Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

I was engaged to audit of the accompanying financial statements of EVERIZ 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2022, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of EVERIZ 401(k) Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), my audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2022, and for the year then ended, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Disclaimer of Opinion on the 2022 Financial Statements

I do not express an opinion on the financial statements of EVERIZ 401(k) Plan referred to above. Because of the significance of the matter described in the Basis for Disclaimer of Opinion section of my report, I have not been able to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence to provide a basis for an audit opinion on the financial statements.

Basis for Disclaimer of Opinion on the 2022 Financial Statements

The Plan Sponsor utilizes third-party to perform procedures to capture payroll related data, calculate payroll related calculations, remit payments and maintain historical records. During 2022 providers of these services changed and historical data prior to transition was not retained. Participant and employer contributions during the year ended December 31, 2022, totaled \$583,227 and \$345,937, respectively. I was unable to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence to ensure that contributions received by the Plan from participants and the employer were complete and accurate during the year ended December 31, 2022.

The Plan Sponsor maintains all personnel records pertaining to participant's age and start of employment. The Plan requires that participants be of certain age and complete a minimum service period prior to enrolment. Participant and employer contributions during the year ended December 31, 2022, totaled \$583,227 and \$345,937, respectively. I was unable to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence to ensure that minimum eligibility requirements were met by the participants to contribute to the Plan, nor to receive contributions from the employer during the year ended December 31, 2022.

I conducted my audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. My responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of my report. I am required to be independent of EVERIZ 401(k) Plan and to meet my other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to my audit. I was unable to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence about completeness, accuracy of the contributions and eligibility of participants by other auditing procedures.

Management's Responsibility for the 2022 Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about EVERIZ 401(k) Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of my report, my objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes my opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, I:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of EVERIZ 401(k) Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in my judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about EVERIZ 401(k) Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

My audit did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

I am required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that I identified during the audit.

Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental Schedule of Assets Held at the Year Ended December 31, 2022, Schedule H, Part IV, line 4i is presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, I compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming my opinion on the supplemental schedules, I evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In my opinion—

- the form and content of the supplemental schedules, other than the information in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, are presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- the information in the supplemental schedules related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

I was engaged to audit the statement of net assets available for benefits of the Plan as of December 31, 2021. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), my audit needed not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution). Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2021 and for the year then ended, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

My audit report dated May 26, 2023, indicated that because of the significance of the information that I did not audit, I was not able to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence to ensure that minimum eligibility requirements were met by the participants to contribute to the Plan, nor to receive contributions from the employer during the year ended December 31, 2021. However, I was able to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence about the completeness of participant and employer contributions received by the Plan during 2021 by other auditing procedures. Accordingly, I expressed an opinion, that except for the possible effects of the matter described above, based on my audit and on the procedures performed as described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements as of December 31, 2021, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America,
- the information in the financial statements as of December 31, 2021, related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the EVERIZ 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan Sponsor is EVERIZ Management, LLC and other adopting employers are Spring Gastroenterology, Preferred Emergency Room LP, Preferred MSO LLC, Oaks Urgent Care Clinic PLLC, Rayford Equipment Leasing LLC, and North Houston Family Medicine PLLC, all of which are collectively hereafter referred to as the “Company” or “Employer.”

The Plan was established on January 1, 2012 and is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of the Company. The purpose of the Plan is to provide employees with retirement benefits. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

Eligibility

As defined in the Plan Document, employees who are eighteen (18) years old or older and have completed six (6) months of service are eligible to participate in the Plan. Once an employee becomes eligible to participate in the Plan, the employee is automatically enrolled into the Plan effective on the first day of the month following completion of eligibility requirements unless the Company is notified otherwise by the employee.

Contributions

Each year, participants may elect to defer 1% to 90% of their pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan, through salary deductions; however, annual contributions may not exceed the maximum allowed under the Internal Revenue Code. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans (“rollover”). The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled Participants have their deferral rate set at 3% of eligible compensation and their contribution is invested in a designated fund until changed by the Participant.

The Plan includes a Roth 401(k) feature which allows Participants to contribute funds on a post-tax elective deferral basis, in addition to, or instead of pre-tax elective deferrals. The Roth 401(k) feature allows for tax-free growth and distributions provided that the post-tax contributions have been vested for at least five years and the Participant has reached the age of 59 ½.

The Plan’s safe harbor matching contributions are equal to 100% of the Participants’ salary deferrals up to 3% of their eligible compensation plus 50% of their salary deferrals between 3% and 5% of their eligible compensation. For the year ended, December 31, 2022, the Company made safe harbor contributions of \$345,937.

Additionally, the Company may make discretionary profit-sharing contributions which are allocated to participants based on the relative compensation of all participants eligible to receive a discretionary profit-sharing contribution. For the year ended December 31, 2022, no discretionary profit-sharing contributions were made.

Participant Accounts

Individual accounts are maintained for each participant. Participant accounts are credited with the participant contributions, rollover contributions, and allocations of Company contributions and investment earnings and losses and charged with withdrawals and administrative fees. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Upon enrollment in the Plan, participants may direct the investment of their individual accounts among alternative investment funds provided under the Plan. Participants may change their investment elections at any time, as well as transfer existing balances between investment funds.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions, rollover contributions, safe harbor matching contributions, and actual earnings or losses thereon. Vesting in the Company's discretionary profit-sharing contributions and actual earnings or losses thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 20% vested after two years of credited service, increasing 20% each year thereafter until becoming fully vested after the sixth year of credited service as defined in the Plan Document. However, if a participant dies, or becomes disabled prior to attaining the normal retirement age, or attains early or normal retirement age as defined by the Plan, the participant's account becomes 100% vested if still employed by the Company as of such date.

