The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of March 31, 2023 and 2022, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's ("DOL") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan ("investment information") by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA ("qualified institution").

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of March 31, 2023 and 2022, and for the years then ended, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 9 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

Basis for Opinion

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Notes to Financial Statements

1. Description of Plan:

The following description of the Lee Hy Paving Corporation 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General: The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all full-time employees (defined as employees expected to work 1,000 or more hours during the Plan year) of Lee Hy Paving Corporation (the "Company"). Employees become eligible when they have attained age 21 and have completed one year of service and become participants in the Plan on the first day of each quarter of the Plan year following completion of one year of service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

Contributions: Each year, participants may make pretax and Roth contributions from their compensation, up to the maximum allowed by the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") statutory limits. Participants who have reached the age of 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. The Company may make matching, profit sharing and/or qualified non-elective contributions equal to a discretionary percentage on a uniform basis to all participants, provided that the participant is an active employee of the Company on the last day of the Plan year. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Participant Accounts: Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and an allocation of (a) the Company's contribution, and (b) Plan earnings as a weighted average percent of total earnings and account balances. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Investment Options: Participants may direct Fidelity Management Trust Company (the "Trustee") as to the investment of their account balances in accordance with guidelines established by the Plan. Participants may change their investment elections at any time.

Vesting: Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contributions is based on years of continuous service. A participant is vested in the Company's contributions 25% after one year, 50% after two years, 75% after three years, and 100% after four years of credited service.

Notes to Financial Statements, Continued

1. Description of Plan, Continued:

Notes Receivable from Participants: Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000, up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan terms cannot exceed five years, unless the proceeds are used to acquire a principal residence. The loans are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable from participants deemed to be uncollectible by the Plan administrator are reclassified to distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Plan Administration: Overall responsibility for administering the Plan rests with the Company. Participant accounts are administered by an affiliate of the Trustee. Certain administrative functions are performed by Company employees. No such employee receives compensation from the Plan.

Excess Contribution Liability: Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions.

Payment of Benefits: Participants are entitled to payment of benefits at retirement or early retirement. In-service withdrawals of a participant's vested balance are permitted at age 59½. On termination of service before retirement age, a participant is entitled to receive 100% of their vested account balance after a twelve month break in service. Account balances less than or equal to \$5,000 will be distributed automatically. These balances over \$1,000 will be distributed to an individual retirement account.

Forfeitures: Forfeited balances of terminated participants' non-vested accounts will be used to offset future Company contributions or to pay administrative expenses. Forfeiture additions were \$2,555 for 2023 and \$5,403 for 2022. Forfeited balances available were \$7,271 at March 31, 2023, and \$4,716 at March 31, 2022. No forfeitures were used in 2023. Forfeitures used to reduce employer contributions were \$59,672 in 2022.

Basis of Accounting: The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual method of accounting.

Notes to Financial Statements, Continued

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies:

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition: The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net investment income (loss) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits: Benefits are recorded when paid or distributed.

Use of Estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with general accepted accounting principles requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Subsequent Events: Management has evaluated subsequent events through January 9, 2024, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, and other than the note below, has determined there are no subsequent events to be reported in the accompanying financial statements.

On March 31, 2023, the Company was acquired resulting in the formation of a new company, Lee Hy Construction, LLC, which became a participating employer in the Plan on that date. Subsequent to March 31, 2023, Lee Hy Construction, LLC became the Plan's plan sponsor and the Plan's name was changed to Lee Hy Construction 401(k) Plan.

3. Fair Value Measurements:

The Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") has issued guidance for measurement and disclosure of fair value and established a three-tier fair value hierarchy, which prioritizes the inputs used in measuring fair value as follows:

- Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology are quoted prices for similar instruments in active and inactive markets; and model driven valuations with significant inputs and drivers derived from observable active markets. No assets met the criteria for classification as Level 2 at March 31, 2023 and 2022.
- Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement. No assets met the criteria for classification as Level 3 at March 31, 2023 and 2022.

3. Fair Value Measurements, Continued:

Valuation techniques used should maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for investments carried or disclosed at fair value:

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (“SEC”). These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (“NAV”) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Stable value fund: A stable value fund that is composed primarily of fully benefit-responsive investment contracts that is valued at the NAV of units of a collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the funds less its liabilities. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported NAV. In accordance with Accounting Standards Update (“ASU”) 2015-07, these investments have been excluded from the categorization in the fair value hierarchy.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

4. Administrative Expenses:

Although not required by the Plan, a portion of the costs of the Plan administration is paid by the Company. Expenses related to specific participant transactions are charged directly to the participant’s account. See Note 5 regarding administrative fees paid to the trustee of the Plan.

5. **Related Party Transactions:**

Certain Plan investments consist of shares of mutual funds managed by Fidelity Investments, the record-keeper of the Plan. These are related-party transactions and are identified as parties-in-interest in the accompanying schedule of assets (held at end of year). Fidelity Investments and its affiliates provide certain administrative services to the Plan pursuant to a service agreement between the Company and Fidelity Investments. Fidelity Investments and its affiliates receive revenue from mutual fund service providers for services Fidelity Investments provides the funds. This revenue is used to offset certain amounts owed to Fidelity Investments for its administrative services to the Plan. The Plan paid administrative fees to the trustee of the Plan in the amount of \$781 for 2023 and \$888 for 2022.

6. **Plan Termination:**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their accounts.

7. **Tax Status:**

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the prototype plan sponsor, by letter dated June 30, 2020, that the adopted Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, however, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code.

Management has evaluated the effects of accounting guidance related to uncertain income tax positions and concluded that the Plan had no significant financial statement exposure to uncertain income tax provisions at March 31, 2023 and 2022. The Plan is not currently under audit by any tax jurisdiction.

