NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

As of December 31, 2022 and 2021, and for the Year Ended December 31, 2022

1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Orora Visual Retirement Savings Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution 401(k) plan available to qualifying employees of Orora Clifton, LLC, formerly Orora Visual, LLC, (the “Company” or “Plan Sponsor). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (“ERISA”).

SECURE Act

On December 20, 2019, the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement (SECURE) Act of 2019 was signed into law. Applicable provisions of the SECURE Act, effective January 1, 2021, include eligibility for long-term part-time employees. In December 2022, SECURE 2.0 was passed into law. The provisions of SECURE 2.0 continue the themes and reforms that began with the 2019 SECURE Act. Most of the provisions of SECURE 2.0 will become effective in 2024 and beyond. Therefore, there is no current impact to the Plan. Since the provisions include both required and optional elements, the Plan Administrator will determine the optional provisions to elect.

Effective January 1, 2021, the Plan was amended and restated to bring the Plan into compliance with certain legislative and regulatory changes set forth in IRS notice 2017-37. The Plan was also amended to change the name of the employer to Orora Clifton, LLC.

Effective January 1, 2022, the Company amended the Plan to add an automatic deferral provision. All employees hired on or after January 1, 2022, are automatically enrolled in the Plan, upon meeting the eligibility requirements, starting at a pretax deferral rate of 6% and increasing by 1% annually to a maximum of 15%, unless an affirmative election to the contrary is made.

Effective January 28, 2022, the Plan was amended to adopt the Qualified Domestic Relations Order (“QDRO”) procedure to establish a reasonable and consistent procedure for determining the qualified status of a domestic relations order and for making distributions pursuant to a domestic relations order which qualifies under Internal Revenue Code Section 414(p).

Effective May 30, 2022, the Plan was amended to change the eligibility period for employer matching contributions from six months to three months.

Eligibility

All employees of the Company, with the exception noted below, who have attained the age of 18, are eligible to enter the Plan on the first day of the month after completing three months of service within a 12 month period. Employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement that does not provide for Plan participation are not eligible to participate in the Plan. The Plan grants employees of certain acquired companies (as outlined in the Plan provisions) with credited years of service for purposes of eligibility and vesting.

1. Description of Plan (continued)

Contributions

Participant Contributions

Employees may elect to defer up to 92% of their annual pre-tax compensation to the Plan, subject to Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) limitations. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. Effective January 1, 2022, newly eligible participants of the Plan are automatically enrolled at a pretax deferral rate of 6%, 90 days after meeting the eligibility requirements. Participants enrolled at the automatic deferral percentage experience a 1% automatic increase at the beginning of each Plan year.

Employer Matching Contributions

The Company, at the discretion of its board of directors, may elect to make matching contributions. The allocation of Company matching contributions is based on the proportion an individual participant’s elective deferral contributions bear to the total elective deferral contributions of all participants employed by the Company for the plan year. Prior to May 30, 2022, employees were required to complete six months of service to be eligible to receive employer matching contributions. Effective May 30, 2022, employees are required to complete three months of service to be eligible to receive employer matching contributions. Eligible participants received a discretionary employer match equal to 25% of each participants’ contribution, subject to a maximum of 6% of eligible compensation for the year ended December 31, 2022.

Employer Profit Sharing Contributions

The Company, at the discretion of its board of directors, may also make discretionary profit sharing contributions to the Plan. The allocation of discretionary profit sharing contributions is based on the proportion an individual participant’s compensation bears to the compensation of all eligible participants employed by the Company for the plan year. Employees are required to complete six months of service, defined as 1,000 hours, to be eligible to receive employer profit sharing contributions. Additionally, employees must be employed on the last day of the Plan year to be eligible to receive employer profit sharing contributions. No such contributions were made for the year ended December 31, 2022.

Contributions from Plan participants and the associated matching contributions from the Company are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions and the participant’s allocation of any Company contributions. Earnings and losses are credited to each participant account based on the performance of the underlying investments. Contributions and earnings are allocated among investment options, which include a guaranteed investment contract and various pooled separate accounts, as selected by the participant.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

As of December 31, 2022 and 2021, and for the Year Ended December 31, 2022

1. Description of Plan (continued)

Vesting

Participants are always fully vested in their deferral contributions and any earnings thereon. Participants vest in employer contributions over three years at a rate of 33.3% each year, beginning in year one. Participants also become fully vested upon termination of employment because of death, disability, or attainment of age 65, the Plan's normal retirement age. Forfeited balances of terminated participants' nonvested accounts are used first to pay administrative expenses incurred by the Plan. Any remaining forfeitures are then used to reduce employer contributions or pay Plan expenses.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum amount equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate of Prime plus 1% at the time of inception. The loans are repaid ratably through payroll deductions over a period of five years or less, unless such loan is for the purchase of a participant's primary residence.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or termination of employment, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum distribution, installment payments or a direct rollover distribution. A participant may withdraw part of the vested interest in his or her account upon attainment of age 59 ½, subject to Plan provisions.

