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## INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

### Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of WAXIE Sanitary Supply 401(k) Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (an "ERISA 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2022, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of WAXIE Sanitary Supply 401(k) Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's ("DOL") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, and for the year ended December 31, 2022, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- The information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

### **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAS"). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of WAXIE Sanitary Supply 401(k) Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

### **Emphasis of Matter – Plan Merger**

As discussed in Note 1 to the financial statements, in connection with its acquisition by a third party the Plan Sponsor authorized the merger of the Plan's assets into a plan sponsored by the acquiror. On December 31, 2022, the Plan's assets were transferred to the affiliate plan, effectively terminating the Plan at that time. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

### **Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements**

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

### **Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements**

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.

- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of WAXIE Sanitary Supply 401(k) Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

**Other Matter – Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA**

The supplemental schedule (Schedule H, Part IV, Line 4(a) for the year ended December 31, 2022), is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion:

- The form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, are presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

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### NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the WAXIE Sanitary Supply 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions. The Plan is subject to the requirements of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"). The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of WAXIE's Enterprises, Inc.

In May 2020, the WAXIE's Enterprises, Inc. operations were acquired by a third party, Envoy Solutions, Inc. ("Envoy"). In connection therewith, a new entity, Waxie Enterprises, LLC was created and effectively became the new Plan Sponsor. WAXIE's Enterprises, Inc. and Waxie Enterprises, LLC are collectively referred to as the "Company." The Plan and the related Trust Agreement were updated effective June 15, 2020 for this change. On December 31, 2022, the Plan's investments were liquidated and its assets were transferred to the Envoy Solutions, Inc. 401(k) plan, which received the transfer in January 2023. This plan merger effectively terminated the Plan.

#### Eligibility

As amended effective January 1, 2022, employees who are not members of a collective bargaining unit become eligible to participate in the Plan after completing 30 days of service with monthly enrollment dates, as defined. Participants become eligible to participate in the employer contribution upon their date of hire with no service or age requirements.

#### Participant Contributions

Each payroll period participants may contribute from 1% to 100% of their eligible compensation, as defined in the Plan, subject to limitations imposed by the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). Participants who are age 50 or older are eligible to defer additional amounts (called "catch-up contributions") to the Plan up to the maximum allowed by the IRC. Participants may also contribute amounts representing rollover distributions from other qualified sources.

#### Employer Contributions

The Company may make discretionary matching contributions each pay period to active participants, as defined. For 2022, the Company authorized matching contributions of 50% of eligible participants' elective deferrals up to 6% of their eligible compensation. The Company may also make other employer discretionary contributions each Plan year. No other employer discretionary contributions were made for the 2022 Plan year.

#### Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, any Company contributions, and allocations of Plan earnings or losses, and is charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings (losses) or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

#### Investment Options

Upon enrollment in the Plan, participants direct the allocation of their accounts to any or all of the Plan's investment options. Subsequently, participants may change their allocation and transfer account balances between the investment options in accordance with the Plan. Contributions will be automatically directed to the Plan's qualified default investment alternative if no investment option has been selected. Certain fees may be charged to the Plan's investments.

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### NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (Continued)

#### Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their own contributions plus actual earnings thereon. All participants are fully vested in their employer contributions in the event of their death, total and permanent disability, or retirement. A participant who terminates employment other than due to death, total and permanent disability, or retirement vests in employer contributions as follows:

A year of credited service is defined as any Plan year in which an employee has at least 1,000 hours of service.

#### Forfeitures

Upon distribution of benefits following termination of employment, that portion of a participant's account that is not vested is forfeited. Amounts forfeited are generally used to reduce employer contributions or pay Plan expenses. During the year ended December 31, 2022, \$61,150 was added to the forfeiture account, \$58,452 was used to reduce 2022 employer matching contributions, and \$4,400 of other deductions, including transfers of \$3,383, reduced the balance. At December 31, 2021, the forfeitures balance was \$1,702.

#### Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 and up to a maximum generally equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. A maximum of two notes may be taken out in a 12-month period and only one note may be outstanding at any time. The notes receivable are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates. Principal and interest is paid directly to the account held for the participant in the Plan through payroll deductions. All notes receivable must be repaid within a 5-year period. The balance of a note receivable becomes due immediately upon separation from employment from the Company. Any unpaid balance is treated as a distribution if not fully paid by the participant by the effective date of separation.

