As a result, the Plan has changed its basis of accounting from the accrual basis used in presenting the 2021 financial statements to the liquidation basis used in presenting the 2022 financial statements. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

Note 1—Description of the Plan

The following description of the Bravo Brio Restaurants, LLC 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

Plan Description – The Plan was established July 1, 1999 by Bravo Brio Restaurant Group, Inc. (the “Company” or “Plan Sponsor”) as a defined contribution plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

Plan Termination – Effective January 1, 2023, the Plan was merged into the Earl Enterprises Retirement Savings Plan (the “Earl Plan”) and all employees of the Company were eligible to participate in the Earl Plan. As a result of the merger, the Plan transferred all assets totaling approximately \$7,499,000 to the Earl Plan on December 31, 2022, at which time the Plan was terminated. An employer receivable of approximately \$77,000 was also transferred to the Earl Plan and remitted during 2023.

Participation – The Plan covered all eligible employees of the Plan Sponsor unless the employee was a: covered employee by a collective bargaining unit; leased employee, hourly paid employee, non-resident alien of the United States, highly compensated employee, and reclassified employee, as defined by the Plan; and/or covered under any other plan to which the Company contributes. The Plan was a qualified trust under Sections 401(a) and 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”).

Eligibility – Employees were eligible to make elective deferrals after 60 days of employment coincident with or next following the date they attain age 21. Employees were eligible to begin receiving matching contributions after 60 days of employment coincident with or next following the date they attain age 21.

Contributions – Eligible employees of the Company were automatically enrolled to defer and contribute 3% to the Plan on or after the date they meet the eligibility requirements. A participating employee could elect to defer up to 100% of his or her compensation annually. However, total deferrals in any calendar year did not exceed the IRC limitations.

Participants were permitted to allocate contributions between the available investment funds. Each fund provided different investment objectives and degrees of risk. The Plan allows for discretionary matching contribution. The percentage of elective deferral contributions matched, if any, shall be a percentage as determined by the Plan. During 2022, the matching contribution was equal to 25% of the participants’ deferral not to exceed 6% of the participants’ compensation for the Plan year. Income of the funds was allocated based on participant account balances adjusted for contributions, distributions, forfeitures, and fund transfers in the current year.

Participant Accounts – Each participant’s account was credited with the participant’s contribution and allocations of (a) the Plan Sponsor’s contribution and (b) Plan earnings or losses and (c) administrative expenses. Allocations were based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant was entitled was the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Investment Options – Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant directed employee and employer contributions into various investment options. Participants could change their investment options periodically as permitted by the Plan.

Vesting – Participants were immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting of the Company's contributions and related earnings is based on years of service. Prior to the termination of the Plan on December 31, 2022, a participant was vested after six years of credited service based upon the following schedule:

Forfeited Accounts – At December 31, 2022 and 2021, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$0- and \$193,443, respectively. Per the Plan document, these amounts may be used to pay Plan expenses or to reduce Employers' contributions. For the year ended December 31, 2022, approximately \$14,000 were used to pay Plan expenses and approximately \$237,000 were distributed to the Plan Sponsor as part of the termination of the Plan.

Notes Receivable from Participants –The Plan only allowed one loan outstanding to a participant at any one time. Participants could borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum amount equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The notes receivable from participants were secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear a reasonable rate of interest determined by the Plan administrator through a review of current interest rates charged by external lenders. Principal and interest was to be paid ratably through payroll deductions. Loan terms did not exceed five years, unless the loan was used to acquire a principal residence.

Automatic Rollover Provisions – The Plan included automatic rollover provisions. These provisions provided for terminated participants with vested balances of less than \$5,000, but greater than \$1,000, to take a distribution as soon as practicable following their termination of employment. If the participant failed to take a lump-sum distribution or rollover the balance to another qualified plan, the balance of such account was rolled over into a rollover individual retirement account on behalf of the participant by the Company. If a participant's account was \$1,000 or less, the terminated participant was required to take immediate payment or rollover to another qualified plan with participant consent.

Financial Hardship Withdrawals – Financial hardship withdrawals of a participant's deferral contributions were permitted in certain circumstances of immediate and heavy financial need.

Payment of Benefits – Benefits were recorded when paid. The participant's account became payable upon termination of service due to death, disability, or normal retirement. Normal retirement age was 65. Early retirement was permitted once the participant reached age 55 and had six years of vesting service. Participants received account balances in a lump-sum payment or substantially equal annual installments over a fixed period of whole years. In-service withdrawals were permitted for participants who have reached age 59½.

Note 2—Summary of significant accounting policies

Basis of Accounting – The accompanying 2022 financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the liquidation basis of accounting and the 2021 financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting. The liquidation basis of accounting used during 2022 did not differ from the accrual basis of accounting used during 2021.

Use of Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“U.S. GAAP”) requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition – Investments in the Plan are reported at fair value, except for the fully benefit-responsive investment, which is reported at contract value. U.S. GAAP defines fair value as the exchange price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to the fully benefit-responsive investment contract because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of investment securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net depreciation includes the Plan’s gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held, during the year.

