### Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Baker Roofing Company 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (“ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit”). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of June 30, 2023 (in liquidation) and December 31, 2022 (ongoing), and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period ended June 30, 2023 (in liquidation), and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Baker Roofing Company 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan’s financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (“investment information”) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (“qualified institution”).

Management has obtained certifications from qualified institutions as of June 30, 2023 and December 31, 2022, and for the period ended June 30, 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 5 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors’ Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

## **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAS"). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Baker Roofing Company 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

## **Emphasis of Matter – Basis of Accounting**

As discussed in Note 2 to the financial statements, the governing body of Baker Roofing Company 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan approved a plan of liquidation on March 17, 2023, and the Plan was fully liquidated as of June 30, 2023. As a result, the Plan has changed its basis of accounting from the going concern basis used in presenting the 2022 financial statements to the liquidation basis used in presenting the 2023 financial statements. Our opinion is not modified with respect to that matter.

## **Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements**

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

## **Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements**

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

1. Description of Plan

The following description of Baker Roofing Company 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information for the Plan sponsored by Baker Roofing Company (the "Company"). Participants in the Plan should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan became effective on October 1, 1999 as a trustee profit sharing 401(k) salary deferred thrift plan. The Plan covers all employees of the Company who have six months of service and work for the Virginia division of the Company. The plan sponsor is responsible for oversight of the Plan, determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

On March 17, 2023, the Trustees approved a plan of liquidation of the Plan and participation ceased effective June 23, 2023. The Plan merged into Baker Roofing Company 401(k) Plan, and was fully liquidated and terminated effective June 30, 2023.

Contributions

Each year participants may contribute up to the maximum amount allowed by the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") of pre-tax or after-tax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. The Plan also permits rollover contributions from other qualifying retirement plans. The Plan provides for safe harbor matching contributions whereby the Company matches 100% of a participant's elective deferrals up to 3% of the participant's compensation, plus 50% of the next 2% of the participant's elective deferrals. Additional profit sharing amounts may also be contributed at the discretion of the Company's board of directors. There were no profit sharing contributions in 2023.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and the Company's matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Company's profit sharing contribution and plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. A participant is entitled to the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their elective contributions and safe harbor matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of credited service. The discretionary contribution portion of a participant's account is 100% vested after six years of credited service.

Forfeited Accounts

At June 30, 2023, there were no forfeited accounts. Forfeited accounts may be used to pay administrative expenses or to reduce Company contributions as permitted by the Plan's provisions.

Payment of Benefits

Generally, a participant becomes eligible to receive benefits on their normal retirement age (65), death, disability, termination of employment, or reasons of proven financial hardship. The Plan also permits early retirement upon reaching age 55 and after completing at least six years of service. For retirement, death or disability, the participant may receive 100% of their account balance in a lump sum. Partial withdrawals or installments are permitted for required minimum distributions. Participants who terminate their employment will receive their vested account balance under the same option as above. If the vested balance is less than \$5,000, a lump sum distribution may be made. Participants are also eligible to take in-service withdrawals once they attain age 59 ½.

Hardship Withdrawals

Upon approval by the plan administrator, a participant may withdraw all or part of their elective contributions for immediate and severe financial need. In accordance with IRS regulations, the participant must exhaust all other assets available prior to obtaining the hardship withdrawal.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$500 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of 50% of their vested account balance less the current balance of any outstanding loans or \$50,000 less the highest outstanding loan balance in the last 12 months minus the loan balance on the date a new loan is made. The notes are secured by the balance in the participants' accounts and bear a fixed interest rate of prime plus 1% (9.25% at June 30, 2023) as of the date of the newly issued loan. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. Notes receivable from participants at June 30, 2023 and December 31, 2022 were \$0 and \$169,009, respectively.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The 2022 financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United State of America ("GAAP").

