We have performed audits of the financial statements of Roche Fruit Co., Inc. 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of May 31, 2023 and 2022, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements (the financial statements).

Notes to Financial Statements

May 31, 2023 and 2022

(1) Description of Plan

The following description of the Roche Fruit Co., Inc. 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan, covering substantially all employees of RCH Holdings, LLC; MMP Orchards, LLC; Jewel Apple, LLC; MWR Holdings, LLC; MWR Riverside Orchards, LLC; MWR Quincy, LLC; Roche Fruit, LLC; Goosehill, LLC; Skyline Orchards, LLC; and RF Administrative Services, LLC (collectively referred to as the Company or Plan Sponsor).

The Plan is administered by the Trustees who receive assistance from a retirement plan administration organization, which processes and maintains records of participant account activity.

All contributions made to the Plan are held in a trust fund. The Trustees are responsible for the safekeeping of the trust fund. The trust fund established by the Trustees is the funding medium used for the accumulation of assets from which benefits are distributed.

Eligibility

The Plan is open to all employees age eighteen or over who have met the one year of service requirement, as defined in the Plan's provisions. The Plan excludes employees covered under a collective bargaining agreement.

An employee is eligible for employer safe harbor match contributions and non-elective contributions if they are not an excluded employee, age eighteen or over, have 1,000 hours of service in a consecutive 12-month period from hire date, and are employed by the Company on the last day of the Plan year.

Contributions

The Plan provides for deferral contributions to be made by electing employees under a salary reduction agreement. Participants may contribute up to the maximum annual federal dollar limit to pre-tax salary deferrals, as provided by the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions.

The Company will provide a safe harbor match contribution of 100% of each participant's deferral contributions up to 4% of the participant's compensation. The Company contributed \$379,434 and \$384,330 in safe harbor matching contributions for the years ended May 31, 2023 and 2022, respectively. At May 31, 2023, there was approximately \$1,500 included in accounts receivable. There was also approximately \$800 in qualified nonelective contributions in receivables at May 31, 2023. The Company may also elect to make a discretionary non-elective contribution, of which there were none for the years ended May 31, 2023 and 2022.

Notes to Financial Statements

May 31, 2023 and 2022

Participant Accounts

Individual accounts are maintained for each Plan participant. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocation of the Company's contributions and Plan earnings. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined in the Plan agreement. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are 100% vested in the Company match contribution and their elective deferral contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary contribution portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon occurs at a rate of 20% annually beginning in the second year of credited service. A participant is 100% vested after six years of credited service.

Payment of Benefits

Participants are eligible to receive 100% of their vested account balance upon attaining normal retirement age of sixty-five years, death, disability, or break in service. Benefits are paid under various options, as defined in the Plan. If a participant terminates employment and the participant's account balance does not exceed \$5,000, the Plan Administrator will transfer the vested account to an IRA without the participant's consent.

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeitures, which are non-vested portions of participants' accounts at the point of termination from the Plan, will be placed in a suspense account and will be restored to the participant if rehired before five consecutive one-year breaks in vesting service have occurred. If the participant takes a distribution of their entire vested portion, the non-vested portion will be forfeited at that time. The non-vested amounts are then used to reduce administrative expenses or reduce future employer contributions. There were \$1,994 and \$9,458 of forfeitures for the years ended May 31, 2023 and 2022, respectively.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan pays a portion of the processing fees for the payment of benefits. All other administrative expenses are paid by the Company. The Plan expenses are allocated based on the participant receiving the distribution.

Investment Options

Participants direct employee and employer contributions into various mutual funds offered by the Plan.

(2) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Concentrations of Credit Risk

Financial instruments that potentially subject the Plan to concentrations of credit risk consist of mutual funds. Concentrations of credit with respect to mutual funds are limited as the Plan maintains an investment portfolio that is diversified between various publicly traded investments. However, all of the publicly traded funds are part of the American Funds family of funds.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. The fair value of the investments is based on quoted market prices, if available. Otherwise, the fair values are determined by the issuers based on other investments with similar terms.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held, during the year.

Fair Value Measurements

FASB ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides a framework for measuring fair value. The framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). Assets and liabilities are classified based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

- Level 1 Inputs based upon quoted prices in active markets for identical assets.
- Level 2 Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset, either directly or indirectly.
- Level 3 Inputs that are unobserved for the asset.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used by Plan management for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies used during 2023 and 2022.

Mutual Funds and Money Market Fund – the fair value is based on the daily closing prices reported on the exchange or listed market. The funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds and money market fund are deemed to be actively traded and are considered Level 1 investments.

The preceding method described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes the valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Payments of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid. As of May 31, 2023 and 2022, there were no distributions that had been requested but not yet paid.

(3) Investments

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's *Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure* under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the Plan Administrator instructed the Plan's auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the investments which were certified by Capital Bank and Trust Company (custodian) for the years ended May 31, 2023 and 2022, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirement of U.S. GAAP.

(4) Party-in-Interest Transactions

Capital Bank and Trust Company is the custodian of the Plan, ClearPoint Financial offers investment advisory services to the Plan, Retirement Plan Services (formally American Funds) is the record keeper, and Powers Stromberg Pension Consulting is the third-party administrator (TPA); therefore, transactions with the custodian, investment advisor, and the TPA qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of the investment, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment. These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

(5) Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts and all assets will be held, administered, and distributed pursuant to the Plan's terms and conditions.

(6) Tax Status

The Plan document is based on the adoption of a prototype plan, which the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined was designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) by a letter dated March 31, 2014. The Plan itself has not requested a determination letter. However, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

The Plan's income tax returns are subject to review and examination by federal and state authorities. The Plan is not aware of any activities that would jeopardize its tax-exempt status, nor is it aware of any activities that are subject to tax on unrelated business income or excise or other taxes.

(7) Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan allows participants to invest in investment securities that are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

(8) Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through November 21, 2023, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
