Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C)

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of IV Retirement Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). NOTE 1 – Description of Plan

The following description of IV Retirement Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General – The defined contribution plan is sponsored by Industrial Valco, Inc. (the Sponsor). The Plan covers all employees of the Sponsor with the exception of nonresident aliens and residents of Puerto Rico. Employees are eligible for participation in the Plan once they have completed 6 months of service. A participant is eligible to make elective contributions on the first day of the month once service requirements have been met and upon completion of an enrollment form. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions – Participants can elect to defer a percentage of their earnings, subject to certain limitations. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions, which are safe harbor contributions. The matching contribution is a match of the deferral made by the employee up to a percentage of eligible compensation. During the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021, the Company made discretionary matching contributions equal to 100% of the elective deferral up to 4% of compensation. A participant is also eligible for a discretionary nonelective employer contribution for a Plan year. Annual contributions are limited to a maximum permissible amount, as set forth in Internal Revenue Code (IRC) Section 415.

Investment Options – Participants direct the investment of their accounts into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers a registered investment company funds.

Participant Accounts – Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the matching contribution, and an allocation of plan earnings. Plan earnings are allocated based on a ratio of the participant's account balance to the total of the investment balance. The benefit to which participants are entitled is the vested amount in their individual account. Asset management fees are deducted directly from the various funds in each participant's account.

Vesting – Participants are immediately vested in their elective deferral contribution plus actual earnings thereon. If a participant terminates employment prior to normal retirement age (65) for reasons other than death or disability, the portion of the matching contribution and discretionary nonelective contribution is vested based on years of eligible service. After the initial 1,000-hour service year, eligible years of service are calculated by the plan year. Under this method, vesting service is measured on a plan year basis from the date of hire through the severance date expressed in years or a fraction thereof according to the following scale:

Payment of Benefits – Upon death, disability or retirement, participants elect to receive benefits as a lump-sum or in installment payments. Account balances under \$5,000 are automatically disbursed as lump-sum distributions. Upon termination of service, the participants' elective deferral contributions, plus any vested portion of the Company's contributions, are disbursed to the participants, unless they had a balance of at least \$5,000 and elect to remain in the Plan. Benefits are recorded when paid.

Hardship Withdrawals – The Plan allows for hardship withdrawals from all participant accounts. Hardship distributions must be a minimum of \$500.

Administration of Plan Assets – The Sponsor is also the Plan administrator. The administrator entered into a contract with Reliance Trust Company (Reliance). Under the terms of the contract, Reliance (the Trustee) holds the Plan's investment assets and executes investment transactions. As permitted by Department of Labor regulations, Reliance has certified certain financial information contained in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits to be complete and accurate. Automatic Data Processing, Inc. (ADP) serves as the recordkeeper for the Plan.

Forfeitures – A forfeiture is the portion of a participant's account which the participant loses upon termination of employment. It is equal to the non-vested portion of the account. Forfeitures are used to pay plan expenses or offset future employer matching contributions. During the plan year ended December 31, 2022, there were \$0 of forfeitures used to reduce employer matching contributions. As of December 31, 2022 and 2021, there were no forfeitures available to be used for employer matching contribution.

NOTE 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting – The financial statements and supplemental schedule have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Investment Valuation – Investments are stated at fair value. The Plan's Trustee, Reliance Trust Company, certifies the fair value of the investments. If available, quoted market prices are used to value investments. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net investment depreciation includes the plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability (i.e., the "exit price") in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant notes are reclassified as distributions based on the terms of the Plan document.

NOTE 2 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

Operating Expenses – Certain administrative fees are collected from participant accounts and paid to the record keeper, the Trustee and the Plan’s investment advisor. Certain administrative expenses such as audit and legal fees are paid by the Sponsor and are not included in the financial statements. Expenses related to specific participant transactions are charged to the respective participant’s accounts.

Temporary Plan Provisions – On March 27, 2020, the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (“CARES”) Act was passed by Congress. The CARES Act contains several provisions that temporarily impact retirement plans, including the waiver of required minimum distributions, a new hardship withdrawal option, increased loan limits, and a pause option for loan payments. The provisions of the CARES Act could be effective and operationalized immediately, prior to amending the plan document. As of July 1, 2022, the Plan was formally amended for these provisions.

NOTE 3 – Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

NOTE 4 – Information Certified by Trustee of the Plan

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, the Trustee has certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown on the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2022 and 2021.
- Net investment activity and interest income on notes receivable from participants as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2022.
- Investment information included in the footnotes and supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2022 and 2021.

The Plan’s independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

NOTE 5 – Fair Value Measurements

The Plan adopted the requirements of the Fair Value Measurements and Disclosure Topic of the FASB Accounting Standards Codification. This Topic defines fair value and requires enhanced disclosure about assets and liabilities carried at fair value. These additional disclosures are required only for financial assets and liabilities measured at fair value and for nonfinancial assets and liabilities measured at fair value on a recurring basis. The Defined Contribution Pension Plans Topic of the FASB Accounting Standards Codification exempts defined contribution plans from other requirements of this Topic.

This Topic requires that a fair value measurement reflect the assumptions market participants would use in pricing an asset or liability based on the best available information. These assumptions include risks inherent in a particular valuation technique (such as a pricing model) and the risks inherent in the inputs to the model. It also specifies that transaction costs should not be considered in the determination of fair value. According to this Topic, fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (exit price).