On March 17, 2023, the Trustees approved a plan of liquidation, and management determined liquidation was imminent. As a result, the Plan changed its basis of accounting from the going concern basis used in presenting the 2022 financial statements to the liquidation basis in accordance with GAAP used in presenting the 2023 financial statements.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

The Plan considers all invested cash balances to be cash equivalents.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are comprised of a fully benefit-responsive investment contract, collective investment trust funds, and mutual funds. The Plan's investments are reported at fair value except for the fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is valued at contract value (see Note 8). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 6 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Realized and unrealized appreciation and depreciation in the value of investments are allocated to the participant accounts based on participant holdings in each fund.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Plan Expenses

Certain plan expenses are paid by the plan sponsor as provided by the plan document. Expenses related to specific participant transactions (notes receivable from participants and distributions) are charged directly to the participant's account.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are recorded as a distribution based upon the terms of the plan document.

3. Federal Income Taxes

The Plan is a qualified Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan that received a determination letter from the IRS on June 30, 2020 stating that the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC") and, therefore, the related trust is exempt from taxation. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain its qualification. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter; however, the plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and operating in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

The liquidation basis of accounting (2023) and GAAP (2022) require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would be sustained upon examination by the applicable authorities. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that, as of June 30, 2023, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in process.

4. Plan Termination

In June 2023, the Plan merged with Baker Roofing Company 401(k) Plan and any remaining participant account balances were transferred to that plan. The Plan was liquidated and terminated effective June 30, 2023.

5. Investments

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. The following information included in the accompanying financial statements was obtained or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America, the custodian of the Plan, and Empower Trust Company, LLC, the trustee of the Plan, (collectively "Empower"), and was not subject to audit for the period ended June 30, 2023 and the year ended December 31, 2022:

*Collective Investment Trust Funds*

These investments are valued using the net asset value (“NAV”) of units of the collective investment trust funds. The net asset value is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported net asset value. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the collective trust funds, the issuer reserves the right to require 12-months notification in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

7. Collective Investment Trust Funds

The Plan invested in various funds within the Wilmington Trust Collective Investment Trust (the “Trust”). The Trust consisted of separate funds (“Funds”) with differing investment objectives which were available for investment by participating plans. Wilmington Trust, N.A. served as the trustee and was responsible for maintaining and administering the Trust and its various Funds.

The Funds’ units were valued daily using the NAV. NAV is calculated by dividing the total fair value of the assets in each fund less its liabilities, by the total number of units outstanding at the time of computation. Investment income earned was reinvested in each Fund and included in the determination of unit values. The Funds sold new units and repurchased outstanding units on a daily basis. The Funds required a plan sponsor to provide advance written notice of five business days for plan sponsor directed withdrawals which exceeded \$1 million or 10% of the assets invested in each Fund.

8. Investment Contract with Insurance Company

The Plan held a fully benefit-responsive investment contract (“FBRIC”) with Empower. The product sought to achieve consistent returns to support a competitive crediting rate.

The methodology for calculating the interest crediting rate was based on the earnings of the underlying assets in the entire medium-long term new portfolio compared to the minimum interest crediting rate as stated in the contract, and prevailing market conditions. Interest crediting rate was reset quarterly. Empower credited interest daily to the group contract holder on a portfolio basis. Principal and interest for participant-initiated benefit payments were fully guaranteed by the entire general account assets of Empower.

The average yield earned by the plan for the FBRIC was derived by averaging the quarterly gross interest rates for the fund over the year. The average was 2.35% and 1.93% for 2023 and 2022, respectively.

As described in Note 2, because the contract was fully benefit-responsive, it was included in the financial statements at contract value as reported to the Plan by Empower. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

Certain events that limited the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with Empower included: (a) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (b) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (c) bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (d) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The plan administrator does not believe that any events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with Plan participants are probable of occurring.

9. Party-in-Interest Transactions

Plan investments are managed by Empower, the custodian and trustee of the Plan. These transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan to the custodian trustee and other parties-in-interest for investment management and other administrative services amounted to \$35,713 for the period ended June 30, 2023. The Plan also holds notes receivable from participants. As a result, these notes receivable and all related transactions were with a party-in-interest. All of these transactions are exempt from being prohibited transactions by ERISA.

10. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities as directed by its participants. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

11. Reconciliation to Form 5500

The financial statements show the Plan's Wilmington Trust, N.A. investments as collective investment trust funds. Because Empower has not filed the Separate Accounts' assets and liabilities statement with the Department of Labor and is not acting as a Direct Filing Entity, assets are reflected according to underlying investments, mutual funds, in the Form 5500.