Forfeited Accounts

As of December 31, 2022 and 2021, the amounts of unallocated forfeitures available for future use totaled \$2,598 and \$13,688, respectively. Participants forfeited \$1,161 during the year ended December 31, 2022. During the year ended December 31, 2022, forfeited amounts of \$14,045 were utilized to reduce Plan expenses.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared under the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments held by the Plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability (an exit price) in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Refer to Note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the 2022 and 2021 excess contributions to the applicable participants prior to March 15, 2023, and March 15, 2022, respectively.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus an accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded directly to participant's accounts and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2022 and 2021. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to administration of notes receivable and distributions from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) of fair value of investments.

Qualified Domestic Relations Order

Effective January 28, 2022, the Plan was amended to adopt the Qualified Domestic Relations Order ("QDRO") procedure to establish a reasonable and consistent procedure for determining the qualified status of a domestic relations order and for making distributions pursuant to a domestic relations order which qualifies under Internal Revenue Code Section 414(p).

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated through the date of the report of independent auditors, which is the date these financial statements were available to be issued. Other than the matter disclosed in Note 11, there were no material subsequent events that required recognition or additional disclosure in these financial statements.

4. Fair Value Measurements

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability (an exit price) in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The fair value hierarchy prioritizes the inputs used to measure fair value, giving the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB accounting guidance are described below:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2022 and 2021.

4. Fair Value Measurements (continued)

Pooled separate accounts: Valued at the net asset value (“NAV”) of the units held by the Plan at year-end based on information reported by the custodian. The NAV of each of the separate accounts is calculated in a manner consistent with the U.S. GAAP for investment companies and is determinative of their fair value and represent the price at which the Plan would be able to initiate a transaction. NAV is used as a practical expedient for fair value. Several of the separate accounts invest in publicly quoted mutual funds or actively managed stocks. Some of the separate accounts also invest in fixed income securities. The fair value of the underlying mutual funds or stocks and of the underlying securities, which is based on quoted prices of similar assets, is used to determine the NAV of the separate account which is not publicly traded. Investments in these funds can be redeemed daily upon request.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The following table summarizes investments for which fair value is measured using the net asset value per share practical expedient. There are no participant redemption restrictions or redemption notice periods for these investments.

5. Guaranteed Investment Contract

The Plan offers a guaranteed investment contract, the Voya Fixed Account, with Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company. The custodian maintains the contributions in a general account, which is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The contract is included in the financial statements at contract value as reported to the Plan by the custodian. Contract value is equal to contributions received plus interest credited, less payments withdrawal or transfers. The interest rate credited on the unallocated annuity contract varies based on a formula determined by the Plan custodian, but will not be less than a guaranteed floor interest rate determined annually. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or portion of their investment at contract value. The custodian may not terminate the contract at any amount less than contract value. The following represents the disaggregation of contract value between types of investment contract held by the Plan. In a traditional investment contract, the Plan owns only the contract itself, not the underlying assets.

Certain events limit the ability to the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan); (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions; (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan; or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. Plan management believes that the occurrence of events that would cause the Plan to transact at less than contract value is not probable.

Each calendar year, the Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company limits the sum of partial surrenders plus transfers, from the Voya Fixed Account, to 20% of that portion of the current value of the unallocated account held in the Voya Fixed Account as of January 1 of the calendar year. Partial surrender or transfer requests for amounts invested in the Voya Fixed Account that exceed the Voya Fixed Account surrender and transfer limit will not be honored by Voya. Voya may, on a temporary basis, allow any larger percentage as a Voya Fixed Account surrender and transfer limit.

6. Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

The Plan invests in a group annuity contract and pooled separate accounts issued by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company. Voya is the custodian of the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net depreciation in fair value of the investment, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. Fees for audit services are included in administrative expenses, totaling \$44,602. The Plan Sponsor pays directly any other fees related to the Plan's operations.

7. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants' accounts will become fully vested and non-forfeitable.

8. Tax Status

The Plan uses a volume submitter profit sharing plan document (“VSP”) sponsored by Ascensus LLC. Ascensus LLC received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) dated June 30, 2020, which states that the VSP document satisfies the applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). The Plan itself has not received a determination letter from the IRS and has been since amended; however, the Plan’s management believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRS. Therefore, no provision for income tax has been included in the Plan’s financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits taken by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2019.

9. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan offers a variety of investment options to participants. These investment options are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall volatility risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments in the near term could materially affect participants’ account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

On March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization declared the novel strain of coronavirus ("COVID-19") a global pandemic and recommended containment and mitigation measures worldwide. The pandemic and these containment and mitigation measures have led to economic uncertainties which have resulted in significant volatility in the financial markets, impacting some of the investments held by the Plan. The duration of these uncertainties and volatility, and the ultimate financial effects of COVID-19 on the national and global economies and investment markets, cannot be reasonably estimated at this time.
