**1. Description of Plan:**

The following description of Northern Cochise Community Hospital, Inc. 401(k) Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for more complete information.

**General** – The Plan is a defined contribution plan adopted September 18, 2000, covering all employees of Northern Cochise Community Hospital, Inc. (the Hospital). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan was amended effective January 1, 2021, to change the classification of rehired employees as new hires for purposes of the automatic enrollment and contribution feature. On January 1, 2023, the Plan was terminated and legally transferred to the control of TMC Healthcare 401(k) Plan as a result of a merger between the Hospital and TMC Healthcare.

**Contributions** – Each year, participants may contribute up to 90 percent of pre-tax annual compensation (subject to certain limitations), as defined in the plan agreement. Effective January 1, 2021, after-tax Roth employee contributions are allowed. Participants ages 50 or older may make additional deferrals (called “catch-up” contributions). Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Due to the timing of the Plan’s termination, no contributions were made to the Plan for the period ended January 1, 2023.

**Participant accounts** – Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution and allocations of a) the Hospital’s contribution, and b) the plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined in the Plan. Forfeited balances of terminated participants’ nonvested accounts are used to pay plan expenses. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

**Vesting** – Participants are immediately vested in 100 percent of their contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

On January 1, 2023, all Plan participants were 100 percent vested in prior Hospital matching contributions, due to the election by the Hospital to terminate the Plan (see Note 2).

**Administration of the Plan** – The Plan is administered by the Hospital in the form of an advisory committee. Plan assets are invested in accordance with the employee’s instructions. Records of participant account activity were processed and maintained by Voya Retirement and Insurance Annuity Company, which also performs other administrative support services for the Plan. Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Hospital. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan. Administrative expenses are paid by either the Plan or the plan sponsor as provided by the plan document.

**Forfeited accounts** – At January 1, 2023 and December 31, 2022, there were no nonvested forfeited accounts to be used in future periods.

**1. Description of Plan (continued):**

***Loans receivable from participants*** – Participants may borrow from the Plan upon approval of the plan administrator. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document. The amount of the loan cannot be less than \$1,000 and is limited to one-half the total value of the participant’s vested account balances up to \$50,000. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. The term of the note may not exceed five years. The note is secured by the balance in the participant’s account and bears interest at one percent above the current prime interest rate. During the period ended January 1, 2023, Plan loans were transferred to the TMC Healthcare 401(k) Plan.

**2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies:**

***Plan termination and basis of accounting*** – The Board of Directors of the Hospital voted on November 17, 2022, to terminate the Plan due to a merger between the Hospital and TMC Healthcare. In accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, the Plan changed its basis of accounting used to value plan assets from going concern to the liquidation basis for the year ended December 31, 2022.

***Liquidation of plan assets*** – On January 1, 2023, Plan assets were legally transferred to the control of TMC Healthcare 401(k) Plan.

***Use of estimates*** – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

***Investment valuation and income recognition*** – Investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

The fair value of the Plan’s assets is based on quoted market prices determined by pricing services from Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company and other reliable sources for the period ended January 1, 2023 and year ended December 31, 2022. Shares of registered investment companies (mutual funds) are reported at fair value based on the quoted market price of the fund which represents the net asset value of the shares held by the fund at year end. See Note 5 for discussion of fair value measurements.

***Administrative expenses*** – The Hospital pays certain administrative expenses on behalf of the Plan.

***Payment of benefits*** – Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

***Subsequent events*** – In preparing these financial statements, the Plan has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure through November 7, 2023, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

**3. Information Certified by the Plan Custodian:**

For the year ended December 31, 2022, the plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by Section 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, no independent auditing procedures were performed with respect to the information certified by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company.

Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company, the custodian of the Plan, has supplied the plan administrator with a certification as to the completeness and accuracy of all investment information reflected on the accompanying statement of net assets in liquidation available for benefits as of December 31, 2022.