In April 2020, the Plan operationally implemented the provisions of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (the "CARES Act") (Note 8). Participants requesting relief under the CARES Act were permitted (i) an increased loan limit to the lesser of \$100,000 or 100% of the nonforfeitable account balance (available until September 23, 2020), and (ii) a delay in loan repayments due through December 31, 2020 for up to one year.

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### NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (Continued)

#### Payment of Benefits

Upon termination, retirement, and/or attaining age 59½, participants may elect to receive a distribution of their account in a single lump-sum cash distribution, or defer the distribution if their account exceeds \$5,000. Normal retirement age is 65, but early retirement provisions apply at age 55 for active participants of 5 years of credited service, as defined. Twice a year, participants who are age 59½ or older may withdraw all or part of their vested account balance. Pursuant to the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2019 (the "SECURE" Act), which became law on December 20, 2019, participants may defer taking distributions as follows:

- If a participant reached the age of 70½ in 2019, the participant may defer receiving distributions until the later of April 1, 2020, or the April following the calendar year in which the participant retires;
- If a participant reaches the age of 70½ in 2020 or later, the participant may defer receiving distributions until the later of the April following the calendar year in which the participant reaches age 72 or retires.

Any vested benefits will be paid to a participant's beneficiary upon death of a participant. In addition, the Plan allows for hardship distributions from the participant's contribution account balance.

In February 2018, Congress passed the Bipartisan Budget Act (the "Act"). Among other things, the Act provides relief on hardship withdrawal requirements including the following: (1) a participant will not be required to obtain a plan loan before requesting a hardship withdrawal, (2) a participant's deferral contributions will not be suspended after receipt of a hardship withdrawal, and (3) earnings on elective deferral contributions in a participant's account will be eligible for hardship withdrawal purposes. Effective January 1, 2019, the Plan adopted the provisions of the Act with respect to hardship withdrawal requirements.

Upon a participant's employment termination, the Plan may roll over a participant's vested account balance greater than \$1,000 and less than \$5,000 into an individual retirement account ("IRA") managed and maintained by the trustee/custodian of the Plan, if the participant has not elected to receive a lump sum cash distribution or have the balance rolled over into an IRA of his/her choosing. Also at its discretion, the Plan may elect to distribute vested account balances of less than \$1,000.

In April 2020, the Plan implemented the following provisions for CARES Act related distributions: (i) participants may withdraw up to \$100,000 without a 10% early distribution penalty, (ii) such distributions can be repaid within three years of the date of distribution, and (iii) required minimum distributions were temporarily suspended for 2020.

### NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are presented on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

#### Estimates and Assumptions

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

#### Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are stated at fair value, except for the investment in the guaranteed investment contract, which is reported at contract value. Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

The guaranteed investment contract is a fully benefit-responsive investment contract which is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined-contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. See Note 5 for further discussion of the guaranteed investment contract.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net realized and unrealized appreciation or depreciation in investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

#### Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2021. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

#### Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Plan. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and the processing of distributions are charged directly to the account of the transacting participants and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses related to investments are included in the net realized and unrealized appreciation or depreciation in the fair value of investments and administrative expenses.

#### Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

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### NOTE 3. INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE TRUSTEE/CUSTODIAN

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements, including investments held at December 31, 2022 and 2021, and net realized and unrealized appreciation or depreciation in fair value of investments, interest from guaranteed investment contract, dividend and interest income, and other income for the year ended December 31, 2022, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Principal Trust Company, the trustee/custodian of the Plan.

### NOTE 4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Codification 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures* provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are as follows:

#### *Level 1*

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

#### *Level 2*

Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

#### *Level 3*

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement for the asset or liability at the measurement date. These inputs reflect Plan management's best estimate of what market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability at the measurement date. Consideration is given to the risk inherent in the valuation technique and in the inputs to the model.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

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### NOTE 4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (Continued)

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value at December 31, 2021:

*Registered investment companies (mutual funds):* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Collective investment trusts:* Valued at net asset value ("NAV") using the fair value of underlying funds of the respective collective investment trust ("CIT"). The fair value of funds held are used in determining the NAV of the CIT, which is not publicly quoted but is available to current investors. The NAV is the basis for current transactions and the CIT can be redeemed at NAV as of the measurement date. Therefore, it is believed that these investments have a readily determinable fair value. The NAV is calculated in a manner consistent with U.S. GAAP for investment companies. Because they are valued similarly to mutual funds, it is believed CITs should be a Level 1 asset to allow for consistent disclosure. Unfunded commitments typically are found in private equity funds and therefore are not applicable to CITs.