8. **Risks and Uncertainties:**

The Plan provides for investments in various securities. Investments are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term would materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of the Lee Hy Paving Corporation 401(k) Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of March 31, 2023 and 2022, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's ("DOL") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan ("investment information") by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA ("qualified institution").

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of March 31, 2023 and 2022, and for the years then ended, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 9 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities section:

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.

- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule, Schedule H, Line 4i – Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of March 31, 2023, is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

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Contributions: Each year, participants may make pretax and Roth contributions from their compensation, up to the maximum allowed by the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") statutory limits. Participants who have reached the age of 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. The Company may make matching, profit sharing and/or qualified non-elective contributions equal to a discretionary percentage on a uniform basis to all participants, provided that the participant is an active employee of the Company on the last day of the Plan year. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Participant Accounts: Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and an allocation of (a) the Company's contribution, and (b) Plan earnings as a weighted average percent of total earnings and account balances. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Investment Options: Participants may direct Fidelity Management Trust Company (the "Trustee") as to the investment of their account balances in accordance with guidelines established by the Plan. Participants may change their investment elections at any time.

Vesting: Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contributions is based on years of continuous service. A participant is vested in the Company's contributions 25% after one year, 50% after two years, 75% after three years, and 100% after four years of credited service.

1. Description of Plan, Continued:

Notes Receivable from Participants: Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000, up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan terms cannot exceed five years, unless the proceeds are used to acquire a principal residence. The loans are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable from participants deemed to be uncollectible by the Plan administrator are reclassified to distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Plan Administration: Overall responsibility for administering the Plan rests with the Company. Participant accounts are administered by an affiliate of the Trustee. Certain administrative functions are performed by Company employees. No such employee receives compensation from the Plan.

Excess Contribution Liability: Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions.

Payment of Benefits: Participants are entitled to payment of benefits at retirement or early retirement. In-service withdrawals of a participant's vested balance are permitted at age 59½. On termination of service before retirement age, a participant is entitled to receive 100% of their vested account balance after a twelve month break in service. Account balances less than or equal to \$5,000 will be distributed automatically. These balances over \$1,000 will be distributed to an individual retirement account.

Forfeitures: Forfeited balances of terminated participants' non-vested accounts will be used to offset future Company contributions or to pay administrative expenses. Forfeiture additions were \$2,555 for 2023 and \$5,403 for 2022. Forfeited balances available were \$7,271 at March 31, 2023, and \$4,716 at March 31, 2022. No forfeitures were used in 2023. Forfeitures used to reduce employer contributions were \$59,672 in 2022.

Basis of Accounting: The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual method of accounting.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies:

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition: The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net investment income (loss) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits: Benefits are recorded when paid or distributed.

Use of Estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with general accepted accounting principles requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Subsequent Events: Management has evaluated subsequent events through January 9, 2024, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, and other than the note below, has determined there are no subsequent events to be reported in the accompanying financial statements.

On March 31, 2023, the Company was acquired resulting in the formation of a new company, Lee Hy Construction, LLC, which became a participating employer in the Plan on that date. Subsequent to March 31, 2023, Lee Hy Construction, LLC became the Plan's plan sponsor and the Plan's name was changed to Lee Hy Construction 401(k) Plan.

3. Fair Value Measurements:

The Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") has issued guidance for measurement and disclosure of fair value and established a three-tier fair value hierarchy, which prioritizes the inputs used in measuring fair value as follows:

- Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology are quoted prices for similar instruments in active and inactive markets; and model driven valuations with significant inputs and drivers derived from observable active markets. No assets met the criteria for classification as Level 2 at March 31, 2023 and 2022.
- Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement. No assets met the criteria for classification as Level 3 at March 31, 2023 and 2022.

3. Fair Value Measurements, Continued:

Valuation techniques used should maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for investments carried or disclosed at fair value:

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC"). These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Stable value fund: A stable value fund that is composed primarily of fully benefit-responsive investment contracts that is valued at the NAV of units of a collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the funds less its liabilities. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported NAV. In accordance with Accounting Standards Update ("ASU") 2015-07, these investments have been excluded from the categorization in the fair value hierarchy.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

4. Administrative Expenses:

Although not required by the Plan, a portion of the costs of the Plan administration is paid by the Company. Expenses related to specific participant transactions are charged directly to the participant’s account. See Note 5 regarding administrative fees paid to the trustee of the Plan.

5. **Related Party Transactions:**

Certain Plan investments consist of shares of mutual funds managed by Fidelity Investments, the record-keeper of the Plan. These are related-party transactions and are identified as parties-in-interest in the accompanying schedule of assets (held at end of year). Fidelity Investments and its affiliates provide certain administrative services to the Plan pursuant to a service agreement between the Company and Fidelity Investments. Fidelity Investments and its affiliates receive revenue from mutual fund service providers for services Fidelity Investments provides the funds. This revenue is used to offset certain amounts owed to Fidelity Investments for its administrative services to the Plan. The Plan paid administrative fees to the trustee of the Plan in the amount of \$781 for 2023 and \$888 for 2022.

6. **Plan Termination:**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their accounts.

7. **Tax Status:**

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the prototype plan sponsor, by letter dated June 30, 2020, that the adopted Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, however, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code.

Management has evaluated the effects of accounting guidance related to uncertain income tax positions and concluded that the Plan had no significant financial statement exposure to uncertain income tax provisions at March 31, 2023 and 2022. The Plan is not currently under audit by any tax jurisdiction.

8. **Risks and Uncertainties:**

The Plan provides for investments in various securities. Investments are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term would materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.
