We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of IH Services Retirement Savings Plan (the “Plan”), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2022, and the related notes to the financial statements.

## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

DECEMBER 31, 2022 AND 2021

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### Note 1—Description of the Plan

The following description of the IH Services (the “Company”) Retirement Savings Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

*General* – The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering salaried employees of the Company and Synergy Services, Inc., a participating employer, who have completed at least one hour of service within six consecutive months and are age 21 or older, excluding highly compensated employees. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

*Contributions* – Eligible participants may elect to contribute up to 50% of pre-tax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained the age of 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined-contribution plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Company may contribute a discretionary-matching contribution. For the year ended December 31, 2022, the Company contributed \$96,138 to the Plan. Additional profit-sharing amounts may be contributed at the discretion of the Company’s Board of Directors. There was no discretionary profit-sharing contribution for the year ended December 31, 2022. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) limitations.

*Participant Accounts* – Each participant’s account is credited with (1) the participant’s contributions, (2) the Company contributions, if any, and (3) an allocation of the Plan’s earnings or losses. Each participant’s accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

*Vesting* – Participants are vested immediately in their contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company’s contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant becomes fully vested ratably over four years of credited service.

*Notes Receivable* –Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant’s account and bear interest at the rate ranging from 5.25% to 9.00% with maturities through October 2027, as of December 31, 2022. Principal and interest are paid through payroll deductions.

*Payment of Benefits* – Upon termination of service, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant’s vested interest in his or her account, annual installments, or a direct rollover into a qualified plan. If no such request is made and the vested account balance is greater than \$5,000, a lump-sum distribution is made at normal retirement age as defined by the Plan. If the vested account balance is less than \$5,000, amount will be automatically rolled over into an individual retirement account selected by the Plan administrator. All fully vested balances are available for distribution after the participant reaches the age of 59½.

*Forfeited Accounts* – Forfeitures may be used to reduce employer matching contributions. During the year ended December 31, 2022, \$-0- and \$3,782 was used to reduce employer contributions and Plan expenses, respectively. At December 31, 2022 and 2021, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$-0- for both years.

*Hardship Withdrawals* – The Plan allows participants to make hardship withdrawals to satisfy certain immediate and heavy financial needs. A participant may request a hardship withdrawal for certain qualifying expenses as defined by the Plan document. The Plan administrator will determine whether there is an immediate and heavy financial need based on the facts and circumstances.

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### Note 2—Summary of significant accounting policies

*Basis of Accounting* – The financial statements of the Plan are prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“U.S. GAAP”).

*Use of Estimates* – The preparation of financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP requires the Plan administrator and the Company to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Such estimates include those regarding fair value. Actual results, as determined at a later date, could differ from those estimates.

*Contributions* – Employee contributions are recorded in the period during which the Company makes payroll deductions from the participants’ earnings.

Discretionary-matching contributions are accrued and paid based on amounts to be funded for each year under the Plan provisions and the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). There were no discretionary-matching contributions by the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2022.

*Investment Valuation and Income Recognition* – The Plan’s investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan’s Advisory Committee determines the Plan’s valuation policies utilizing information provided by CMFG Life Insurance Company (“qualified institution”). See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net depreciation includes the Plan’s gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

*Notes Receivable from Participants* – Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are netted against the loan proceeds.

No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2022 or 2021. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

*Payment of Benefits* – Benefits are recorded when paid.

*Risks and Uncertainties* – Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rates, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in value of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants’ account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

*Administrative Expenses* – Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of distributions to participants are charged directly to the participant’s account. Investment-related expenses are included in net depreciation in fair value of investments on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

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### Note 2—Summary of significant accounting policies (continued)

*Fair Value Investments* – The Plan follows the *Fair Value Measurements* topic of the Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Codification (“ASC”) 820 which defines fair value as the exchange price that would be received for an asset or paid to transfer a liability (an exit price) in the principal or most advantageous market for the asset or liability in an orderly transaction value hierarchy which requires an entity to maximize the use of observable inputs when measuring fair value.

The standard describes three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value:

*Level 1* – Inputs to the valuation methodology are quoted prices available in active markets for identical investments as of the reporting date;

*Level 2* – Inputs to the valuation methodology are other than quoted prices in active markets, which are either directly or indirectly observable as of the reporting date, and fair value can be determined through the use of models or other valuation methodologies; and

*Level 3* – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable inputs in situations where there is little or no market activity for the asset or liability and the reporting entity makes estimates and assumptions related to the pricing of the asset or liability including assumptions regarding risk.

A financial instrument’s level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for instruments measured at fair value, including the general classification of such instruments pursuant to the valuation hierarchy. There have been no changes in methodologies used at December 31, 2022 and 2021:

*Mutual Funds* – These investments are public investment vehicles valued using the net asset value (“NAV”) provided by the administrator of the fund. NAV is based on the value of the underlying assets owned by the fund, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of shares outstanding. For mutual funds where NAV is the quoted price in an active market, investments are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

*Common Collective Trust* – Investments in the common collective trust are stated at estimated fair values, which have been determined based on the unit values of the funds. Each investment is valued at a daily calculated unit value, which is determined by the organization sponsoring such funds, by dividing the funds’ net assets at fair value by its units outstanding at each valuation date. The common collective trust held by the Plan is further classified as a stable value fund, which has indirect investments in synthetic and traditional guaranteed investment contracts. As the investment is indirect, there is no readily determinable fair value and the trust is valued at NAV practical expedient so it is shown outside the fair value hierarchy.

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### **Note 6—Related party and party-in-interest transactions**

Fees incurred by the Plan for recordkeeping and investment advisor services are included in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. Included in net depreciation in the fair value of the investments are fees paid through revenue sharing rather than a direct payment. The Company pays any other fees related to the Plan's operations directly.

Notes receivable from participants qualifies as party-in-transactions.

### **Note 7—Plan termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become fully vested in their employer contributions.

### **Note 8—Tax status**

The Plan sponsor adopted a volume submitter profit-sharing plan with a cash or deferred arrangement which received a favorable opinion letter from the IRS on March 31, 2014, which stated that the prototype plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The Plan has not received a determination letter specific to the Plan itself, and the volume submitter profit-sharing plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the Plan sponsor believes the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the Plan qualifies under Section 401(a) and the related trust is tax-exempt as of December 31, 2022. The Plan sponsor believes the Plan has no income subject to unrelated business income tax.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. Plan management has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to audit by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

### **Note 9—Subsequent events**

The Plan evaluated subsequent events through October 16, 2023, which is the date the financial statements were available for issuance.