Benefits Paid to Participants – Benefits are recorded when processed and paid by the Plan.

Administrative Expenses – Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Company and are therefore excluded from these financial statements. Investment-related expenses are included in the depreciation in fair value of investments. Fees for the administration of notes receivable from participants are included in administrative expenses and charged directly to the participant’s account.

Risks and Uncertainties – The Plan provides for various investment options. The underlying investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and participants’ individual account balances.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant’s account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. As of December 31, 2022 and 2021, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded. If a participant does not make loan repayments and the Plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document.

Fair Value Measurements – U.S. GAAP defines fair value as the exchange price that would be received for an asset or paid to transfer a liability (an exit price) in the principal or most advantageous market for the asset or liability in an orderly transaction value hierarchy which requires an entity to maximize the use of observable inputs when measuring fair value. U.S. GAAP describes three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are quoted prices available in active markets for identical investments as of the reporting date;

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are other than quoted prices in active markets, which are either directly or indirectly observable as of the reporting date, and fair value can be determined through the use of models or other valuation methodologies; and

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable inputs in situations where there is little or no market activity for the asset or liability and the reporting entity makes estimates and assumptions related to the pricing of the asset or liability including assumptions regarding risk.

A financial instrument's level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The following is a description of the valuation methodology used for instruments measured at fair value, including the general classification of such instruments pursuant to the valuation hierarchy. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2022 and 2021.

Mutual Funds – These investments are public investment vehicles valued using the net asset value (“NAV”) provided by the administrator of the funds. NAV is based on the value of the underlying assets owned by the fund, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of shares outstanding. NAV is a quoted price in an active market and classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

The Plan believes its valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants; however, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 3—Information certified by the Plan's Qualified Institutions (unaudited)

The Plan Sponsor has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Empower Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC, the “Qualified Institutions” of the Plan, have certified to the completeness and accuracy of the following data included in the accompanying financial statements:

- Investments, at fair value, investments, at contract value, and notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2022 and 2021.
- Net depreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2022.

The Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements.

Note 5—Investment in fully benefit-responsive contract

The Plan held a fully benefit-responsive investment contract with Great-West Life & Annuity Insurance Company ("Great-West") totaling \$398,000 for 2021. The investment contract was transferred to Successor Plan by December 31, 2022. Great-West maintained the contributions in a general account. The methodology for calculating the interest crediting rate was based on the earnings of the underlying assets in the entire portfolio compared to the minimum interest crediting rate, as stated in the contract, and prevailing market conditions. The interest crediting rate was reset quarterly. The contract was included in the financial statements at contract value, as reported to the Plan by Great-West.

Because the group annuity contract was fully benefit-responsive, contract value was the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the group annuity contract. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Great-West, represented contributions made under the contracts, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. The average interest earned by the Plan was 1.85% and 0.52% for the years ended December 31, 2022 and 2021, respectively.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan document (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan administrator believes that any events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable of not occurring.

Great-West or the Plan Sponsor may terminate the contract with at least 60 days of advance written notice to the other party. If the contract was terminated prior to Great-West's recovery of any and all start-up costs incurred by Great-West, such amounts, as well as any and all other outstanding charges and fees, would be recouped as a contract termination charge.

Note 6—Income tax status

The Company adopted a prototype non-standardized profit-sharing plan with a cash or deferral arrangement. The prototype plan received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service on June 30, 2020, which stated that the prototype plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements. The Plan has not been in compliance with all the applicable requirements of the IRC. However, management has corrected these matters to ensure compliance with the applicable sections of the IRC and to retain its tax-qualified status. The Plan also has no income subject to unrelated business income tax and therefore continues to be tax exempt.

As required by U.S. GAAP, Plan management evaluates tax positions taken by the Plan and would recognize a tax liability for any tax position taken that is beneficial to the Plan, including any related interest and penalties, when it is more likely than not that the position taken by the Plan would be overturned by a taxing authority upon examination. Plan management believes there are no such positions as of December 31, 2022 and 2021 that would require recognition of a liability or asset or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to audit by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 7—Parties-in-interest transactions

Certain Plan investments were mutual funds managed by the Qualified Institutions; therefore, these transactions qualified as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid for services rendered by parties-in-interest totaled approximately \$69,000. While these transactions qualified as party-in-interest activity, they were expressly exempted from the prohibited transaction rules ERISA, Title I, Section 408(b).

Note 8—Delinquent participant contributions

During the years ended December 31, 2022, 2021 and 2020, the Company's failure to remit certain employee contributions to the Plan in a timely manner constituted a lending of such monies to the Company. As such, these transactions represented nonexempt transactions between the Company and the Plan as identified in the Schedule of Delinquent Participant Contributions – Form 5500, Schedule H, Part IV, Line 4a. At December 31, 2022, the Company remitted the associated lost earnings for the 2020 and 2021 participant contributions. In addition, the Company remitted the 2022 participant contributions and remitted the associated lost earnings on these participant contributions subsequent to year-end. Those associated lost earnings were remitted to the Earl Plan.

Note 9—Subsequent events

The Plan has evaluated all events through February 15, 2024, in connection with the preparation of the financial statements, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued. No other matters were noted.