**4. Tax Status:**

The trust established under the Plan to hold the Plan's assets is qualified pursuant to the appropriate section of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and, accordingly, the trust's net investment income is exempt from income taxes. The Plan has obtained a favorable determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) but has since been amended. However, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, they believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt as of the financial statement dates. Accordingly, no provisions for income taxes have been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of January 1, 2023, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of the liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions and the Plan could be subject to income tax if certain issues were found by the IRS that could result in the disqualification of the Plan's tax-exempt status; however, there are no audits for any tax periods in progress. The plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2019.

**5. Fair Value Measurements:**

Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Codification 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

**Level 1:** Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

**Level 2:** Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

**Level 3:** Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies used at December 31, 2022.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2022.

**Mutual funds** – Valued at quoted prices for identical assets in active markets.

**Guaranteed interest accounts** – A contract with a guaranteed interest rate for a specified period of time as determined by the Plan. The accounts promise contract value for a benefit event; however, there is a possible surrender charge if funds are withdrawn early. As a result, these accounts are considered nonbenefit-responsive insurance contracts. As of December 31, 2022, Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company calculated fair values of the general accounts in these contracts based on discounted cash flows to expected maturity, generally representing contract value adjusted to reflect current market interest rates.

**6. Guaranteed Interest Contract:**

The Plan provides for investment in guaranteed interest insurance contracts offered by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company. The guaranteed interest accounts are not investment contracts, but investment options offered under the Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company contract. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for plan withdrawals and administrative expenses charged by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company. These accounts promise contract value for a benefit event such as termination, death, disability, and retirement; however, there is a possible surrender charge when funds are withdrawn prior to their maturity. Thus, these contracts are not considered fully benefit-responsive and are reported at fair value as provided by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company.

If the contract holder terminates the contract before a guaranteed interest account matures or transfers funds to other investment managers beyond the limits of the contract, the insurance company will apply an early withdrawal charge to guaranteed interest account balances. Due to the termination of the Plan, the value of the contracts has been adjusted in the amount of (\$27,521) at December 31, 2022, to reflect the market value adjustment related to the early surrender of the contracts.

The current rate is one percent, expressed as an annual effective yield. The current rate may change and be higher or lower than the previously identified rate but is guaranteed to not be less than one percent. The contract value of the guaranteed accounts approximates fair value at December 31, 2022.

**7. Risks and Uncertainties:**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of the investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets in liquidation available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets in liquidation available for benefits.

**8. Concentrations of Credit Risk:**

At December 31, 2022, the Plan had a concentration of investments in Fidelity 500 Index Fund. A change in the value of this fund could cause the value of the Plan's net assets available for benefits to change due to this concentration. In addition, as a result of funds being selected by participants, certain other funds may individually represent a concentration of greater than 10 percent of the Plan's investments, at fair value in the statements of net assets in liquidation available for benefits. Although these individual funds maintain a level of diversification by investing in multiple equity, debt, or other instruments, there may be a concentration of risk because the funds are invested at the direction of a single fund manager. At December 31, 2022, Fidelity 500 Index Fund represented greater than 10 percent of the Plan's investments, at fair value.

The participant notes receivable are due from plan participants, almost all of whom live and work in the Willcox, Arizona, area and are employed by the Hospital, the plan sponsor. The notes are collateralized by the participants' accounts in the Plan.

**9. Party-in-interest Transactions:**

The Plan's advisory committee consists of employees of the plan sponsor. There are no transactions between the parties other than contributions to the Plan, if eligible.

As of December 31, 2022, certain plan investments were shares of mutual funds managed by Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company which performed recordkeeping and administrative services for the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Fees paid by the Plan to Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company amounted to \$2,050 for the year ended December 31, 2022.

CBIZ Retirement Plan Services prepares the IRS Form 5500.

The plan auditor performs the required annual audit of the Plan.

Such transactions, while considered party-in-interest transactions under ERISA regulations, are permitted under the provisions of the Plan and are specifically exempt from the prohibition of party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.