Notes Receivable – Participant Loans

The Plan provides that participants can borrow funds of at least \$500 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of 50 percent of their vested account balance or \$50,000. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The interest rate for a loan will be the rate in effect in the month your loan is effective. The interest rate is the prime rate as published in The Wall Street Journal on the 14th of each month, plus 2%. Repayment of loans shall not exceed five years except for loans used to acquire the participant's principal residence, in which case the loan term may not exceed thirty years. Principal and interest are paid through payroll deduction or checks. Only one outstanding loan per participant is permitted at any time. Loans in default ("deemed" loans) are distributed to participant and classified as income for federal income tax purposes. Loan repayments are made by check or payroll deduction.

Benefit Payments

Upon termination of service due to death, disability or normal retirement, a participant or their beneficiary may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's full account balance, regardless of years of credited service. For termination due to other reason, participants may receive the sum of their contributions and any earnings thereon, plus the vested portion of Company contributions. Payments of benefits are made, at the election of the participant, in the form of an annuity, a lump sum distribution, or installment payments.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2022 and 2021

A hardship withdrawal, if approved can be made on employee deferral contributions to satisfy certain immediate and heavy financial needs, as defined, up to the amount of the participant's vested balance, in which case, the participants' contributions to the Plan must be suspended for six months after receipt of the hardship withdrawal. An unrestricted withdrawal can be made at the age of 59 ½ or upon normal retirement age of 65 on all or a portion of the participants' vested account.

Forfeited Accounts

Non-vested portions of participant accounts, if any, are forfeited upon termination of employment. Forfeited accounts may be used to pay expenses under the Plan, or to reduce employer contributions at the discretion of the Company. Unapplied forfeitures at December 31, 2022 and 2021 were \$1,008 and \$914, respectively.

Reclassifications

Certain 2021 amounts have been reclassified to conform with the current year presentation. These reclassifications had no effect on changes in net assets available for benefits or the net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The Plan's financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles in the United States requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investments

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfers a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The net change in fair value of investments is reported in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits in the period of the change.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Expenses related to the purchase or sale of investments are added to cost or deducted from proceeds. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

See Note 3 for a discussion of fair value measurements of investments.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded. An allowance for uncollectible notes from participants of \$44,085 and \$35,038 has been recorded as of December 31, 2022 and 2021, respectively.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

Operating Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in the net appreciation of the fair value of investments.

NOTE 3 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

FASB ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include (1) quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; (2) quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; (3) inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and (4) inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. There are no plan assets requiring the use of Level 2 or 3 inputs for the periods presented.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2022 and 2021

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used by the Plan for investment assets measured at fair value on a recurring basis. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2022 and 2021.

Mutual Fund: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. The funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common Collective Trust Funds: Investments in common collective trust funds are represented by a “unit of account” and per unit values whose value is the result of the accumulated values of the underlying investments. These underlying investments are public investment vehicles valued using the NAV provided by the administrator of the mutual fund investments. The NAV is based on the value of the underlying assets owned by the fund, minus its liabilities, and then divided by the number of shares outstanding. As the common collective trust funds are valued using NAV as a practical expedient, disclosure of fair value level is not required.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan’s management believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 5 – INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan is a Prototype Plan sponsored by ADP. The Internal Revenue Services (“IRS”) has determined and informed ADP by a letter dated July 8, 2014, which states that the prototype document satisfies the applicable provision of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan’s management and tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and operated in complete compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan’s financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“U.S. GAAP”) requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability or asset if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 6 – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become fully vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE 7 – ADMINISTRATION OF PLAN ASSETS

The Plan’s assets are held by the Trustee. Administrative functions for the plan year ended December 31, 2022 were performed by ADP, LLC (“ADP”). Certain administrative expenses, including loan administration fees, are paid by the participants. Other administrative expenses, such as accounting and legal fees, are paid by the Company.

NOTE 8– PARTIES-IN-INTEREST

The Plan has notes receivable from participants at December 31, 2022 and 2021. As a result, these notes and all transactions related to these notes qualify as parties-in-interest transactions. These transactions are exempt from being prohibited transactions by ERISA.

The Plan’s investments are managed by the Trustee, as approved by the Plan. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions and are exempt from being prohibited transactions by ERISA.

Certain costs of administering the Plan are paid by the Plan Sponsor and are therefore not reflected in the Plan’s financial statements. Other costs such as loan fees paid by participants and recordkeeping fees are paid with Plan assets and are reflected in the financial statements.

NOTE 9 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in a variety of investment funds. Investments in general are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall volatility risk. As part of the Plan’s investment strategy, the trustees perform periodic evaluations of the relative credit standing and investment performance of financial institutions.

Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

The Form 5500 Series is part of ERISA reporting and disclosure framework intended to ensure that employee benefits plans are operated and managed in accordance with prescribed standards. In addition, it ensures that participants and beneficiaries, as well as regulators, are provided or have access to sufficient information to protect the rights and benefits of participants and beneficiaries under the covered employee benefits plans. Schedule H (Financial Information) – is required for the plans filing as “large plans”. Employee benefit plans filing the Schedule H are generally required to engage an independent qualified public accountant (IQPA) and attach a report of the IQPA pursuant to ERISA section 103(a)(3)(A). Excluding IQPA’s report from filing constitutes as an incomplete filing and may be subject to fees and penalties, for which estimate cannot be made. Management will seek waiver of all possible penalties under the Delinquent Filer Voluntary Compliance Program (DFVCP) program.

NOTE 10 – DATE OF MANAGEMENT’S REVIEW

Plan management reviewed and evaluated subsequent events through January 3, 2024, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, and no events have occurred subsequent to the statement of net assets available for benefits dated December 31, 2022, that would require adjustments to, or disclosure in, the financial statements.
