivable from Participants***

Notes receivable from participants are reported at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan Document.

### ***Payment of Benefits***

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

### ***Administrative Expenses***

Administrative expenses may be paid by the Company or the Plan, at the Company's discretion.

**Note 3: Certification of Plan Trustee and Custodian**

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, EAIC, Reliance, and ETC, qualified institutions, have certified the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedules are complete and accurate:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2022 and 2021.
- Investment income (loss) and interest income on notes receivable from participants as shown in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021.
- Investment information and notes receivable from participants included in the accompanying schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2022 and the accompanying schedule of delinquent participant contributions for the year ended December 31, 2022.

The Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified investment information, except for comparing such certified investment information to the related investment information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedules.

**Note 4: Related-Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions**

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50 percent or more of such an employer or employee association or relatives of such persons.

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds managed by Reliance and ETC. Reliance and ETC are the custodians as defined by the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Company directly pays any other fees related to the Plan's operations.

The Plan paid \$0 and \$33,465 of recordkeeping fees to Reliance and ETC during the period ended January 1, 2023 and year ended December 31, 2022, respectively. The Company provides certain administrative services at no cost to the Plan.

#### **Note 5: Plan Amendments**

Effective June 1, 2022 the Plan was amended and restated (“Plan Amendment”) and a new trustee, administrator and custodian (“Trustee”) of the Plan was appointed. Plan assets transferred to the new Trustee were transferred into funds comparable to those offered by the previous custodian. The conversion initiated a “Black Out” period beginning September 8, 2022 and continued through September 11, 2022. During this period, funds could not be applied to the employee-selected funds with the Trustee or withdrawn from the Plan until the Trustee had time to accurately complete the conversion. During this period, employee contributions continued to be made through payroll deductions and the contributions were deposited and held in the Equity Fund until the completion of the Black Out period. At the end of the Black Out period, these funds were transferred to the new Trustee and invested in funds as requested by each participant. The name of the Plan was not changed.

See *Note 1* for a description of the Plan Amendment in 2023 that resulted in the termination of the Plan and transfer of all net assets to the Parent Plan.

#### **Note 6: Disclosures About Fair Value of Plan Assets and Liabilities**

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Fair value measurements must maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The hierarchy comprises three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value:

- Level 1** Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities
- Level 2** Observable inputs other than Level 1 prices, such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities
- Level 3** Unobservable inputs supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies and inputs used for assets measured at fair value on a recurring basis and recognized in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits, as well as the general classification of such assets pursuant to the valuation hierarchy. There have been no significant changes in the valuation techniques during the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021. The Plan had no liabilities measured at fair value on a recurring basis. In addition, the Plan had no assets or liabilities measured at fair value on a nonrecurring basis. For assets classified within Level 3 of the fair value hierarchy, the process used to develop the reported fair value is described below.

### *Investments*

Where quoted market prices are available in an active market, securities are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy. If quoted market prices are not available, then fair values are estimated by using quoted prices of securities with similar characteristics or independent asset pricing services and pricing models, the inputs of which are market-based or independently sourced market parameters, including, but not limited to, yield curves, interest rates, volatilities, prepayments, defaults, cumulative loss projections and cash flows. Such securities are classified in Level 2 of the valuation hierarchy. In certain cases where Level 1 or Level 2 inputs are not available, securities are classified within Level 3 of the hierarchy.

The value of certain collective trust fund investments is determined using net asset value (or its equivalent) as a practical expedient. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported net asset value. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the collective trust, the issuer reserves the right to require 12 months' notification in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

### **Note 7: Investment Contract with Insurance Company**

The Plan has a fully benefit-responsive investment contract with Massachusetts Mutual Life Insurance Company (MassMutual). On December 31, 2020, Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (EAIC) (formerly Great-West Life & Annuity Insurance Company) acquired the retirement business of MassMutual. EAIC is the certifying entity of the guaranteed investment contract on behalf of MassMutual under a power of attorney granted to EAIC. EAIC maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate guaranteed to the Plan.

The guaranteed investment contract is fully benefit responsive; therefore, contract value is the relevant measurement. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by EAIC, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against the contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan Documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Company or other Company events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan Administrator does not believe the occurrence of any such value event, which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants, is probable.

The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

### Note 8: Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100 percent vested in their employer contributions.

See *Note 1* for a description of the Plan Amendment in 2023 that resulted in the merger of the Plan and transfer of all net assets the Parent Plan.

### Note 9: Tax Status

The Plan operates under a nonstandardized adoption agreement in connection with a prototype retirement plan and trust/custodial document sponsored by XenoTech, LLC. This prototype plan document has been filed with the appropriate agency. The Plan has not obtained or requested a determination letter. However, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax exempt as of the financial statement date.

### Note 10: Nonexempt Transactions

Defined contribution plans are required to remit employee contributions to the Plan as soon as they can be reasonably segregated from the employer's general assets, but no later than the 15th business day of the month following the month in which the participant contributions are withheld by the employer. While the Company remitted all employee contributions to the Plan, contributions of \$119,940 were not remitted within the required time period for the year ended December 31, 2022.

### **Note 11: Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

### **Note 12: Subsequent Events**

Subsequent events have been evaluated through October 13, 2023 which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
