Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter

Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedules of assets (held at end of year) as of June 30, 2023, and delinquent participant contributions for the year then ended (referred to as the “supplemental schedules”) are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

June 30, 2023

1. Description of Plan

The following description of Air Energy Group LLC 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan that covers employees from participating employers of Air Energy Group LLC (the Company) who are age 18 or older, except leased employees, collective bargaining employees, non-resident aliens, and residents of Puerto Rico. Effective August 30, 2022, part time, temporary, and seasonal employees were also excluded from eligibility to participate in the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. The plan administrator is responsible for the oversight of the Plan, determining the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitoring investment performance.

Contributions

Participants may elect to make pretax and/or Roth deferral contributions, as defined in the plan document. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make additional catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans (rollover). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Eligible employees hired on or after February 1, 2021, will be automatically enrolled into the Plan with a default pretax contribution of 3% of their compensation, as defined in the Plan document.

Participants may elect to defer up to 100% of compensation, effective August 30, 2022 (60% of compensation prior to August 30, 2022). Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations.

The Company contributes a discretionary matching contribution to the Plan of 100% of the first 3% of base compensation and 50% of the next 2% of base compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan.

Notes to Financial Statements (continued)

1. Description of Plan (continued)

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and the Company's discretionary matching contributions. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of investment expenses and plan earnings or losses. Allocations are based on participant earnings and losses, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined in the Plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and rollovers from qualified plans, plus actual earnings thereon.

The Plan was amended such that matching contributions, effective May 3, 2021, are either immediately vested or on a six-year graded vesting schedule. For all matching contributions made to the Plan prior to May 3, 2021, vesting is on a six-year graded vesting schedule.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, or termination from employment, participants may be paid the vested interest in their account in the form of a lump sum. In-service withdrawals are also permitted when a participant attains age 59½. Participants who are required to receive minimum distributions may receive installments equal to or exceeding the annual required minimum distribution amount.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. The Company also provides certain accounting and administrative services to the Plan for which no fees are charged. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and benefit payments are charged directly to the participant's account. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

1. Description of Plan (continued)

Investment Options

Participants, upon enrollment in the Plan, may direct their contributions into various investment options. Such investment allocations may be changed at any time by the participant. All plan investments are participant directed. Participants should refer to a prospectus for a description of investment risk associated with each investment option.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP).

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes and supplemental schedules. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments held by the Plan, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for further discussion and disclosures related to fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held, during the year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

Subsequent Events

Management has evaluated subsequent events through April 12, 2024, the date these financial statements were available to be issued.

Effective July 1, 2023, the Plan was merged into the Fluid Flow Products Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (Plan Merger). As a result of this merger, net assets in the amount of approximately \$55.5 million were transferred to the Fluid Flow Products Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan.

3. Fair Value Measurements

Fair value as defined under GAAP is an exit price, representing the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

GAAP establishes a three-tier fair value hierarchy, which prioritizes the inputs used in measuring fair value. These tiers include:

- Level 1 – Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets that are accessible to the reporting entity at the measurement date for identical assets and liabilities.
- Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and liabilities that are observable, either directly or indirectly, for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- Level 3 – Significant unobservable inputs for the asset or liability (i.e., supported by little or no market activity).

Assets and liabilities are classified in their entirety based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The Plan's assessment of the significance of a particular input to the fair value measurement requires judgment and may affect the valuation of fair value assets and liabilities and their placement within the fair value hierarchy levels.

Following is a description of the valuation techniques and inputs used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at June 30, 2023 or 2022.

3. Fair Value Measurements (continued)

Mutual Funds

Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

4. Investments

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedules, including investments held and notes receivable from participants at June 30, 2023 and 2022, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividend income, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended June 30, 2023, was obtained or derived from information provided to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC, the trustees of the Plan.

Notes to Financial Statements (continued)

5. Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contracts

The Plan holds a traditional investment contract. This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and, therefore, is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses.

The traditional investment contract held by the Plan is a guaranteed investment contract. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer, but may not be less than 0%. The crediting rate is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuers' ability to meet their financial obligations. The issuers' ability to meet their contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer, including the following:

- Premature termination of the contracts
- Plan termination or merger
- Changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options

No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

5. Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contracts (continued)

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value, including the following:

- A breach of material obligation under the contract
- A material misrepresentation
- A material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer

6. Related-Party Transactions and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC, the trustees of the Plan. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions; however, they are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules under ERISA.

7. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

8. Tax Status

The underlying preapproved plan has received an opinion letter from the IRS, dated June 30, 2020, stating that the written form of the underlying preapproved document is qualified under Section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code). Any employer adopting this form of the plan will be considered to have a plan qualified under Section 401 of the Code and, therefore, the related trust is tax exempt. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the Code to maintain its qualified status. The plan administrator believes the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code and, therefore, believes the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax exempt.

Notes to Financial Statements (continued)

8. Tax Status (continued)

GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. Plan management has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

9. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market volatility, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported on the statements of net assets available for benefits.
