Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of OnTrac Logistics, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of September 30, 2022 and December 31, 2021, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period January 1, 2022 through September 30, 2022, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

JANUARY 1, 2022 THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30, 2022

Note 1—Description of the Plan

The following description of the OnTrac Logistics, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information as it pertained to the Plan, before its merger described below. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement, as amended and restated, for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General – The Plan is a defined contribution plan sponsored by OnTrac Logistics, Inc. (the “Company” or “Plan Sponsor”). The Plan was adopted January 1, 1997, and most recently restated on July 1, 2021. The Plan covers eligible employees who have six months of service and are age 21 or older. The Plan is intended to qualify under section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”) and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”). Effective December 2020, the Plan was amended to change the name of the Plan from the Express Messenger Systems Inc. 401k Plan to the OnTrac Logistics, Inc. 401(k) Plan.

Plan Merger – In October 2021, the Plan Sponsor was acquired by Lasership, Inc. and effective October 1, 2022 (the “Merger Date”), all participants included within the Plan merged into the Lasership 401(k) Plan. All eligible active employees were able to participate in the Lasership 401(k) Plan.

All participant account balances became 100% vested as of the Merger Date and were not subject to forfeitures. The investments held by the participants in the Plan were automatically rolled over to their account in the Lasership 401(k) Plan. All participant accounts were fully liquidated and transferred on September 30, 2022.

Participant Contributions – Eligible employees will enter the Plan on the first day of the Plan year quarter that coincides with or follows the date that they first satisfy the requirement. Participants may make salary deferral contributions from their compensation up to 100% each pay period up to a maximum of \$20,500 for the period January 1, 2022 through September 30, 2022. In addition, participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the calendar year are eligible to elect to make catch-up contributions up to \$6,500 for the period January 1, 2022 through September 30, 2022. Distributions from other qualified retirement plans can also be contributed to the Plan and retained as a rollover contribution.

Employer Contributions – The Company can make discretionary matching contributions and nonelective matching contributions to the Plan. For the period January 1, 2022 through September 30, 2022, the discretionary match was 25% of the first 3% of base compensation, and 10% on the next 2% of base compensation that a participant contributed. There were no nonelective matching contributions to the Plan for the period January 1, 2022 through September 30, 2022. Contributions are subject to certain IRC limitations.

Participant Accounts – Individual accounts are maintained for each participant and include participant’s salary deferral contribution, rollover contribution, and distributions, plus an allocation of the Plan Sponsor’s matching contribution, nonelective contributions, plan earnings (losses), including realized and unrealized gains and losses on investments, and Plan expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined.

Vesting – Participants are immediately vested in their salary deferral contributions and rollover contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. A participant becomes 100% vested upon death, becoming disabled, or reaching retirement age, as defined by the Plan. Plan Sponsor discretionary matching contributions and nonelective contributions vest as follows:

Note 1—Description of the Plan (continued)

Investment Options – Participants may direct Principal Trust Company (the “Custodian”) as to the investment of their account balances into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan Sponsor is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Plan Sponsor determines the appropriateness of the Plan’s investment offerings and monitors investment performance. The Plan currently offers various mutual funds as investment options for participants. Participants may change their investment directions at any time, subject to such restrictions and procedures as established by the Custodian, the Plan, and the Company.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Participants may borrow from their fund accounts up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the employee’s vested account balance. Notes must be repaid within five years unless it is for the purchase of a primary residence. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant’s account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits – Upon termination of service, a participant (or designated beneficiary) may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant’s vested interest in his or her account. The Plan allows for distributions upon termination of service, death, disability, attainment of age 59½, or in certain hardship situations while actively employed. A participant may elect to receive a lump sum payment or installment payments, roll over the value of their account into another qualified plan, or a combination. If the vested account balance payable to an individual is less than or equal to \$5,000, the Plan Sponsor may require a distribution of the entire account balance in a lump sum. Hardship withdrawals are subject to IRC restrictions and penalties.

