### Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of The Centech Group, Inc. Retirement Savings Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of February 01, 2022 (in liquidation) and December 31, 2021 (ongoing), and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period ended February 01, 2022 (in liquidation), and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of The Centech Group, Inc. Retirement Savings Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements of information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

## **Basis for Opinion**

## **Emphasis of Matter – Plan Termination and Liquidation Basis of Accounting**

As further discussed in Note 2 to the financial statements, the management of the plan approved a plan of liquidation on February 01, 2022, and management determined liquidation is imminent. As a result, the plan has changed its basis of accounting from the going concern basis used in presenting the 2021 financial statements to the liquidation basis used in the 2022 financial statements. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

## **Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements**

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

## **Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements**

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. 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**NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

The following description of the The Centech Group, Inc. Retirement Savings Plan (Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

***General:***

The Plan is a defined contribution plan. THE CENTECH GROUP, Inc. (the Company) is the administrator and sponsor of the Plan. The Plan was established on October 1, 1990 and used John Hancock Life Insurance Company as the plan trustee (custodian). The Plan was most recently restated on October 15, 2014. The participants are responsible for the direction of their account balances into specific investment options. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

***Eligibility:***

Employees of the Company who are not covered by collective bargaining agreements under which they have specifically negotiated coverage by the Plan, who are not resident aliens, and who are not a leased employee are eligible to participate on the date of hire with the Company.

***Contributions:***

Each year, participants may contribute up to 90% of compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover). The Company will make safe harbor matching contributions, which has been set by the Plan provisions at 100% of elective deferral contributions that are not over 3% of compensation, plus 50% of elective deferral contributions which are over 3%, but are not over 5% of compensation. The Company may also make discretionary contributions. There were no discretionary contributions for the period ended February 01, 2022. Contributions are subject to certain IRS limitations.

***Participant accounts:***

Each participant's account is credited with participant deferrals, company safe harbor matching contributions, company discretionary contributions and plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. Participant accounts are valued at the end of each business day. The benefit the participant is entitled to is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

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**NOTE 1. (CONTINUED)**

***Vesting:***

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions and the company safe harbor matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon. For any discretionary company contributions and earnings thereon, participants are fully vested after three years of service.

***Notes receivable from participants:***

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of 50% of their vested account balances or \$50,000. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates ranging from 4.5% to 5.75%, which are commensurate with prevailing market rates. Rates are determined quarterly per prime rate of interest. Principal and interest are paid through bi-weekly payrolls.

***Payment of benefits:***

Distributions to terminated or retired participants are made in a single lump-sum payment to the participant (or in the case of death, the participant's beneficiary) or periodic installments over a period specified by the plan. If terminated/retired participants do not voluntarily elect to move their funds out of the plan, vested account balances between \$1,000 and \$4,999 are rolled into an IRA on the employee's behalf. If a participant terminates employment and the participant's account balance does not exceed \$1,000, the Plan administrator can authorize the benefit payment without the Participant's consent.

Active (not terminated/retired) participants experiencing financial hardship may withdraw a portion of their account balance as defined in the Plan and withdrawals are limited pursuant to the Plan's provisions.

***Forfeited accounts:***

At February 01, 2022 and December 31, 2021, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$0 and \$55,495, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions or pay plan administrative expenses. During the period ended February 01, 2022, no forfeitures were used to reduce employer contributions or pay plan expenses.

**NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

***Basis of accounting:***

The Company approved a plan of liquidation on February 01, 2022 and management deemed liquidation is imminent. Final distributions will be determined based on all participants being 100% vested, and will be made as soon as possible after the termination date. As a result, the Plan has changed its basis of accounting from the going concern used in presenting the 2021 financial statements to the liquidation basis used in presenting the 2022 financial statements.

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**NOTE 2. (CONTINUED)**

***Use of estimates:***

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

***Investment valuation and income recognition:***

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Trustees determine the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors, custodians and insurance company. See Note 4 for the discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis and dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

***Notes receivable from participants:***

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of February 01, 2022 and December 31, 2021. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded based on the terms of the Plan document.

***Payment of benefits:***

Benefits are recorded when paid.

***Expenses:***

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to administration of notes receivable from participants and distributions are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in the administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in the net appreciation of fair value of investments.

***Subsequent events:***

In preparing these financial statements, the Plan has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure through February 8, 2024, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

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**NOTE 3. CERTIFICATION OF INVESTMENT INFORMATION**

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974. John Hancock Life Insurance Company, the trustee (custodian) of the Plan, has certified as to the completeness and accuracy of all investment information reflected in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of February 01, 2022 (in liquidation) and December 31, 2021 (ongoing), the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the period ended February 01, 2022.

**NOTE 4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

**Level 1:** Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the plan has the ability to access.

**Level 2:** Inputs to the valuation methodology include

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets and liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability.
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

**Level 3:** Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

**NOTE 4. (CONTINUED)**

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at February 01, 2022 and December 31, 2021.

*Common Collective Trusts:* Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of units of a bank collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee is a readily determinable fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

*Mutual funds:* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual Funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The Mutual Funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

There were no assets held by the Plan on February 01, 2022.

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**NOTE 5. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

Certain Plan investments are managed by John Hancock Life Insurance Company. John Hancock Life Insurance Company is the trustee and record-keeper for the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party in interest transactions. All of these party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

**NOTE 6. PLAN TERMINATION**

Effective February 1, 2022, and in accordance with termination agreement, the plan has been terminated and no additional benefits were earned subsequent to the termination date and the plan administrator began the process of making distributions, in accordance with the terms of the plan. All participant funds were transferred to a new Plan.

**NOTE 7. PLAN TAX STATUS**

The Plan is placing reliance on an opinion letter dated March 31, 2014 received from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) on the Prototype Non-standardized Profit Sharing Plan with CODA indicating that the Plan is qualified under Section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and is therefore not subject to tax under the current income tax law. The prototype Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter; however, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**NOTE 8. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

**NOTE 9. NON-EXEMPT TRANSACTIONS**

During the Plan year ended December 31, 2021, the Employer failed to segregate and remit participant contributions for certain payroll periods within the timeframe prescribed by the Department of Labor. This is deemed a prohibited transaction in accordance with ERISA and the IRC.