*Pooled separate accounts:* Valued at the NAV of the respective pooled separate accounts ("PSA"), the daily price of which is not publicly quoted but is available to current investors. The NAV is the basis for current transactions and the PSA can be redeemed at NAV as of the measurement date. Therefore, it is believed that these investments have a readily determinable fair value. The NAV is calculated in a manner consistent with U.S. GAAP for investment companies. Because they are valued similarly to mutual funds, it is believed PSAs should be a Level 1 asset to allow for consistent disclosure. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while Plan management believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

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### NOTE 5. INVESTMENT CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan invests in the Principal Fixed Income 401(a)/(k) (the "Contract"), a fully benefit-responsive group annuity investment contract issued by Principal Life Insurance Company ("PLIC"). The Contract is not a portfolio of contracts whose yields are based on changes in the fair value of underlying assets, but is rather a single group annuity contract with a fixed rate of interest. As a result, the average yield earned by the Plan is the yield earned, or the interest credited, on the group annuity contract. The average yield for the investment contract was 1.08% for the period January 1, 2022 to December 31, 2022. The underlying assets consist primarily of treasuries, commercial real estate mortgages, mortgage-backed securities, and short-term cash equivalents.

The interest crediting rate is determined on a semiannual basis and is calculated based upon many factors, including current economic and market conditions, the general interest rate environment, and purchases and redemptions by unit holders. An employer-level surrender of the Plan's interest in the Principal Fixed Income Option or employer-initiated transfer will be subject to either a 12-month irrevocable advance notice or a 5% surrender charge, whichever the Plan Sponsor chooses. Due to the liquidation of the investment contract in December 2022, the Plan incurred a surrender charge of \$572,252 which is included in administrative expenses in the accompanying financial statements.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan sponsor does not believe that any events which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable of occurring.

The contract defines the circumstances and amounts for which the contract may be terminated by the Plan. In addition, the issuer, PLIC, has the right to stop accepting deposits under certain circumstances.

### NOTE 6. PARTY-IN-INTEREST AND RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

The Company provides administrative services for the Plan at no cost to the Plan. Certain Plan operating expenses are paid by the Company. Certain investments are managed by the trustee/custodian of the Plan. These transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions.

### NOTE 7. TAX STATUS

The Company has adopted a pre-approved defined contribution plan and relies upon the opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS"), which states that, in its opinion, the pre-approved plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Code. The Company has not applied for a determination letter from the IRS specific to the Plan. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the accompanying financial statements.

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### NOTE 7. TAX STATUS (Continued)

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authorities. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2022, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2019.

### NOTE 8. CARES ACT

In response to the effects of the coronavirus on the economy, in March 2020, Congress passed the CARES Act. The CARES Act provides temporary relief for retirement plan sponsors and participants with respect to employer contributions, distributions, and participant loans. The provisions of the CARES Act may be effective prior to formally amending the Plan document. The Plan has implemented certain relief provisions included in the CARES Act as disclosed in the preceding notes to the financial statements.

### NOTE 9. OPERATIONAL FAILURES / LATE REMITTANCES

During 2022 and 2021, the Company identified operational failures relating to the improper inclusion and exclusion of certain types of Plan eligible compensation, which resulted in over contributions or missed deferral opportunities and associated matching contributions during 2022 and 2021. The amount of the operational failures have not yet been determined but are not expected to be significant. The Company and the Plan administrator are in the process of determining the participants affected and intend on taking corrective action as needed under the IRS Employee Plans Compliance Resolution System's Self-Correction Program.

Additionally, the Company identified instances in 2022 where amounts withheld from employees totaling \$715,375 were not forwarded to the custodian within the reasonableness timeframe established by the Department of Labor. The Company remitted the corresponding lost earnings in September 2022.

Based on the actions intended to be taken, Plan management and the Company believe the aforementioned operational failures will not cause the Plan to be disqualified by the IRS and that the self-corrective actions would allow the Plan to be in compliance with the Plan documents and ERISA. Accordingly, no provision for income taxes has been included in the accompanying financial statements.