This Topic establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurement) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurement). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy defined by this Topic are as follows:

Level 1 – Quoted prices are available in active markets for identical assets or liabilities as of the reporting date. Active markets are those in which transactions for the asset or liability occur in sufficient frequency and volume to provide pricing information on an ongoing basis.

Level 2 – Pricing inputs are observable, either directly or indirectly, but are not quoted prices included within Level 1. Level 2 includes those financial instruments that are valued using external inputs with models or other valuation methodologies.

Level 3 – Pricing inputs include significant inputs that are generally less observable from objective sources. These inputs may be used with internally developed methodologies that result in management's best estimate of fair value. Level 3 instruments include those that may be more structured or otherwise tailored to customers' needs.

As required by this Topic, financial assets and liabilities are classified in their entirety based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value. The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in methodologies used at December 31, 2022 and 2021.

In general, and where applicable, the Plan uses quoted prices in active markets for identical assets to determine fair value. This pricing methodology applies to the Plan's Level 1 assets which include registered investment company accounts.

NOTE 6 – Notes Receivable from Participants

The Plan allows loans to participants based on their vested account balance. The minimum loan amount is \$500, and the maximum loan amount is limited to fifty percent of their vested account balance or \$50,000 reduced by the highest loan balance during the previous 1-year period, whichever is less. The maximum loan amount is the participant’s vested interest in the Plan. The Plan allows one outstanding loan at any time. Loans must be repaid within five years, unless the loan is for a principal residence in which it must be repaid within 30 years. Installment payments are required through payroll deductions. Interest rates on loans outstanding at December 31, 2022, ranged from 5.25% - 7.50%.

NOTE 7 – Plan Termination

On February 1, 2023, Industrial Valco, Inc. was acquired by Texas Pipe & Supply, and the IV Retirement Plan was merged with and into the Texas Pipe & Supply Company 401(k) Plan. Participants were notified in May of 2023 regarding the merger and blackout period from June 26, 2023 to July 31, 2023. The assets of the Plan in the amount of \$5,275,397, which were held by Reliance, were legally transferred as of June 30, 2023 to the Texas Pipe & Supply Company 401(k) Plan. The IV Retirement Plan ceased to exist after the merger.

NOTE 8 – Income Tax Status

The Plan had adopted a prototype standardized profit-sharing plan with CODA sponsored by ADP, Inc. In a letter dated March 31, 2008, the Internal Revenue Service notified the Trustee that the Plan is qualified, and the trust established under the Plan is tax-exempt under the appropriate sections of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code.

In accordance with the guidance on accounting for uncertainty in income taxes, the Plan administrator evaluated the Plan's tax positions and does not believe the Plan has any uncertain tax positions that require disclosure in or adjustment to the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 9 – Separated Participants with Deferred Vested Benefits

Included in net assets available for benefits are amounts due to participants who have withdrawn from the Plan but still have vested benefits in the Plan's net assets. For the Plan years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021, these benefits were \$228,132 and \$233,741, respectively.

NOTE 10 – Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain administrative fees are collected from participant accounts and paid to the record keeper, the Trustee and the Plan's investment advisor. Fees paid from the Plan were \$26,713 for the year ended December 31, 2022. Other administrative costs were paid by the Sponsor and are not reported in the financial statements.

NOTE 11 – Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

The Plan has a concentration of investments in the Vanguard Federal Money Market Fund, American Funds 2025 Target Date Retirement Fund, and American Funds 2030 Target Date Retirement Fund. A change in the value of the investments could cause the value of the Plan's net assets available for benefits to change due to this concentration. In addition, as a result of funds being selected by participants, certain other funds may individually represent a concentration greater than 10% of Plan's investment at fair value in the statement of net assets available for benefits. Although these individual funds maintain a level of diversification by investing in multiple equity, debt and other instruments, there may be a concentration risk because the funds are invested at the direction of a single fund manager. At December 31, 2022, the Vanguard Federal Money Market Fund, American Funds 2025 Target Date Retirement Fund, and American Funds 2030 Target Date Retirement Fund represented greater than 10% of the Plan's investments at fair value.

On March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization declared COVID-19 a pandemic. The COVID-19 pandemic and resulting global distributions have caused significant economic uncertainty and volatility in financial markets. As a result of COVID-19, there has been heightened market risk and volatility associated with the pandemic, and this could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts related in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits, as mentioned above. The Trustee and management monitor the performance of the Plan's investments including approving changes in investment options subsequent to year end.

NOTE 12 – Subsequent Events

The fair value of investments held by the Plan could fluctuate significantly subsequent to year end. The Trustee, advisors, and management monitor the performance of the Plan's investments including approving changes in the investment options subsequent to year end.

Effective as of February 1, 2023. The Plan included an automatic salary deferral feature. The employer will automatically withhold an amount equal to 4% compensation from each Participant's pay each payroll period and contribute that amount to the Plan as a Pre-Tax 401(k) deferral. There is no escalation of the Automatic Deferral percentage. The Automatic Deferral provisions apply to all Participants, who on the effective date of the Automatic Deferral provisions are not deferring any amount and who did not make a timely election to not contribute Elective Deferrals in connection with the implementation of the automatic deferrals provisions. No automatic deferral rate escalation was included with the amendment.

The IV Retirement Plan ceased to exist after the merger.

The Plan did not have any other subsequent events through December 6, 2023, which is the date the financial statements were issued, requiring recording or disclosure in the financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2022.