Forfeitures – Terminating participants forfeit nonvested Plan Sponsor contributions. There were no forfeited nonvested accounts as of September 30, 2022 and December 31, 2021. Per the Plan document, these amounts may be used to pay Plan expenses or to reduce amounts otherwise required to be contributed to the Plan. During the period January 1, 2022 through September 30, 2022, approximately \$1,182 of forfeited, nonvested accounts were used to pay Plan expenses.

Below are the significant account policies in effect prior to the Plan merger.

Basis of Accounting – The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United State of America (“U.S. GAAP”).

Use of Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition – Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 5 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net depreciation includes the Plan’s gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of September 30, 2022 and December 31, 2021. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Note 2—Summary of significant accounting policies

Risks and Uncertainties – The Plan provides for various investment fund options. Investments are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risk in the near term could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Excess Contributions Payable – Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts permitted by the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") are recorded as a liability with a corresponding decrease to contributions. As of September 30, 2022 and December 31, 2021, the Company has excess contribution payables of \$-0- and \$330,244, respectively. The Plan distributed the 2021 excess contributions to the applicable participants prior to March 15 of the following year.

Payment of Benefits – Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administration – The Plan is administered by the Plan Sponsor. Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Plan Sponsor. No such officers or employees receive compensation from the Plan. Administrative expenses are paid either directly by the Plan Sponsor or the Plan.

Fair Value Measurements – U.S. GAAP provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities (Level 1 measurement) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements).

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are quoted prices available in active markets for identical investments as of the reporting date;

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are other than quoted prices in active markets, which are either directly or indirectly observable as of the reporting date, and fair value can be determined through the use of models or other valuation methodologies; and

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable inputs in situations where there is little or no market activity for the asset or liability, and the reporting entity makes estimates and assumptions related to the pricing of the asset or liability including assumptions regarding risk.

A financial instrument's level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The following is a description of the valuation methodology used for instruments measured at fair value, including the general classification of such instruments pursuant to the valuation hierarchy.

Mutual Funds – These investments are public investment vehicles valued using the net asset value ("NAV") provided by the administrator of the fund. NAV is based on the value of the underlying assets owned by the fund, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of shares outstanding. NAV is a quoted price in an active market and is classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

The method described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 3—Income tax status

The information below represents the income tax status prior to the Plan merger.

The IRS has determined the prototype Volume Submitter 401(k) plan adopted by the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC and informed the custodian of such in a letter dated August 8, 2014. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the Plan administrator believes the Plan is designed and currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, has no income subject to business income tax, and continues to be tax exempt.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate the tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. Plan management has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of September 30, 2022 and December 31, 2021, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to audit by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 4—Plan termination

As discussed in Note 1, the Plan terminated effective October 1, 2022, at which point all participants became 100% vested in their account balance.

Note 5—Fair value measurements

See fair value measurements in Note 2 above for discussions of the methodologies and assumptions used to determine the fair value of the Plan's investments.

Fees paid to the Custodian totaled \$110,973 for the period January 1, 2022 through September 30, 2022. In addition, notes receivable from participants are considered to be party-in-interest transactions because they are transacted with Plan participants.

Note 9—Prohibited transactions

During the year ended December 31, 2019, the Company inadvertently failed to segregate and remit in a timely manner certain participant loan repayments from its assets within the required time period as specified by DOL Reg. 2510.3012. Failure to segregate and remit contributions within the specified time period is a prohibited transaction according to the provisions of ERISA and the IRC. The Company made the deposit after the required timeframe and remitted lost earnings and late remittances in February 2022.

During the period from January 1, 2022 through September 30, 2022, the Company inadvertently failed to segregate and remit in a timely manner certain participant payroll deferrals and loan repayments from its assets within the required time period as specified by DOL Reg. 2510.3012. Failure to segregate and remit contributions within the specified time period is a prohibited transaction according to the provisions of ERISA and the IRC. The company made the deposit after the required timeframe and will be remitting lost earnings in 2023.

Note 10—Subsequent events

In accordance with U.S. GAAP related to subsequent events, the Plan has evaluated all events subsequent through October 13, 2023, the date these financial statements were available to be issued.
